Sulzer Will Lose Out

Albany N. Y., Oct. 16.—It was reported that the Sulzer impeachment court today voted informally in secret session to remove the governor from office. The vote is said to have been 43 to 14. The vote to disqualify him from ever again holding office in the state is said to have been lost. The court adjourned at 1 o'clock until 3, when a start on the final vote will be taken. When the secret voting is through, they will take up the open vote.

The articles of the impeachment court were withheld, it is said. They deal with the campaign statement and the alleged attempt of the governor to suppress evidence before the investigating committee.

THAT NEW DUCK LAW

The federal law covering migratory birds provides for an open season on wild ducks and there is no foundation for the story now going the rounds of the Florida press to the effect that ducks are now protected at all times throughout the United States.

The open season in Florida for waterfowl, which includes ducks, was made to extend from October 1st to January 15th, but owing largely to the efforts of local parties, the dates have been changed from November 20th to February 15th.
