> Dr. Garay said this was the second time this has appened since he has been working at the hospital. I think it is necessary to take some measure in order avoid future repetition of this improper and unpleasant situation," the letter stated.

Treated fairly most landowners will meet the responsible hunter halfway: mistreat them and their property and they will retreat behind "No Trespassing" signs,

(1) Always ask permission to hunt on private property. Not only is it the law, but it is also good common sense. (2) Hunt only in areas which the landowner designates. Never go into areas he asks you to avoid. Stay away from live-(3) Respect his fences. If necessary to climb them, climb

over by a post. Use gates when possible and be sure to close the gate behind you. (4) Never shoot near houses, barns, or other buildings,

(5) Avoid fields where people are working, or pastures where livestock is grazing. (6) Share your game with him.

(7) Take your litter home with you.

By following these guidelines any hunter can unlock the door to the landowner's hospitality.
