Strum Appointment Considered "Slap"

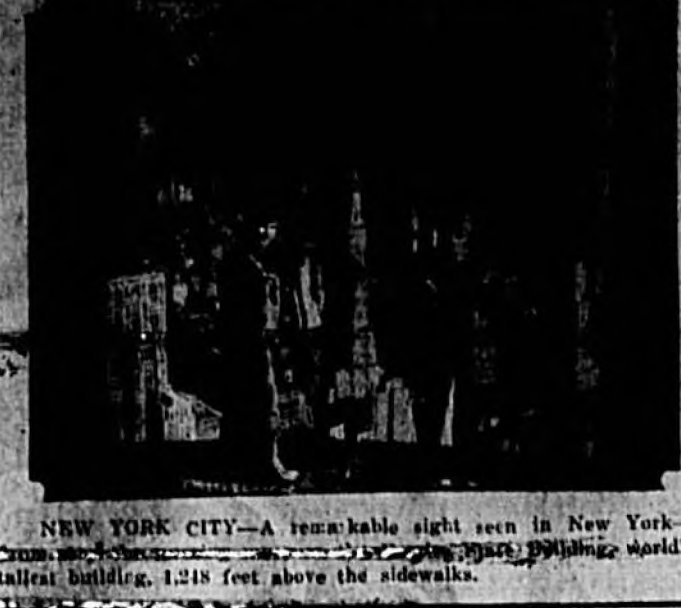

FARRELL OBTAINS PRIZE MONEY IN PENSACOLA MEET

St. Augustine Professional Winner For 2nd Straight Year

PENSACOLA, Feb. 23—(AP)—For the second successive year, Johnny Farrell, slight St. Augustine professional, came from behind here Sunday afternoon to post a 72 hole score of 286 and win first money in the \$3000 Pensacola open golf tournament.

Three strokes behind the leaders at the half way mark, and a single stroke in the lead at the end of 54 holes, Farrell unleashed his best round of the tournament, a sparkling 70, one under par, as his closing bid, as the pace setters of the three-quarter mark, Willie MacFarlane and Denny Shute slumped back to 74's and finished in a tie for second place with 289's.

Farrell opened his tournament charge with a 73 Saturday morning and every succeeding round found him shaving a stroke off his previous score. His four round total showed 18 hole scores of 73-72-71-70.

The victory brought Farrell the \$3000 victor's share of the money spoils. Shute, who led at the end of 36 holes with 142, needed 73 for his morning round allowing MacFarlane, the former open champion from Tuckahoe, N. Y., to catch him with a snappy 70. In the afternoon both slumped back to 74's (including in a headlock as Farrell shot past with his sub par round).

After a poor start with rounds of 73 and 75, Lee Waldron, wealthy Chicago veteran, put together two good rounds of 71 and 70 Sunday to force into fourth place with 290.

Except for a poor last round, Johnny Golden might have won pocket money. Golden, the big money winner of the year as a result of his victory in the rich Agua Caliente event last month, needed 77 strokes over the fairways and greens. Johnny had started with a high 80, and then recovered to shoot in a fine round of 72 and 73.

Frank Wada, of Chicago, was another who was not last round. Wada shot 80 after three previous rounds of 80-78-73.

NATION STOPS TO HONOR MEMORY OF WASHINGTON

President Leads U. S. In Celebrating Anniversary Of Patriot

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23—(AP)—President Hoover led the Nation yesterday in celebrating the 176th anniversary of George Washington's birthday by attending divine services in the church where the first president worshipped.

Accompanied by Mrs. Hoover and their granddaughter, Peggy Ann, the President journeyed to Alexandria, Va., across the Potomac River from Washington, and sat in the pew in Christ's Church, once occupied by George Washington.

In going to Alexandria, Washington's home town, the chief executive's car from his automobile a far-flung landscape being changed rapidly to do honor to the first president.

Drives changing the ranks and channels of the beautiful Potomac, steam-shovel cutting away bridges, and jacks raising the bridges across the river, were seen in every hard preparing the "Washington country" for the nation's celebration next year of his 200th birthday.

