**Wolfinger: Criminals can't return**

**New program bars drug and vice offenders from a 30-by-13 block area in Sanford**

SANFORD — The three keys to real estate have always been location, location, location. The same keys hold true for a new law enforcement initiative designed to cut repeated criminal activity. Eighteenth Judicial Circuit State Attorney Norm Wolfinger, with help from the sheriff and local police chiefs, has begun a crime prevention program that prohibits offenders from re-entering the areas they were arrested in. The program began in January at East

Altamonte Springs and it is expanding into Sanford and Fern Park. The program designates an "exclusionary zone" that judges can use during a pre-trial release hearing or probation sentencing to prohibit offenders of prostitution or narcotics from re-entering their arrest location. "It's very unusual that a state attorney would be involved in crime prevention,"

said assistant state attorney Beth Rutberg. "It helps us tackle crime from a non-traditional approach. Chief Brian Tooley is very involved with it, as well as Sheriff Don Eslinger." For Sanford police the exclusionary zone will assist in its routine narcotics and prostitution stings. The zone in Sanford extends north and south from 1st Street to

13th Street and east to west from Mellonville Avenue to Persimmon Avenue.

"If we get rid of the customers, the business will move — its a simple as that," said Sanford Lt. David DeRosso about the repeat offenders in the city's prostitution and narcotics stings.

The idea of an exclusionary zone is nothing new according to Tooley. Large cities such as Baltimore, San Diego and Indianapolis utilize the idea to cut down on repeat offenders. Other Florida cities

**'They reduce speed limits for a reason'**

SANFORD — A DeBary man died Thursday after he lost control of his car and crashed into a semi truck on U.S. 17/92. Police say speed was a factor.

Timothy John Manmiller, 37, was traveling southbound on 17/92 near the intersection of Seminole Boulevard. Police and witnesses say as Manmiller tried to navigate the curve, he crossed the median and hit a semi traveling northbound. The truck is owned by the Truck Drivers Institute.

"As I started to get near the curve, I saw him coming across the median," said Owen Johnson, who was driving the truck. "I said, 'Hey man watch out.' There was nothing I could do."

Johnson, 53, of St. Augustine said after the crash, the car caught fire. He jumped out of the truck and put the fire out with the truck's fire extinguisher.

"There just wasn't time to get out of the way," Johnson said. "He must have been going 60 or 70 miles per hour."

Cleo Cohen, spokesman for the Sanford Police Department, said traffic homicide investigators are still gathering information about the crash, and she could not state precisely how fast Manmiller was going.

"It looks like he was going pretty fast," Cohen said, adding that over the years police have seen a number of accidents at the intersection.

"Generally, it's a speed issue," Cohen said. "We've had them cross the median, as well

as driving into the lake. There's just too much speed for the design of the road."

Cohen said the problem lies not with the road design but with drivers who don't slow down.

"The basic tip we would give is just to obey the posted speed limits," she said. "They reduce speed limits for a reason."

Johnson and his passengers, training instructor Tom Proels and driver Litho Solomon, were not injured in the accident.

Johnson is a nine-year veteran driver and was taking a refresher course at TDI.

"I've never had an accident," Johnson said. "After this, I don't know if I want to drive anymore."

"He was going so fast,"

**County nixes large comp plan change**

**Celery Avenue land remains zoned suburban estates**

SANFORD — A large scale comprehensive plan amendment along Celery Avenue failed to pass county commission as dozens of residents fervently fought the plan.

Former Sanford attorney Ken McIntosh spoke on behalf of more than 60 property owners and helped persuade county commissioners unanimously vote against the amendment. Commissioner Daryl McLain did not participate in the vote as he owns property on Celery Avenue.

"The future for this area is now," said Matt West of the county planning and development department. "The infrastructure in this area will be available to developers."

The idea to change the land surrounding Celery Avenue from suburban estates to low density residential began in 1991 when the city of Sanford and the county entered an agreement. As part of the agreement, Sanford agreed to lower the density of housing from six homes to an acre to the county's low density rating of four homes to one acre before the land was annexed.

Celery Avenue already has water and reclaimed water and, according to Jay Marder of the city of Sanford, a planned sewer plant will provide the area with sewer lines. If the one cent sales tax passes Tuesday, Sanford will use a portion of its funds to improve the road as well.

However, McIntosh argued the city did not provide the area with

## Our View

### Vote 'Yes' to extend 1-cent sales tax

Seminole County residents want to continue having some of the best roads and schools in the state. The penny tax is the way to do it.

Are Seminole County voters willing to continue the county's one cent sales tax and take approximately \$534 million out of tourists and their own pockets over the next 10 years?

We'll find out Tuesday as thousands of voters are expected to bombard the 133 county voting precincts Tuesday and ultimately decide the fate of the tax.

Supporters point out that the penny sales tax is not an increase, but rather an extension of a tax voters approved in 1990. They also say that the penny tax is needed to fund specific road and school improvements.

On the other side of the coin is the Stop the PEST (Penny Extra Sales Tax) crowd. They contend smart consumer will routinely shop in nearby counties to avoid the extra penny sales tax ultimately costing Seminole County businesses thousands of dollars in lost revenues.

For all their passion, the PEST folks are being penny-wise and pound foolish. A sales tax generates revenue not only from county residents, but from the thousands of visitors who pass through Seminole County each year. What better way to improve schools and roads than to have outsiders shoulder part of the tax burden.

