The commissioners of Osceola county formerly paid for several thousand copies of the county papers and sent them to people in the north, and the remarkable growth of the county was directly due this system of advertising Recently the board became poeved at the newspapers' attitude on the good roads question and discontinued the subscriptions. tomorrow. It doesn't teach him to settle down or settle up. It just teaches him to move, to be a rolling stone.

So there are the children to be considered as well as the dollars. Children look up to a father who doesn't have to look up to a landlord. And, having known the delights of a home, a real home, when they grow up they want homes of their dwn. Your daughter will be more likely to marry a man who is likely to provide it; and, if she marries that kind of a man, she will be more likely to be happy. Your son will be more likely to marry the kind of a woman who wants a home and a chance to make a home and a husband happy. And that means that his chances for happiness are increased.

So, in building a home, you not only make yourself happier, but you do something to assure, or at least to make likely the happiness of your children. And when you stop to think of it, making your children happy is the greatest happiness in the world.

"Yesterday," said the doctor. "I read a dispatch from New York city to the eet that a certain Mrs. L. and a certain Mrs. G., who are promintent in social life and in church life in that city, had sent messages to their friends by telephone inviting them to arrange informal social gatherings in order to break the monotony of the solemn period of sack cloth, in other words, Lent. People who are so given to the service of their social relations that they have to break over the rules of their own sect in order to be able to stand it for six weeks make their religious observance rediculous. That Lent can accomplish anything for such a person is ludicrous. '

The doctor explained that he believed the proper observance of Lent, the introduction of a period of real sacrifice DR. HOWARD H. CUSTIS and introspection by God-fearing men and women can do much good. "There are thousands of observers of Lent as good as I am," he said, "and I am not here to say but that it is a good thing to try to be better men and women for six weeks. It certainly is better than not trying to be good at all. I never have much to say about the practices of sister churches. I find something better to do than criticise other good Christians, but I wish to speak of certain follies that the Lenten season leads us into "







# MAY RETURN TO MEXICO

Former President in Exile to Claim His Own

RUMORS OF RETURN OF DIAZ

Other Notes From the World Large by Telegraph

Porfirilo Dias, who long ruled over Mexico with an iron hand, only to be deposed by the late Francisco Madero, who succeeded him and met a much more terrible fate. The venerable Porfirlo Dlaz has passed his exile in Paris, but, elated at the success of his nephew, Gen. Felix Diza, in overthrowing the Madero regime, he is planning to return to Mexico some time in Abril. Just how the ex-dictator will be received by his former subjects is a problem on which the whole world is de-

The departure from Mexico of Emesto Madero, former minister of finance was followed immediately, by a hurried counting of the cash in the government treasury. The result showed a balance of \$92,000. This amount, however, does not represent all immediate available resources of the new administration, as there are various deposite in both local and foreign banks which can be drawn on by the government. 00000

President Taft today sent to congress his much discussed "budget" message. He recommended the adoption of a hudget system of relating proposed expenditures to expected revenues and declared that congress would be greatly imnefited by having before it nuch a statement before it began the annual grind upon appropriation bills. The United States, the president wrote, was the only great nation in the world which did not use the budget system and in consequence it "may be said to be without plan or program." He indicated that owing to the late date at which he was able to transmit his message he expected little legislation on the topic from the present congress 00000

Secretary Stimson today assured Senators Culberson and Sheppard that every pessible precaution would be taken to protect the Texas border against raids by rebels from Mexico. He informed Mr. Culberson that one regiment of infantry and a battery had been removed from El Paso to join the second division at Galveston so as to be at the closest possible point to Vera rus, but assured him that the troops would be replaced at El Paso and that a sufficient force would be kept there to protect the frontier in that immediate vicinity. He promised an additional troop of cavalry.
