

And Let The Games Begin

More than 2,000 of America's top senior athletes, ranging in age from 55 to 91, will meet here Monday for the start of the Golden Age Games, an Olympic-style sports gathering for the young-at-heart.

For five days, men and women in their later years will enjoy the challenges and camaraderie of intense physical competition as they vie for medals in track and field, cycling, swimming, tennis, canoeing, golf, bowling and 20 other sporting events.

A visible testament to the healthy, graying of America, the Golden Age Games brings together active elders from all over the country. Sponsored by General Foods' Post Cereals and the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce, the Golden Age Games is part of a program to encourage physical and recreational activity among people 55 or older.

Today, there are more than 45 million Americans over the age of 55. And it's estimated that only about 30 percent of them exercise regularly. However, across the country, programs are now underway in community organizations and senior citizen centers to help older Americans stay physically active.

Held since 1975, the event attracts sports-minded elders of all ages and backgrounds to Sanford.

Gilberto Gonzales, 67, traveled from Puerto Rico last year to take part in the Golden Age Games. A competitor in the 1935 Pan American Games for Puerto Rico, Mr. Gonzales is the current holder of the world death record for his age group. He is a retired army major and lawyer who now spends his time participating in senior sports meetings around the world.

The Golden Age Games attracts active female seniors, too. New Yorker Florence Linden, 81, will combine the games with a visit to friends who live in Orlando. Ms. Linden, who retired as a nursing director at the age of 72, believes "life is what you make of it" and still enjoys dancing, golf and tennis. She will compete in these events, as well as in bowling and croquet.

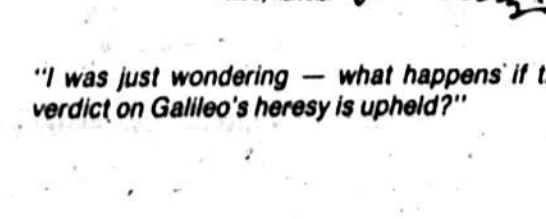
Age is certainly no deterrent to events. At 91, James Gordon is the oldest competitor in the Golden Age Games and will compete in the bowling, pool and shuffleboard events. Cheering him on will be his wife of 73 years. When a farmer in Illinois, Mr. Mason lost the fingers on his right hand in an accident and at the age of 80 had to teach himself to bowl with his left hand. "I've never won a medal, but what's really important is just participating and enjoying oneself," notes the sporting veteran.

It should be a week of excitement and we join the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce in welcoming those hundreds of visitors to Sanford.