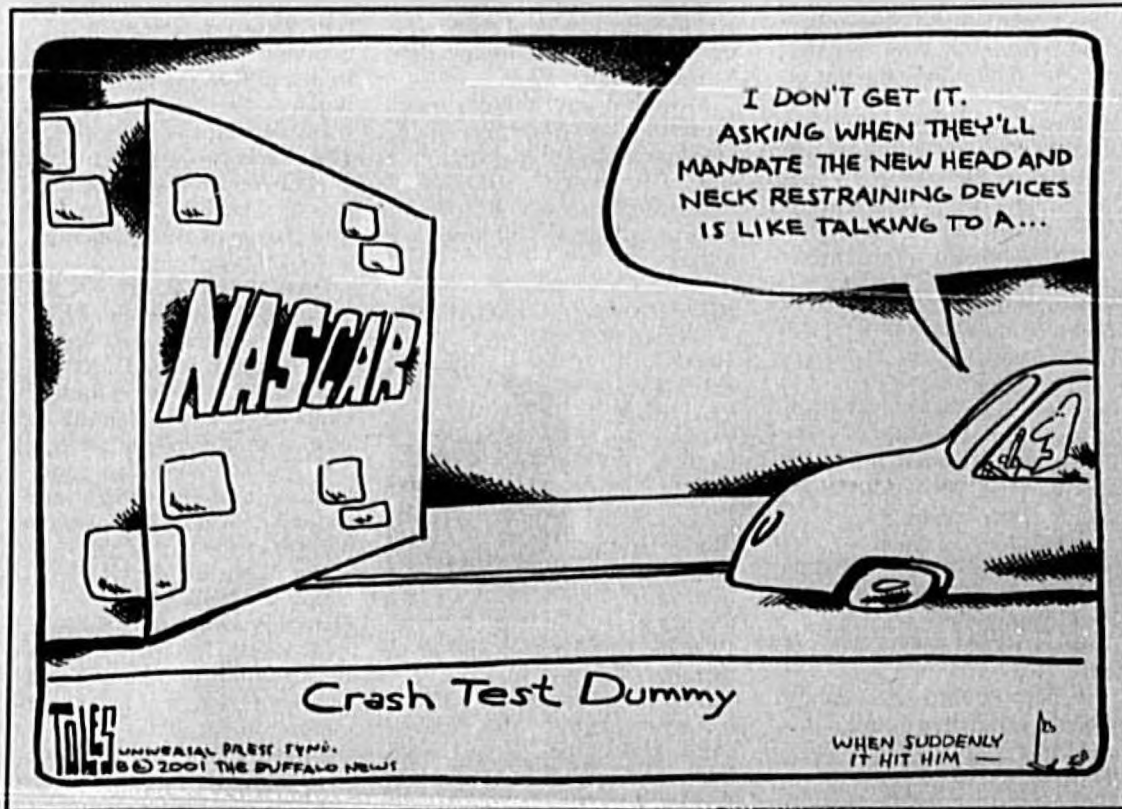
Furthermore, PEST's claims that Seminole County is losing millions of dollars in revenue because surrounding counties have a lower sales tax is just plain wrong. They like to cite that Orange County businesses sell more office supplies than Seminole County businesses as proof our residents are shopping in Orlando. There are three big problems with PEST's claims: Disney, Universal, and Lockheed Martin. Those three businesses buy quite a few paper clips every year. In addition, PEST seems to forget that Orange County has twice the population as Seminole County.

We understand PEST's concern about additional taxes; but a vote in favor of extending the penny sales tax is not a blank check for the Seminole County Commission. State law requires commissioners spend the tax revenue only on those projects they have specifically listed. Commissioners have laid out specific projects that will be funded by the tax revenue, and state law requires it be spent.

How will it be spent? Upgrading the roads we travel on and the schools we send our kids to. Some of the most notable local road improvements include US Highway 17-92 along Lake Monroe, State Road 415 between Celery Avenue and State Road 46 and US Highway 17-92 between Lake Mary Boulevard and State Road 436.

In addition to the upgrade of 30 key county roadways and 37 transportation projects within the county's seven cities, the tax will also fund the construction of more than 340 miles of sidewalks focused on areas closest to schools.

Our neighbors to the south in Orange County may pay a lower sales tax, but they are also facing a bigger budget crunch to fund road and school improvements. That's a pretty convincing reason to support the penny sales tax extension. Vote 'Yes' on Tuesday.

## The Way We Were: J. Dan Wright's career

While sorting through some papers recently, I found some unused items that have been given me in the past and also some notes I've taken that haven't made it into print. I'll remedy some of this today with information from two articles that were sent to me separately.

### J. Dan Wright is new Burns appointee

This article appeared in the Jan. 28, 1965, issue of the Miami Herald under the heading "The Men Around Burns." It was explained that this was one of several articles on the men Gov. Hayden Burns had chosen to carry out his policies.

Sanford resident J. Dan Wright had been appointed chairman of the Florida Industrial Commission, a state agency that employed 1,600 and handled spending of some \$200 million every two years.

The commission chairman's salary was \$15,000 a year. There were two other commissioners appointed to represent labor and business. Their salary was \$3,600.

The duties of the commission included handling unemployment compensation payments, running 37 employment agency offices, and administering workman's compensation.

Although Wright, age 48, had been in the citrus business most of his life, he got into it almost by accident. He came to Sanford during the 1930s to open a store for Firestone and one of its dealers, Warren A. Patrick.

Instead of moving on after the store was open, he decided to stay and go into the citrus business with Patrick.

By 1957, Wright had worked his way high up in the citrus industry. He was partner and manager of Patrick Fruit Company, which before that year's big freeze was the state's 10th largest fresh orange shipper. Wright was president of

Florida Orange Marketers, a super cooperative formed to supply oranges for the Minute Maid Corp. He was also a member of the Florida Citrus Commission by virtue of his campaign work for LeRoy Collins.

