for food exists in every area of the country - urban and rural. North and South, East and West." He said the goal of his department is "to complete the task of reaching every person with a full and nutritious diet." Freeman said the department's food programs reach about 5 million persons in more than 2,200 of the more than 2,000 counties in the country.

The secretary made no estimate of the possible additional costs of the contemplated expansion of these programs.

The department operates two types of food aid programs. One

types of food aid programs. One is a stamp plan under which the food buying power of the eligible needy is increased through the issuance to them of government stamps usable for food purchases at retail stores.

The other is a direct distribution program under which government food surpluses are donated to the needy through local welfare setups.

The changes which Freeman sold are being made in the program include reducing the purchase price for food stamps in the lowest-income category for \$2 per person per month to 50 cents.

This means a family of six or more that had paid \$12 a month for \$72 or more worth of food stamps now will pay \$5 and receive the same amount of stamps.

Where families cannot even pay this amount the local counties will be expected to provide the payment from local sources. The food stamp law prohibits the department giving the stamps free. is a stamp plan under which the



Red Cross News

By REIDA McCALL With Christmas still months away, chapters across the country have begun making and filling gift bags for Red Cross Shop Early-Vietnam 1967. The project is designed to put an ARC gift in the hands of every US serviceman and woman in South Vietnam during the holiday season. The hundreds of letters from men of every military rank in South Vietnam who received the gifts last Christmas testified to the poularity of the program. The plan calls for the production of 525,-000 of the gift bags with the juota of the local chapter being 1,000. They will be filled with personal and useful items and shipped to the field directors between early September and October 15th. The bags, red or

color, will be made of denim or cotton material, sturdy enough to withstand the tropical heat of Vietnam and remain serviceable for their owners' personal effects after the original contents are used. ARC headquarters has suggested that a holiday greeting card, identifying the Red Cross Chapter and co-operation agencies providing the gifts, be placed in each bag. The following items are suggested as suitable fillers. A selection of about six to ten small items with some variety would be possible within these guidelines. Paper books, terry washcloth (other than white or light color), small packages writing paper with self-seal envelopes, pocket games (small enough to put in pocket-such games as can be placed in plastic bags or containers are especially welcome, i. e., small decks of playing cards, chess, checkers, (pinochle is very popular), small tins of nuts or candies- (vacuum packaged), windproof type cigarette lighters, plastic cigarette case, wipe & shine packet shoe polish, ballpoint pens, plastic soap case, small address book, nail clipper. comb, plastic toothbrush holder. No liquids, glass containers, combustibles, food or any item that would melt or deterioate in heat should be included. No medications of any kind are appropriate for inclusion. Any family, individual or group interested in helping with this project should contact the local office at 322-4125. Let's all get together and make this
