

### Prospective College Students Are Advised On What Clothes To Wear

### 7,000,000 Tons Of Shipping Are Sunk

NEW YORK, Sept. 3.—(AP)—The world's greatest shipping lanes today enter their third year as routes of death and destruction that have involved 29 nations and sent more than 7,000,000 tons of merchant and naval vessels to the bottom with a large toll of human life.

Censorship, claims and counterclaims preclude any exact summing up of the huge price exacted by sea warfare, but records compiled by the Associated Press reveal that 1880 ships aggregating 7,041,898 gross tons, have been sunk, while 15,838 persons have lost their lives and 9253 are missing.

Prime Ministers Of Britain And Canada Call Strongly For Backing In Fight

Russian Losses Said To Exceed German In Bloody Battles

LONDON, Sept. 4.—(AP)—Prime Minister Winston Churchill of Britain and W. L. MacKenzie King of Canada both called today in diplomatic but strong terms for full United States backing in the struggle against Nazi Germany.

Churchill declared the only way to defeat Germany was through full co-operation of all nations which "as yet lie outside the range of the conqueror's power."

Meanwhile, authoritative British sources said German losses in the war with Russia thus far are believed to total about 1,750,000 and that Russian losses have been "from 2,000,000 to 3,000,000 in the bloodiest fighting in history."

Lend-Lease Fund Will Go To Aid Of Polish Army

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4.—(AP)—President Roosevelt today authorized the first lend-lease aid to the exiled government of Poland in London, permitting military equipment to go to Polish troops training in Canada.

As the debate started, Chairman George (D., Ga.) of the Finance Committee, told his colleagues that all groups would have to practice "high patriotism" in bearing a heavier tax load.

Plans For Swimming Pool Recreation Building Presented

Edward Higgins, secretary of the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce, at a conference with officials of the United States Commerce Office in Jacksonville yesterday, was told that the report on the St. Johns-Indian River Canal had been sent to the division office at Richmond, Va.

A public hearing concerning the project which would open up a 15-mile inland waterway from Jacksonville to the Indian River on the East Coast will probably be held after the Board of Army Engineers in Washington, Mr. Higgins said.

While in Jacksonville Mr. Higgins presented the city's project for a swimming pool and recreation building and a parking lot in Fort Mallon Park. The FWA is being asked to contribute 10 percent of the cost of the project.

His election to the legislature was his first appearance in politics. He served the highest number of years in the Duval County office in the 1940 primary. Bennett worked his way through the legislature in 1938, 1940 and 1941. He was president of the Jacksonville bar in 1938. He graduated from the law school in 1934. He has been active in church and civic affairs in Jacksonville since 1928. He has been a member of the Jacksonville Junior Chamber of Commerce and of the Twelve-Fifteen Club. He has been a member of the executive board of the Chamber of Commerce, and the Junior Chamber of Commerce and is now a member of the executive board of the Boy's Club Association, the Tuberculosis Association, the Jacksonville Social Society, the Jacksonville Community Club, the Council of Social Agencies, and is a member of the state-wide public health committee.

Bennett said, "In announcing my candidacy for the House of Representatives, I do so with full consciousness of the great responsibility now facing our Congress. ### Boards Will Aid Soldiers To Get Their Jobs Back

The employ of a private employer, each employer shall restore such person to such position or to a position of like seniority status, and pay unless the employer's circumstances have so changed as to make it impossible or unreasonable to do so.

The act also provides that persons restored to their jobs shall not lose seniority and shall be considered as having been on leave or furlough. It further stipulates that "persons so restored shall not be discharged from such positions without cause within one year after such restoration."

To make use of the facilities being provided to aid in his re-employment, the soldier has only to fill out the information requested on forms being distributed by the Army, and to get in touch with the re-employment officer attached to his local board if he is a registrant, or the local board nearest his home if he is not, as soon as he returns.

Precautions Will Save Celery Growers Worry Later, Experts Say