The freeze struck in December 1957 and tripled the value of frozen concentrate in the warehouses at Minute Maid, whose stock skyrocketed. Wright and others who owned stock made money from this.

The 1962 freeze increased the value of Wright's minority interest in Patrick Fruit's 1,000 acres of citrus, but the company closed its packing houses.

This left Wright with little to do, so he waged a successful campaign for the Seminole County School Board. He became its chairman in 1963.

Itching for more political activity, he looked over the field of prospective govern-

ors and picked Burns to support. Burns made Wright his Central Florida coordinator, which oversaw campaign activities in eight counties. Wright devoted almost full time to the campaign from August 1963 to November 1964.

Burns rewarded Wright by making him a part of his administration. The Miami Herald article noted that several businessmen were happy that Wright was a hard-nosed businessman instead of an attorney.

### SHS Band to present Spring Concert

This article appeared in the Sanford Herald in May 1965 and is accompanied by a picture of the seven band members who were to direct the band that evening at the Spring Concert in the Civic Center.

Preceding the concert, there was an awards banquet in the Civic Center for band members and their guests. A special honoree was Mrs. H.L. Johnson, a

Seminole County school bus driver, who was retiring that year. Johnson had driven the band on many of its trips for several years.

In addition to honors for Johnson, trophies were awarded for the best musician and best twirler, most improved musician and most improved twirler. Outstanding senior bandmen received gold keys, and the new staff of officers were revealed.

Joel Fehd, who had received superior ratings at the district and state contests, was featured in a flute solo "Concertino," by Chaminade. Charles Stein, who received an excellent rating as a student conductor in the district contest, directed "Tocata for Band," by Erickson.

Other officers and the marches they conducted were: Captain "Topper Avenel," "The Purple Pageant"; Lt. Peggy Bower, "El Capitan"; Lt. Joel Fehd, "Liberty Bell"; Lt. Eddie Hubbard (drum major), "El Calafilero"; Lt. Marcia Lippincott, "King Cotton"; and Lt. Terry Rabun, "Stars and Stripes Forever."

Peter Buker, director of the Sanford Junior High Band and associate director of the SHS Band directed several numbers. As of 1965, Ernest Cowley had been the SHS Band director for 14 years.

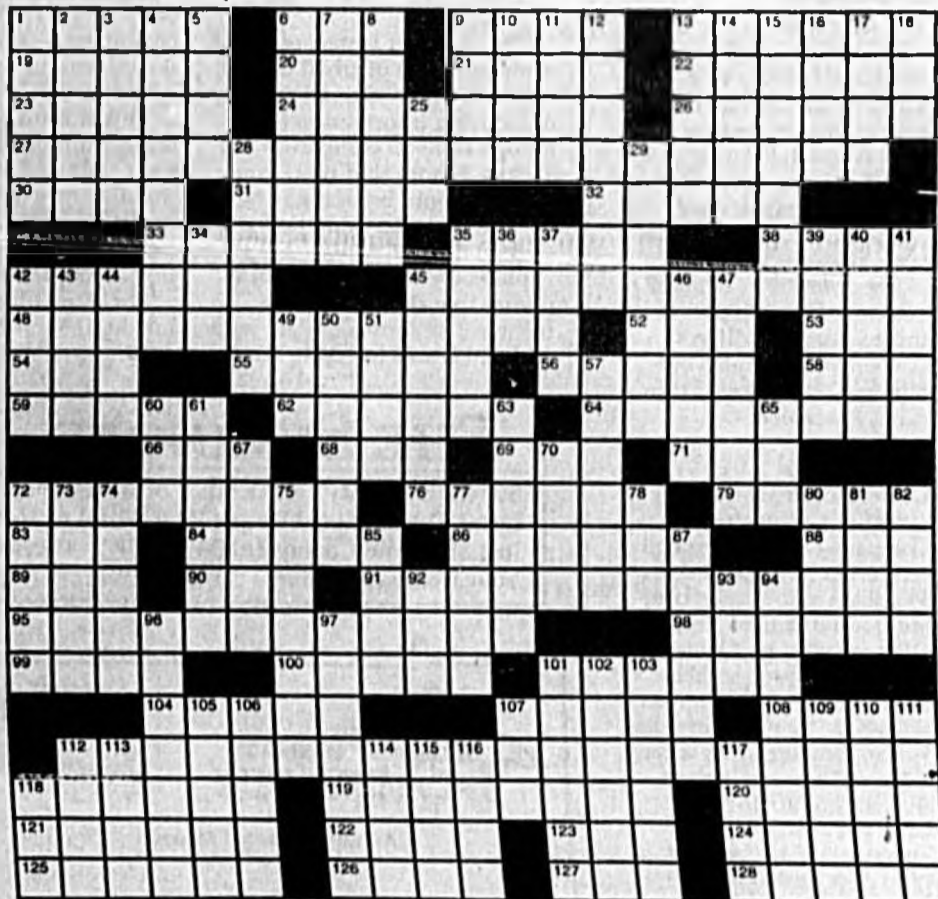

## Consulting company helps protect businesses against computer viruses

Computer viruses aren't a worry for the Seminole/Lake Mary Regional Chamber of Commerce even though the organization is highly dependent on information technology to maintain its network of members, sponsors, local officials and events.

The chamber contracts with a major US IT consulting company — TEAM Information Services, also headquartered in Lake Mary — for its computer technology.

