

# China To Taiwan: Let's Be Friends; Taiwan: 'Never!'

flatly rejected Peking's latest overture to reunite the island with China under the mainland's Communist regime.

"Under no circumstances we will enter into any kind of talks with the Chinese Communists," A government spokesman said. "Our past experiences have taught us enough

not to trust the Communists in any way." The spokesman was commenting on a New Year's day message by China's standing committee of the National People's Congress in which Peking expressed its desire to reconcile with Taiwan through peace talks. The United States form

Peking and severed its diplomatic ties with Taipei today. China's new offer said Peking will "respect the status quo on Taiwan" and "not cause the

people of Taiwan any losses." The Peking regime has often invited Taiwan to negotiate and has been refused each time by the Taiwan government in

"The only time we will sit down to talks with anybody is when the people on the China mainland are free from communism," the spokesman said.

Most of the 17 million Nationalist Chinese marked the U.S. rupture of ties and establishment of relations with China with a new mood of indifference and patriotic fervor. And a few barbs.

In a message Sunday to Premier Hua Kuofeng. Carter welcomed today's establishment of full diplomatic relations between the two countries and said "the cause of world peace will be served by this historic act of reconciliation."

The American leader told Hua "the estrangement of our peoples has sometimes produced misunderstanding, confrontation

and enmity. That era is behind us." Carter, who was spending the New Year's weekend at Camp David, predicted "through common effort, we can deepen these new ties of friendship."

Iran: New Regime Formed,

#### Shah Wants A Vacation

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — Premier-designate Shahpour Bakhtiar today announced the formation of a new government and the shah, emerging from his isolation for the first time in weeks, personally confirmed that he wants to take a vacation.

Bakhtiar, the opposition politician appointed by the shah to head a new civilian government, announced that he had com-

Looking fit and relaxed despite the campaign to topple him from his Peacock throne. the shah told reporters as he posed for a picture-taking session that he would like to take a rest. But he did not say where.

"I would very much like to take a vacation if the situation permits." the shah said in response to a question.

The exodus of foreigners from Iran was disrupted by a brief wildcat strike by air controllers at Tehran Airport today. But the strike fizzled out hours after it began and passengers queued up for flights out of the strife-torn country.

### The New Year And The Mideast

As the New Year begins a lot of people around the world, and not least of all in the Middle East, are confused and disappointed that the peace agreement between Egypt and Israel, which seemed at hand after the Camp David

breakthrough in September, has gone awry.

The Dec. 17 deadline for the signing of an Egyptian-Israeli peace treaty set in September by President Carter passed quietly, almost unnoticed in the furor over OPEC oil-price hikes and the big J. S.-China news.

Two days earlier, Israel rejected final treaty proposals advanced by Egypt and the United States. Secretary of State Cyrus Vance ended his futile shuttle diplomacy between Cairo and Jerusalem and returned to Washington empty-

And Egypt and Israel recalled their peace lelegations from the United States. Meanwhile, the camaraderie of Camp David has degenerated into acrimonious accusations and

mutual blaming. The real pity is that, after agreeing on most substantive issues such as territorial boundaries. troop withdrawal schedules, and even the treaty text itself, Egypt and Israel were prevented by political considerations from making minor concessions, largely symbolic, required for a full

The linkage between an Egyptian-Israeli settlement and autonomy for Palestinians in the West Bank and Gaza Strip, a roadblock which the Camp David accords deftly sidestepped with purposefully ambiguous language, became an inpenetrable barricade as the result of external Arab pressures on President Sadat and internal partisan pressures on Prime Minister Begin.

Until November, the treaty-drafting process moved relatively well and on schedule; the Israeli parliament and cabinet overwhelmingly confirmed the Camp David understandings, including complete evacuation of the Sinai Peninsula, and President Sadat announced plans for a treaty signing on Mount Sinai. The real trouble began with an Arab summit meeting in Baghdad, Iraq, on Nov. 2, which was made particularly significant by the unexpected attendance of Saudi Arabia, the chief financial supporter of Egypt.

Besides voting an \$11 billion war chest aimed at Israel, the Arab conference mounted a blistering attack on Egypt's separate peace with Israel and threatened to expand the long existent economic boycott against Israel to include Egypt as well.

After this. President Sadat began to up the peace-treaty ante, insisting on specific linkage with the West Bank and making an exchange of ambassadors contingent upon a timetable of Israeli compliance; Mr. Sadat also proposed that Egypt's military commitments to its Arab allies take precedence over its treaty with Israel. Faced with a razor-thin parliamentary majority and rising criticism about further concessions, the Begin government flatly rejected these changes, despite maladroit pressure by the Carter administration. - Nevertheless, the stalled, deadlocked

### The GOP Lacks Impact

The administration's recent request for legislation restricting police access to press materials may well be the beginning of a long needed clarification of both the protections enjoyed by and the responsibilities incumbent upon the press in our democratic society of laws.
