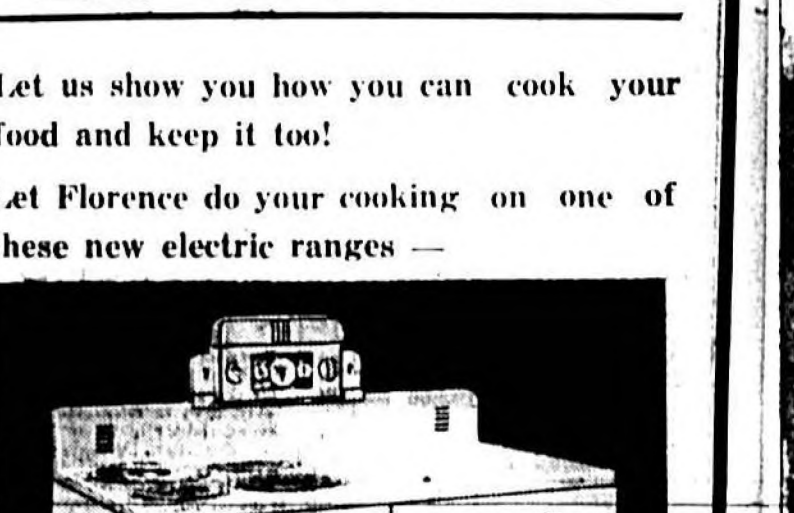

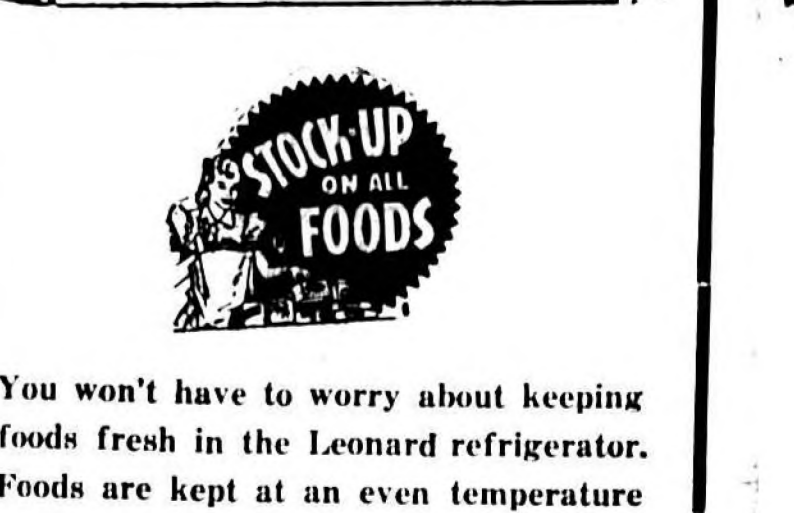

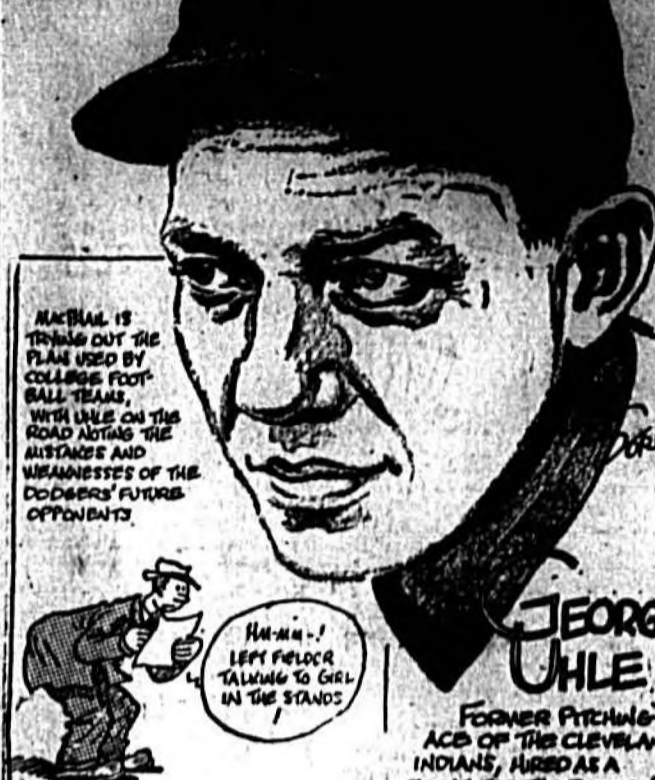

Justice Goes To Ocala As Clubs Make First Choices

Skipper Joe Justice of the Seminoles ended his career with the club tonight along with Pete McLaney and Clyde Jones as the choice clubs made their first choice under the decision reached at Palatka Monday night of each club having a choice of the orphan players with the better club getting first pick.

Justice and Jones were picked by the "orphans" club who is hitting in the 300 society. Gainesville with second choice picked pitcher Jones as their acquisition, putting two ex-Rollins stars back into the Florida State League.

Since Daytona Beach and Leesburg were tied in the league standing they decided the issue on the flip of a coin and the winner, Daytona, selected outfielder McLaney, Orlando, who had wanted both Justice and McLaney passed their turn as did Leesburg and St. Augustine.

DeLand is reported to have taken first baseman Ernie LaValley as their choice but this is not certain since LaValley was talking to Orlando Jim Gansel over the telephone this morning as Orlando is looking for an outfielder.

Now that each club has had a first choice the round will be started again and the clubs will be allowed to make second after the second round are exhausted. Players who are left over will be given releases though league officials announced they would try to find jobs for players who are left unemployed.

Troops Withdrawn From Plane Plant

LOS ANGELES, June 23.—(AP)—Fifteen days after they moved in pushing C. I. O. pickets aside, troops were withdrawn Tuesday from the big North American Aviation plant here.

Lieut. Col. Charles E. Branshaw, who directed the Army's restoration of production on \$195,000,000 in orders for the United States and Great Britain, remains in charge, however.

The 1500 troops, composed chiefly of the 15th Infantry from Ft. Lawton, Wash., moved to bivouac in nearby municipal airport. There was no indication when they would leave the area.

RUSSIANS BOMB FORTS

NEW YORK, June 23.—(AP)—The British Broadcasting Corporation reported today a broadcast that the Russian air force had bombed the Rumanian Black Sea ports of Constanta and Galati and that Bucharest, the Rumanian capital, had had an air raid alarm.