Security against virus and worm attacks like the recent "Code Red" are part of the service, said Matt Moore, founder and chief executive officer at TEAM.

The chamber is part of a growing cadre of small companies and organizations that are outsourcing information technology tasks to companies like TEAM. Moore said more companies should be doing it.

"A worm like Code Red is a serious threat," Moore explained. "Many small companies that don't have the technical expertise to deal with security issues in-house don't

want to pay \$200 to \$3000 per hour to bring experts on board. Outsourcing is their best option."

The security service TEAM provides to its clients is considered ethically responsible today — call it "safe tech."

"With a worm like Code Red, it not only hurts those companies but all of their customers as well," Moore added.

Code Red, known as a worm for the way it burrows into web servers, eventually gives back door access to web servers. "Code Red didn't take a great deal of expertise," said Moore, "but the next one will, and I think we have a lot of business owners — and their customers — who wished they'd sought professional help sooner."

TEAM Information Services is a computer consulting company and part of an IT group that includes Vereon Technology, Inc. in Jacksonville and Dragon Development Inc. in Washington, D.C.

Smyrna in 1939 until 1941, when he resigned to serve in WWII in the Air Corps and later the U.S. Merchant Marine where he was discharged in 1945. He then brought youth and new visions and performance to banking and to the Sanford area when he was elected in 1945 as Cashier of the Florida State Bank of Sanford, a member of the McNulty Group of Banks.  
At the age of 38, in 1954, he was elected to the Board of Directors and President of the bank. He later was elected as Chairman of the nine McNulty Banks.  
He formed one of the first Bank Holding Companies, First Florida Bancorporation, where he served as Chairman and CEO. He helped to acquire approximately 30 small banks through-

out the State of Florida. The banks name was later changed to Flagship Banks, where he served as Chairman of the Executive Committee. He also served as Chairman of seven individual banks from 1962 to 1984. Upon the merger of the Flagship Banks and Sun Bank (now known as SunTrust), Tucker retired to Sea Island, Ga.  
Tucker was elected as the first President of the Florida Bank Holding Co. Association, 1972, and American Bankers Association, Vice President for Florida, 1960, where he also served on many banking committees.  
He served as President of the Fernald Laughton Memorial Hospital in Sanford 1948-1953. He helped to plan and construct the Seminole County Memorial Hospital at Sanford (now known

as the Seminole County Service Building) in 1952.  
He wrote many articles and manuals on all aspects of banking. He recently published a book "A Collection of Insights."  
Tucker was an excellent tennis player and always rose to the challenge of a match. He could often be found serving tennis balls across the net to his opponents with the same determination to succeed in whatever he undertook. He was the winner of six Sanford Tennis Tournaments.  
Tucker served as Chairman of the Sanford Cancer Society; Treasurer of the State of Florida Civil Air Patrol; and he was a Rotarian.  
Tucker never met a stranger. He met many people in his role as a Sanford banker. He instilled in his employees how to make customers happy, how to greet

them and bow to please them. He was one of the first bankers to install drive-in and walk up windows in the Sanford area. He also was responsible for one of the first banks being established on a military facility (Sanford Naval Air Station).  
Tucker is survived by his widow, Maud Trisimen Tucker of Sea Island; his previous wife, Helen Hutchison Tucker of Sanford and their children: Julie Ann Vuchinich, who is a professor at the University of Alabama at Birmingham; Mary Neal Reynolds, an attorney in Birmingham, Ala. John Carson Tucker, Professor and Environmental Attorney at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. He has six grandchildren. Private services were held Thursday, Aug. 30, 2001, in Sea Island, Ga.

## BACK to BRICK



Residents in the 9th Street and Magnolia Avenue area probably noticed a strange vehicle in their neighborhood recently.

The vehicle, dubbed the "Heat Master," is the invention of Patrick O'Connor, founder of Pavement Savers Inc. O'Connor brought his machine to Sanford for a demonstrate of how to remove asphalt from the city's brick streets.

"The demo went really well," said Tom George, project manager for the city of Sanford. "Their process works well. I hope we're able to utilize it."

George said the city has about six miles of brick streets covered with asphalt.

"We'd most likely start in the downtown area and move south," George said. "We'll have to do it in phases."

O'Connor said the Heat Master works by forcing gas and air through porous tiles similar to those mounted on the space shuttle. Each tile has a pilot light that ignites the gas/air mixture and heats the tiles to 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit (pictured above).



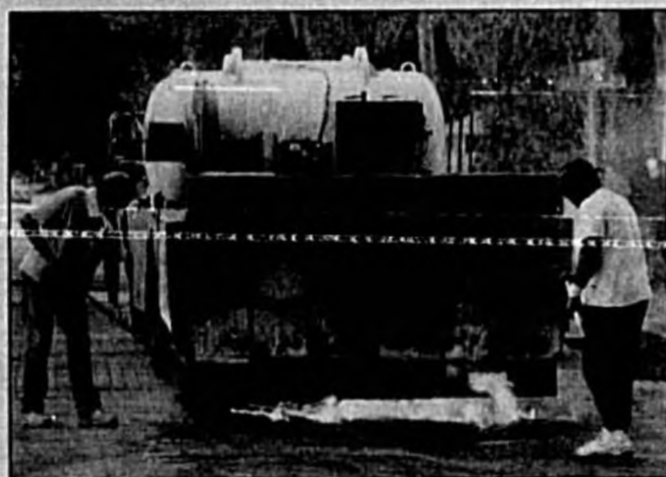
"It takes about a minute to get it that hot," O'Connor said. "When you turn it off, it takes a minute for it to cool down to where you can put your hand on it."

