By GEORGE ESPER Associated Press Writer SAIGON (AP) - The U.S. Commund announced today it is running several days ahead of President Nixon's timetable for reduction

A spokesman said American military strength in the country has dropped below the 184,000 man ceiling that Nixon ordered reached Thursday. He said precise figures were not

Since Nixon announced the first American troop withdrawals from Vietnam in June 1969, U.S. strength has been reduced about 160,000 men from a peak of \$43,400 in April 1939. The President has announced that total American troops will be reduced another 100,000 during the next six months, trimming U.S. strength to less than 284,000 by next May 1.



By the time this comment is being read there

will be even more crystallization of reactions both at home and abroad. Yet here are some indications which are surfacing within 48 hours of the address. One is that the immediate refusal of Hanoi to give the kind of thoughtful attention the plan merits has placed the mus of continuing bloodshed on their

Another is that public sentiment in the United States has come together in support of the planimmediate cease-fire, broadening peace talks to include Laos and Cambodia, complete withdrawal of all United States forces on an announced time-table, nolitical settlement that meets the aspirations of all prisoners of war held by both sides.

Even a casual reading of these points shows the very difficult, the very complex, the very controversial, the very questionable situations that adop-

Act is Amended Sanford City Commission, faced with last night amended the recently passed city ordinance on garbage pickups to allow back-

yard refuse collection for those residents willing to pay an extra 50 cents a month. By a three-two vote, the commission mended its ordinance, which had been scheduled for a second reading, and voted to allow those persons opposing the change to curb pickups to retain the backyard collection provided they come to the city hall and sign a request for the service and agree to pay a \$2.50 monthly refuse bill, instead of the \$2 a month bill to be paid by those persons who continue to carry the refuse to the street.

Tie-Breaking Vote

On a motion by Commissioner Thomas Mc Donald, seconded by Commissioner J. A Crapps and with Mayor Lee P. Moore casting the tie-breaking vote, the commission approved the change, which will now require that a new city ordinance be drawn exempting those residents paying the extra fee from hav ing to "tote" their refuse cans to the curb.
