



Police Need Better Community Relations

Public officials-State, Federal and Localdecry the rise in the crime rate and urge all citizens to cooperate in reversing this upward

Mr. and Mrs. Average Citizen would be the first to protest they never knowingly violate laws. They would indignantly object to anyone who might infer they very likely may be arrested, fingerprinted and confined in a jail. Several weeks ago, a Central Florida

newspaper published an article which too clearly pointed out how this might well happen to you. Quoting chiefs of Police in Volusia County, the article related that violators of speeding-traffic laws can be and are brought to the Police Department. If the violator is not from the county, usually bail bond is required. At least one department indicated it was discretionary with the charging officer whether or not a resident of that city likewise might be required to post a bail bond.

You say-"So what?"-you have your credit cards for identification and always carry your check book, so how much bail can be set for a traffic violation-excluding driving under the influence or leaving the scene of an accident-hit and run. "Any one who does that should be arrested!!

But the rude awakening -the Police Departments generally will not accept a personal check, even though it is drawn on a Florida bank. Credit cards have not yet been accepted here for bail purposes.

But-have not the Law Enforcement people been warning"Don't carry large amounts of cash on your person!

The newspaper article reported that amounts up to \$41 or \$47 have been set as bail figures. If this should happen to your, and cash can not be brought to bail you out, resultfingerprinting, mugged, car and contents inventoried and you are in a jail cell!!

The Alternative-If the violator is issued a citation and then fails to appear, the Court can and most often does issue a warrant for the arrest of that offender for failure to appear. Further and more important, since July 1, 1970, Section 322.18 of Florida Statutes provides that on application for renewal of a driver's license, the Department of Public Safety, Driver's License Division will refuse such renewal, when the department's records reflect one or more STOPS have been placed against that license for failure to answer a traffic summons involving a

Recently, an individual was denied renewal of his license for failing to answer a citation issued in 1968. So the computer now seems to be operating and up to date.

What about Out-of-State drivers? More than

30 States have reciprocity agreements. If the violator is from a state party to this agreement, such as New Jersey, and the violator fails to answer the citation, that state is appropriately advised and the offending driver will have his driving privilege suspended by his home Stateup to 90 days. Failure to appear for more serious violations, such as DWI (driving while intoxicated) result in more drastic action by the home state.

Any wonder now why some people will not enthusiastically, "Support Your Police." It is sad but true-stereotyping is done and, "All cops are alike" and our Mr. and Mrs. Average Citizen will support none.

I Read It In The Newspaper

If you are looking for statistics, you can usually find them in the newspaper. But the average newspaper is something more than statistics. It is a mirror reflecting life, with this difference; that the image remains long after the

original has passed into oblivion. Let's just glance at some of the items in an old newspaper of the 1890s. Most of the people and events mentioned have long been forgotten, but there they arepreserved in that yellowed bit of paper and brought back to life by reading them.

There was an account of a fashionable wedding, and after describing the ceremony in detail the paper continued with, "The ordeal was rather trying to the fair bride, as it lasted a full hour, all of which time the wedding party were kept in a kneeling posture.

"Toward the close of the service a pallor spread over her features and soe became so faint that it was necessary to provide a chair. It soon passed away, her cheeks assumed a brighter hue, and as the train moved to the door the pretty bride seemed lovelier than ever."

Quite evidently, when the minister tied the knot in those days, it was for keeps. The bride was described as "a young lady of excellent mental endowments, amply blessed with this world's goods and heiress to a cozy amount." Of the

groom it was said, "He is a gentleman, every inch of him, an active, clearheaded businessman.'

After the ceremony the wedding party "repaired immediately to the house for a wedding breakfast. The handsome house was made doubly beautiful by yards and yards of trailing smilax in every room from chandelier, mantel and pictures, the green relieved by a profusion of cut flowers.

Columbia's Copper To Rival Chile's

By PENNY LERNOUX Copley News Service BOGOTA - Colombia may some

day become one of Latin America's major copper producers, rivaling Mexico, Peru and, possibly, even Chile, the hemisphere's copper king. Colombia's hopes are based on announcement of a spectacular copper deposit in the northwestern part of this South American nation. The 625-million-ton deposit was located by a team of geologists from the U. S. Geological Survey and the Colombian Ministry of Mines and

Petroleum. The team has been surveying Colombia's terrain for the last nine years.

Headed by geologist Earl Irving. of the University of California, Los Angeles, the program also has revealed the existence of new, large deposits of iron, phosphates, gypsum and other minerals. Colombia's first in depth mineral

inventory was started in 1963 with a \$2 million loan from the Agency for International Development (AID) and a \$1.6 million grant from the Mines and Petroleum Ministry. So successful was the project in shovel prospecting.

These responses are exalted by some Americans as perceptive comment and highly intelligent, idealistic rebellion against the shortcomings of this society.





Funding Problems

"There are a couple of problems between the State Attorney's office and the Board of County Commissioners as regards funding," stated Abbott Herring, States Attorney. He told the board there had apparently been a lack of adequate communication during the budget hearings and he had received the salary committments requested, and that he had even stated publicly that he was very pleased with the support from the commission in allowing him most of his

However, it appears that two members of his staff, who were grandfathered in from the prosecutors office, now receive less salary than they were receiving. Herring said that he understood that there would be no change. "I feel it is unreasonable for you to cut those salaries; And now I am faced with the problem of paying more than I want to or less than she deserves."

He contended someone should have informed them of this county pay scale. He said that he had understood from Lois Hare, personnel agent for the county and Rodney Layer, administrative assistant to the board of commissioners, that the salary would be paid, but now I find that this is not true." "I did not anticipate this type of problem. I can't tell my people what they will make because I don't know what you are going to do, he added.

classified basis; allocate the funds to his office and let him administer the salary funds. This will be considered at a work session next week.

Another problem, or rather a continuing problem, is the telephones situation in the States Attorney's office. "I asked for \$2400 for telephones during the budget hearings. Herring was advised to prepare a breakdown of information regarding personnel and telephone use and service and research the legality of setting up a trust fund to be administered by the State Attorney for purposes of paying salaries. These matters will all be discussed at work session next Tuesday.