When hot, the tiles are lowered a few inches from the asphalt. The heat loosens the asphalt. Workers with shovels follow the Heat Master and scrap the asphalt off the bricks (bottom left). Once the chunks are cooled, they are swept away (bottom right) and can be reused on

other paving projects. O'Connor, who holds more than 30 patents, said the same machine can be used to strip away old asphalt to prepare for traditional paving, and because the old asphalt can be reused, it cuts paving costs in half. The Heat Master is also used to de-ice runways and fix utility road cuts, eliminating the conventional patch jobs that lead to potholes.

"We sell Heat Masters all over the world," O'Connor said.

have followed Wolfinger's lead, according to Rutberg, as Sarasota has utilized the exclusionary zone to curb its prostitution problems.

According to Rutberg, the zones are formed in cities when certain problems are identified in specific areas of the city. For example, the exclusionary zone in East Altamonte focuses around Jackson Street where there is a "high drug problem."

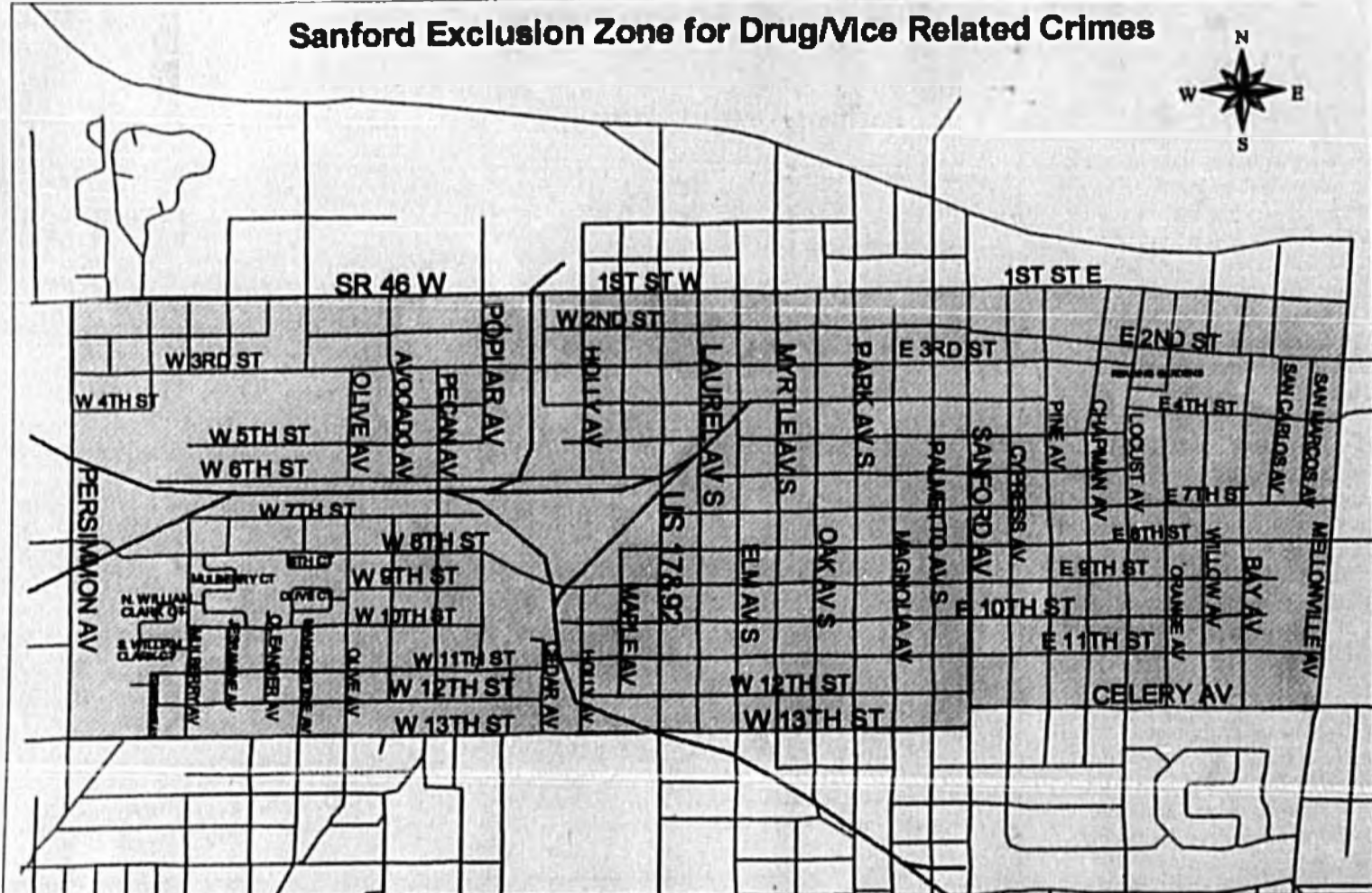
To develop the exclusionary zone is a slow process, said Rutberg, as a system of communication takes time to install between the state attorney's office and police.

"It has to be a partnership with law enforcement for it to work," Rutberg said.

It works well when officers report the crimes to the state attorney soon after suspects are initially arrested. The state attorney in return immediately asks the judge to include the exclusionary zone as a condition of the suspect's bond or probation. Then if the suspect is seen in the exclusionary zone by officers, he or she can be arrested as violation of parole or bond, which is a misdemeanor charge.

According to Tooley, there is a reasonableness built in for suspects who live in the area or need to visit a sick grandmother. They are allowed to travel in and out as long as "they're not standing on the corner for a half a hour."

