Dr. Edmunds told 300 Chamber of Commerce members that "education is everybody's business" and said the public should follow the activities of the mathematics teacher just

ahould follow the activities of the mathematics teacher just as it does those of the athletic coach.

Dr. Edmunds plugged for increased public support of independently endowed colleges and said he favors a bill in the Congress to allow tax deduction to persons, businesses or organizations who make such contributions.

He also said it's time we stopped concentrating on building new buildings and get to work building up faculties.

Dr. Edmunds said that Americans have allowed the teaching profession "to lose the respect it deserves" and he urged that citizens take a closer look at how our educational programs are going and to take part in doing something about them.
