WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.-The development of railroad facilities. which has not kept pace with general transportation, must be the next rtep in solving the problem of marketing the country's farm products Secretary Hoover declares. Fruit distributars he said, estimated that they could have handled 20,000 more carloads of California and Florida fruit last year had the terminal facilities been available.

Declaring an estimate of dollars lost through inadequate facilities, he declared that the lost was great and that inadequacy caused further damage because the necessity of reassigning commodities due to inability to handle them at original points for their destination.