"Our thought is if we make it more difficult for these people to apply their trade, they'll stop or leave Sanford," Tooley said. "This is trying to key repeat offenders. The person that is caught once in a sting is hopeful-

ly not an issue for them."

DelRosso added "It's just another tool to our arsenal to keep our community safe from these crimes."

In less than a month, Sanford police have already added 19 suspects to the exclusionary

zone list. If police were to run a check on any of the 19 while in the zone, the officer's in-car computer alert them to arrest the suspect.

The 19 are: Angel Baez, Ruben Ramirez, Abelardo Juarez, Sandy Coleman, Wanda Comer, Henry

Mitchell, Daniel Kish, Thomas Maner, David Dalton, Rederick Mills, Willie Williams, Antonio Taylor, Morgan Bradford, Ben Hampton, Alfred Ceballos, Anthony Oliver, James Longwell, Curtis Littles and Harry Jones.

"It's not a cure all that will fix everything— it's just another arrow in our quiver," Tooley said.

water, but rather it was the Indian Mound Water Association, which in 1967 built and maintained the water lines. The lines were turned over to the city in 1993 for no charge.

One Celery Avenue resident and former Sanford mayor, Larry Dale, argued Celery Avenue was the future for the city.

"We have a lot of old areas in Sanford — we don't have a lot of new areas," said Dale. "The outcome of this plan has been in the

works for 10 years. I hope this will become a reality. I've never seen as much time put into a plan as this one.

"I can envision a very beautiful upscale community in this area. My family has put our assets and hopes this plan will work."

McIntosh argued opposite of Dale stating, "We want to protect the area we invested our money and lives in."

"We are not legally subject to annexation. If the county will not protect us from annexation, I will

protect us." Commissioner Henley said he was reluctant to impose something on people that were so adamant against it.

"My greatest fear is the fear of the city's future actions," Commissioner Randy Morris said. "I seriously believe we need to continue negotiations."

In the last several months, Sanford started its annexing progression down Celery Avenue as Celery Farms was annexed into the city. Morris said to the oppos-

ing crowd if the county does not do something the city will, which may mean a higher density of housing for the area.

In other business, commissioners unanimously overturned a board of adjustment decision to allow a new cell phone tower only 22 feet from another property owner's line.

"We have had to deal with cell towers on a number of occasions. They are a necessary evil in today's time, but I've never seen one with a 22-foot variance,"

Morris said. The property in which the tower was proposed to be placed is owned by James Hammond of Longwood.

"We had five acres — a nice place up there, but the GreeneWay took it," Hammond said about the 9,700 square feet left. "We're kind of stuck with it and this was the best thing we could think of."

reinforce classroom instruction by providing interactive skills practice in an FCAT-like format, providing performance feedback and learning guidance. Programs and materials, created by Florida teachers and other subject experts, are currently available for fourth-grade reading, fifth-grade mathematics and eighth-grade mathematics, with more programs being added next year.

According to Pinnell, DOE will be sending each principal in the district a school-specific pass-word along with directions for creating student files that parents and teachers will be able to access to review individual student performance.

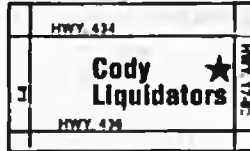

"Advanced Camp has been a unique experience because it challenged me physically and mentally," Berry said.

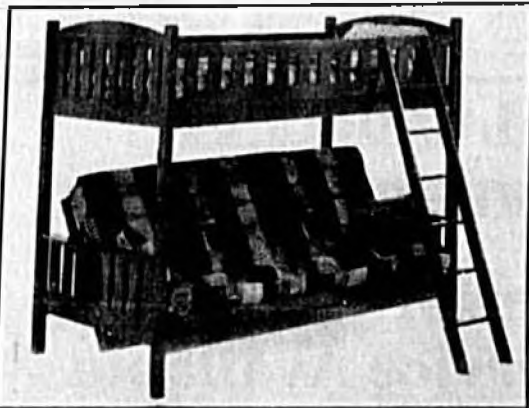

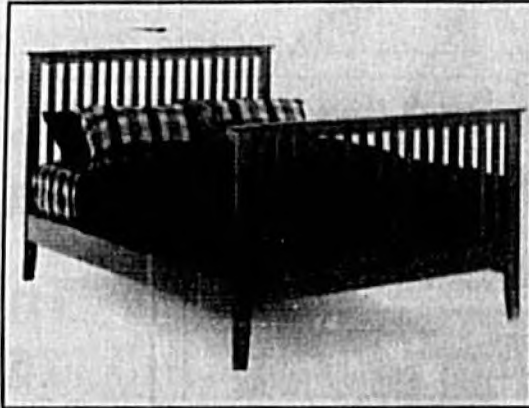

### Oviedo High School posts a 21-13 victory on a Hall of Fame night

OVIEDO — For long-time Seminole County high school football fans, Friday night's season-opening showdown between the Lake Howell Silver Hawks and host Oviedo Lions at John Courier Field was a blast from the past.

Fittingly, the retro-contest — won by Oviedo, 21-13 — came on a night when Oviedo High School inducted the newest members into the Lion Athletic Hall of Fame.

It wasn't that long ago that Lion-Silver Hawk contests featured the grind-it-out

game of Oviedo's Diaz brothers while Marquette Smith was spearheading Lake Howell's score from anywhere at any time attack.

On Friday night, the 2001 Lions unveiled their most recent BBC (backfield by committee) ground game while Silver Hawk senior quarterback/running

back/wide receiver/defensive back/punter Brandon Marshall showed that distance and circumstances are irrelevant for him and his mates.