The actual governmental observance of the 176th anniversary will begin next today when all departments except Congress and the White House executive offices, will be closed.

All along the Potomac from Wakefield, where Washington was born, to the capital, the city he planned, the beautification and restoration program is in progress.

The federal government in a dozen different departments, the national Mason's lodge, many friends and neighbors of the Washington family as interested individuals are among the builders.

Among the events planned for next year by the George Washington Bicentennial Commission is the signing of "America's" by the nation's people.

The commission believes the nation should have a great day of celebration next year, and that the day should be a day of national unity and pride.

An act of Congress has been passed to designate the day of Washington's birth as a national holiday.

Mrs. W. E. Russell, the woman who discovered the remains of the first president, is expected to be in Washington to discuss the day with the president.

He and Mr. Rosetter pooled their interests and purchased a small tract of land near what is now Corey Avenue, and began a farming partnership which lasted until about 1910 before the World War. Since that time Mr. Hawkins has enjoyed continued success on his more than 50 acre farm which has often been pointed out as one of the best models in the community.

While he maintained practically all of his interests here, Mr. Hawkins was also the owner of nearly 200 acres of property in Georgia in the heart of the peach-growing belt. He was the owner of a 50-acre peach orchard which was the title of "The only one hundred per cent peach orchard in the United States in point of productivity, cultivation, value, species, and continued extra fancy crop harvest." Government agents were invited in praise of Mr. Hawkins' orchard and its development.

Mr. Hawkins had few outside interests, and other than enjoying a short hunting trip a few times each year, he confined most of his activities to his farms. He is survived by his sister, Miss Annie Hawkins, who has resided with him for many years, and who accompanied his body to Commerce.

ruption the viable supply of wheat in this country has been greater than it was in the same month of the preceding year. In July 1925 the surplus was around 100 million bushels. That was too much. But since then it has grown steadily until in July 1930 it was 274 million bushels.

"The world market for American wheat is pretty hopeless. American farmers, to sell their wheat abroad now, would have to accept 20 cents less than they are getting at home. The only thing that is keeping foreign wheat from coming in is the country now is our tariff of 42 cents.

"Our farmers must lower their costs of production on wheat and corn like the men with the steel factories and the automobile factories. But they must also adjust their production to the potential demand. The farmer has never done that.

"Look at the potato crop. The market can normally consume 400,000,000 bushels. If the farmers raise 10 per cent less than that, they get a high price and make more. If they raise 10 per cent more they have to accept a ruinous price.

"Right now we have an illustration of the livestock. Hog production in recent years has been pretty well balanced with demand, and prices have remained the same. There has been overproduction of sheep and of lambs, and prices have collapsed.

"The '36 '37 crop of wheat is expected to be 1,000,000,000 bushels. That is a record. The market can only handle 400,000,000 bushels. The rest will be sold at a ruinous price.

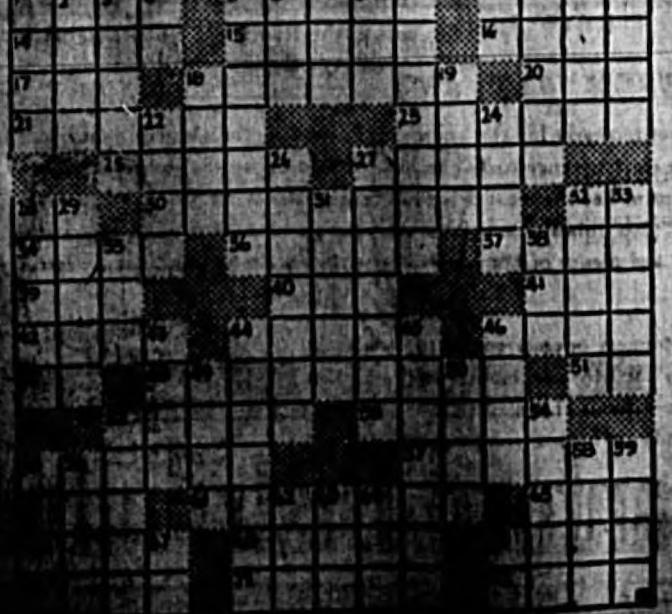
