

## BOB OF FORD KILLED TODAY

### And Run Motorists Declared To Have Plotted The Death Of Detroit Magnate

### Patient Is Still In Much Distress

### My Secret Service Men Assigned To Case By Prosecutor

DETROIT, Mar. 31.—(INS)—Assistant Prosecutor Joseph Castellucci today started an investigation into the accident which killed Henry Ford by two hit-and-run motorists, who are suspected of plotting to assassinate the Detroit magnate.

Castellucci ordered Dearborn police to furnish him immediately with a complete report on the bullet in Ford's chest.

The automobile king's condition improved because of his age and the skill of his contracting surgeon. Ford will be 64 on Sunday.

An army of Ford's secret service, private detectives and police officers from Michigan cities are camped in two towns and a stakeholder touring car.

The Studebaker car was said to be deliberately attempted to be driven into the river Rouge.

Ford is recovering from his injuries. He was in the hospital in Detroit, where he was confined since he was taken to a hospital near his estate.

The Studebaker car and its two occupants lay in wait for the automobile king outside his Dearborn laboratory in the drizzle of Sunday night.

## COAL MINERS IN 4 STATES WAIT FOR WALKOUT

150,000 Men In Bituminous Area Embracing Illinois, Indiana, Ohio And Pennsylvania Affected By Order

Jacksonville Scale To End At Midnight

Operators Maintain Their Attitude While Union Is Still Against Wage Cuts

CHICAGO, Mar. 31.—(INS)—An hour of quiet today followed suspension of soft coal mining at midnight, though in the central competitive Indiana, Ohio and western Pennsylvania, Illinois, Ohio and Indiana.

Some 150,000 members of the United Mine Workers Union and virtually all of the bituminous coal mines in the area will be affected by the suspension, which follows the expiration of the Jacksonville wage scale.

The union wants a new contract providing substantially the same basic pay as the Jacksonville agreement—\$7.50 a day for a pro rata amount—40 miners working in a tobacco lease.

The operators, claiming they can not comply with that wage scale with their own fields in West Virginia and Kentucky, want the miners to accept a reduction.

Since the disagreement John L. Lewis, president of the miners' union, proposed that operators continue to pay the Jacksonville scale pending agreement on a new contract.

This proposal has been generally rejected, according to officials of the various operators' organizations. However, it has been favorably received in many areas.

With the appointment of Paul V. Oberholzer as manager and the naming of local men on the board of directors, the Sanford Loan & Savings Company becomes a locally controlled institution, it was pointed out by Oberholzer, formerly a resident of Leesburg, who recently moved to Sanford to make his home.

## U.S. Is Reluctant To Join Other Powers In Protest To Chinese

### MacMurray Reported In Favor Of Making Common Cause Of Incident In Nanking

### Coolidge Frowns On "Big Stick" Policy

### Washington Regards Situation As Being Grave And Delicate

### WASHINGTON, March 31.—

The question of whether the American government will abandon its independent position in China and join with Great Britain and Japan in making a strong protest to the Chinese Nationalists over the Nanking outrage—with a threat of punitive measures in the background—was put squarely to the State Department today.

The British government has been rather urgent in its invitation to the United States to make a common cause of the Nanking incident, and Minister MacMurray at Peking has given it his endorsement, it was learned today.

There was a meeting between the American, British and Japanese ministers in Peking yesterday at which the policy was thoroughly discussed. MacMurray called a long report on it to the State Department, and it is said to have recommended joint action.

Both President Coolidge and Secretary of State Kellogg are understood, however, to be reluctant to ride with the British as far as the British evidently wish to go. While the American government has already issued a strong protest with the Nanking incident, and at the proper time will demand reparations for American losses suffered there, officials here are disinclined to believe that anything more gained at this time by brandishing a "big stick" under Cantonese noses.

The situation is regarded here as extremely and gravely delicate. Although momentarily quiet, anti-foreign sentiment is increasing so rapidly throughout all of China that Nanking incidents, and there are still hundreds of Americans in the interior of China far beyond reach of the guns of any warship.

The feeling prevails here that any precipitate or abrupt action at this time on the part of the powers, acting in unison, might set off that spark.

President Coolidge has already stated with emphasis that American can military and naval forces in China will be maintained on an independent basis, and not "pooled" with those of any other powers under a supreme command. The American units are designed primarily for the protection of American lives and property. If in a common cause they can afford protection to the other powers well and good; if not, they will continue to look after their own.

### Editor Is Arrested On Charge Of Libel

MUNICE, Ind., Mar. 31.—(INS)—George E. Dale, editor of the Post-Democrat, was arrested here today on a grand jury indictment charging him with criminally libeling Circuit Judge Clarence W. DeLoach who is the central figure in the impeachment trial before the Indiana senate in Indianapolis. Dale's bond was fixed at \$5,000. At noon today he is in custody, and it is feared the prosecution will bring in a grand jury indictment.

The indictment was returned after Judge DeLoach suppressed the February 17 issue of the Post-Democrat on the grounds that it libeled him and had contained a special grand jury to indict Dale.

BERLIN, Mar. 31.—(INS)—King Ferdinand of Rumania, has been stricken with grippe and his condition is steadily growing worse, according to word from his bedside today. Doctors were at his bedside all night.

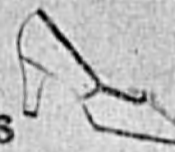

### Austrian Experts Plan To Teach Social Insurance To South American Republic

At the invitation of the Chilean government, two insurance experts, Dr. Karl Müller and Hofrat Hans Vogl, will leave here shortly to teach the Austrian social insurance schemes in Chile. The Chilean government recently passed laws providing for insurance against old age, unemployment, etc., all of which have been in operation in Austria since the revolution of 1918.

Everyone contributing has the right to call upon the government in case of need. The weekly amount contributed by each worker is insignificant. To this the municipal governments and rural councils as well as the national government add about thirty percent. The contributions are more or less stationary, all surplus being invested for future use. Last year the Austrian government collected about sixteen million dollars from workers, to be applied to the unemployment insurance schemes and paid out twenty-two millions in doles. Dr. Müller and Hofrat Vogl have been directors of the government insurance schemes for several years. They will remain in Chile about four months.