Marshall helped Lake Howell take a 13-6 lead in the first half with a pair of jaw-dropping plays.

In the first quarter, facing second down

and 13 from the Oviedo 30-yard line, Marshall seemed about to be tackled for a sack when he somehow managed to escape and wove his way into the end zone.

Then, in the second quarter, after the Lions had closed the gap to 7-6, Marshall and wide receiver Chris Narsesian hooked up on a 72-yard touchdown pass play that put the Silver Hawks up 13-6.

After accumulating 184 yards of offense on 16 plays through the first 16 minutes of the game, Lake Howell was held to just 77 yards on 19 plays over the

Led by the running of Andre Raines, and the defense of Donta Whack, the Tribe scores a 28-12 victory

LAKE MARY — Jim Bernhardt needs to bone up on the lyrics to the Seminole High School alma mater.

Moments after his Seminoles defeated the Lake Mary Rams 28-12, the team gathered in front of the Marching 'Noles Band for the traditional singing of the school song. Bernhardt mouthed some of the words, but admitted afterwards he's not much of a singer.

"I do pretty good at school when the words are on the wall," Bernhardt joked.

Seminole fans will forgive the new coach, especially since his first win at SHS comes in the first game of the season against rival Lake Mary.

The play was sloppy for both teams, with seven turnovers in the game. But there were moments of brilliance, particularly when 'Noles quarterback Andre Raines had the ball in his hands. The senior's slashing running style kept the Ram defense off-balance all night, and he ripped off a 52-yard touchdown run that sealed the victory for Seminoles.

The defense played well in the second half, with much of the play taking place on Lake Mary's side of the 50-yard line. The Seminoles came up with two fourth-down stops, led by hard-hitting middle linebacker John Liton.

"It felt good to get that first win," Liton said. "We worked hard this week, and the coaches prepared us well."

The D also got a stellar performance from the player with the best defensive name in football — Donta Whack. The senior defense lineman came up with two fumble recoveries to kill Lake Mary drives.

"We had a few mistakes out there tonight, but we're going to work to overcome those in practice this week, Whack said. "We've just got to concentrate on reading our keys and playing hard."

Lake Mary got the scoring started in the second quarter

with an impressive 98-yard drive. Pinned deep by a Matt Groover punt, Ram quarterback Mike Muzeka connected on a couple of nice passes to Bobby Good.

With the ball on their own 32-yard line, the Rams then went to the running game and their talented running back Reggie Campbell. Campbell's dad, Reggie Sr., is a Seminole alum. The junior Campbell looked impressive against his pop's old team, gaining 52



yards on the drive, including a 12-yard dash for the touchdown. The extra point was no good.

Seminole responded with a nice drive of their own. Starting from their 20-yard line, the Tribe marched down the field. Faced with a fourth-and-2 on the Lake Mary 47, the Seminoles were able to draw the defense offside to keep the drive alive.

Raines had a couple of big gainers, complimented by

Deon Casey's hard-nosed running, in a bit of misdirection on third-and-goal, Darius Chaplin, not Raines, lined up at quarterback and sprinted around right end from the 4.

The extra point was good. Seminole took a 7-6 lead into half-time thanks to a Justin McKinney interception to kill a Lake Mary drive with 30 seconds left in the half.

## Gator hunting season starts today

September 1 marks the beginning of the annual public waters alligator harvest in Florida. This year, more than 1,500 selected alligator hunters have the opportunity to take two alligators each from specific harvest sites around the state.

"This year 7,871 people, including 84 from out-of-state, applied for the unique hunting experience," said Joy M. Hill, public information coordinator for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC). "The selection process began back in June when prospective hunters applied to the FWC for the lottery-style drawing that is used to pick participants."

The FWC will conduct the hunts on 54 management units throughout the state during the five week season which ends October 7. This is the 14th consecutive season that alligator hunts have been conducted on Florida's public waters.

"Originally, the alligator harvest program was seen primarily as a limited commercial operation. However, because it's so popular among recreational hunters, its focus has changed to allow more hunters to participate," said Hill.

The harvest of alligators is strictly regulated by the FWC to insure that adult alligators are not over harvested. Hunters are allowed to keep the alligators they harvest, or sell them to authorized buyers. However, all hides must be validated and records of transfer maintained to insure proper identification of legally taken alligator parts. Live alligators may not be kept.

Licensed hunters may have one or more people assist them during the hunt but assistants are required to purchase a \$50, non-transferable agent's license. Licensed agents may not hunt independently of their licensed hunter.

Trappers may use snatch hooks, snares, gigs or harpoons to take alligators, and bows-and-arrows or crossbows may be used if the projectile is attached to a restraining line. Firearms are prohibited.

final 31 minutes of the game. During a stretch extending from the second quarter into the third, Oviedo had the ball for over 16 consecutive minutes.

That exposed Lake Howell coach Mike Bisceglia's primary concern regarding his 2001-02 team - lack of numbers.

"We're playing too many people both ways," said Bisceglia. "We've got some good skill position players and we play hard, but fatigue may be a problem for us late in games."

While the Lions did use six different running backs in gathering 193 yards in rushing against Lake Howell, the real story Friday was the play of sophomore quarterback Lee Sloan, who completed 8 of 12 passes for 118 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for a touchdown.

"Grant (Herren, Oviedo's junior starting quarterback who is out with a broken collar bone) is out for four to eight weeks," said Oviedo coach Greg Register. "Even when Grant does come back, we're keeping Lee with the varsity. He was very composed and didn't make any sophomore mistakes."

