## Sanford Favored ·In Water Decision

Decision in favor of the City of Sanford has been returned by the Florida Fourth Court of Appeal in a suit brought by the Leffler Company seeking to restrain the city from laying water mains across its property on Celery Avenue. City Attorney William C. Hutchison Jr. said the decision was returned yesterday afternoon by the Appellate Court at Vero Beach.

The State of Florida and the City of Sanford had entered into an agreement whereby the State would deed 6.47 acres of land on Celery Avenue to the City for water service at the Central Florida Experiment Station farther out on Celery Avenue, near Cameron Avenue,

Leffler Company filed suit in 18th Circuit Court property adjacent to Celery Avenue with water mains. Circuit Judge William Akridge returned a verdict in favor of the City. The Leffier Company carried the case on appeal to the higher court, which now has confirmed Akridge's decision.
