But the surplus is jet only two thirds as large as President Truman predicts it will be when this fiscal year ends June 30. Chief reason for the big surplus is the record flow of tax collections.

These reach a climax at midnight tonight, the deadline for 55,-000,000 taxpayers to file final 1947 tax returns. It also is the deadline for several million of these taxparers to pay the first installment on 1948 income tax.

Also responsible for the heavy surplus is a decrease in govern-ment spending from last fiscal year, which ended with an excess of \$754,000,000.

The record surplus figure for a full fiscal year is about \$1,155,000,-000. It was set 21 years ago in the Coolidge administration. For the current fiscal year,

budget receipts were \$29,235,000,-000, compared with \$28,000,000,000 at this point in the last fiscal

Spending no far this fiscal year tops \$24,158,500,000 against \$27,-030,000,000 last fiscal year. The over-\$5,000,000,000 budget surplus at this time is almost four times as great as the \$1,307,-

430,888 which prevailed at this point last fiscal year. The govern-nient overspent its income in the closing months last fiscal year, but is expected to reverse that course

this year. Surplus funds are being applied to debt reduction as they accumulate. The debt now stands at \$254,003,227,493 compared with \$260,763,556,718 a year ago.