Alligators play a vital role in the function of many of Florida's delicate ecosystems and hunting seasons are possible only when animal populations remain abundant and stable. As little as 40 years ago, alligators were deemed to be in short supply as a result of widespread poaching. Since then, intensive management and aggressive protection have allowed alligators to stage one of the most prolific comebacks in the history of wildlife conservation. Alligators now occur in almost every body of water in the state including many urban retention ponds and drainage ditches.

With the abundance of alligators and no natural predators to control them, Florida's gator population has reached the point where the available habitat cannot support more alligators. In fact, gators are so plentiful that the FWC now licenses commercial alligator operations that depend on wild stocks as a basis for replenishment. The information gathered from these well-regulated hunts and from licensed commercial alligator farms, provides critical data in helping manage the state's alligator population.

The preservation of wetland habitats is also a benefit derived from the commercialization of Florida's alligator population. Before the commercialization of alligators, wetlands were often filled in by farmers to become income producing pastures or crop fields. Since commercialization has occurred, wetlands are less likely to be filled because they have economic value, providing income from the sale of alligators and their eggs.

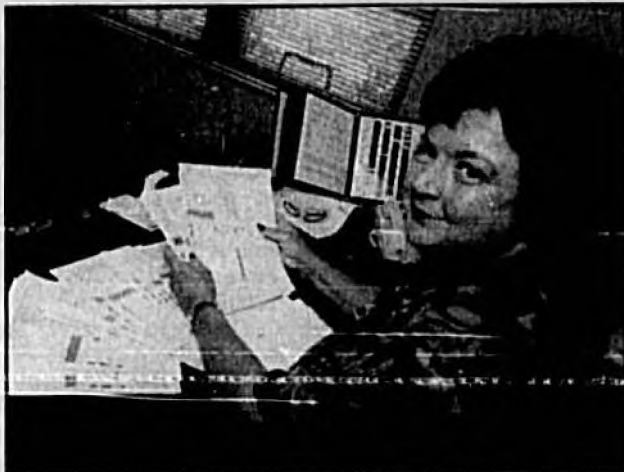

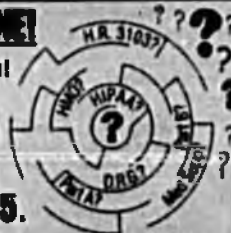

# Aglaonema: A lady in the shadows

Aglaonema belongs to the Araceae plant family that includes philodendron, caladium, anthurium, and spathiphyllum. The inflorescence of these plants is a densely flowered simple

spadix surrounded by a usually colored modified leaf (called the spathe). The whole structure is considered to be the flower.

Aglaonema species originate in the humid, heavily shaded tropical forests of southern Asia, mainly Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, the Philippines and Sri Lanka. Most of the vari-

eties used in cultivation are the results of plant explorations but a few man-made hybrids are now available for production.

Recent discoveries of Aglaonema with unique foliar variegation patterns and petiole coloration are being used to produce new and exciting varieties.

## The Plant

Aglaonema is an evergreen, erect, compact plant, about 1 to 3 feet high, with short stems that bear beautiful variegated leaves. The strikingly marked leaves are held by petioles shorter than the blades and arranged in groups at the end of the stems.

Aglaonema flowers are white and look like small Calla or Spathiphyllum flowers but rarely form under normal conditions. The "flower" is formed by a group of small flowers borne on a spadix surrounded by a bract which are small in proportion to the size of the foliage.

Some species develop colored fruits that look like berries.

## Culture

Plants will tolerate low light conditions and should not be exposed to direct sunlight. Temperatures between 60 to 70 degrees are adequate for this plant, but it will grow more vigorously at higher temperatures. Any slight chill may cause leaf discoloration.

A mixture of peat and perlite are recommended to grow this plant, the pots should not be too large, as these plants grow best when their roots are confined in small containers. Watering should be done regularly to maintain the potting mixture moist. Only the surface should be allowed to dry out between watering periods.

In the winter months the plants will require less water. If the roots stay too wet, the leaves will begin to wilt due to lack of oxygen around the roots. Use a weak solution of fertilizer when applying fertilizer with the watering. A yellowing of the lower leaves often indicates low levels of nitrogen.

## Propagation

New plants can be produced at any time by splitting large clumps into smaller sections and potting them

individually. Tip cuttings of 6 to 8 inches long with three or more leaves or stem segments 3 to 4 inches long, are used to propagate this plant.

## Repotting

Repot your plants during the months of March and April. Carefully remove the old compost from the fleshy roots and put a layer of pebbles in the bottom of the pot. Instead of soil, use a commercial potting mix with sphagnum moss, peat moss, and sand or perlite to fill the pot.

## Varieties

Approximately 20 Aglaonema varieties are produced in Florida. "Silver King" and "Silver Queen" are two of the best known varieties of Aglaonema that are very popular in many places. They differ basically in the markings on the leaf and the rate of growth.

The variety "Snow Queen" with its dark green leaves and white markings, is one of the most beautiful of the Aglaonemas. The variety "Stripes" developed in Florida has narrow bands of silvery white color along the lateral veins.

The so-called Chinese Evergreen is one of the species of this plant that have leaves without any markings or patterns.

Another species of Aglaonema, the Painted Drop-tongue, has attractive grayish green leaves with darker green margins.

## Uses

Aglaonema is an excellent house plant. It is mainly grown in containers in malls, offices or homes. It can also be used outdoors as a ground cover in densely shaded areas of the yard.

## Pests And Disease

This plant is affected by mealybugs and spider mites. The appearance of red spider mites is usually related to high levels of light. Use an insecticidal soap to control these problems. Nematodes can become a serious problem if non-sterile soil is used to grow this plant.
