



OVEN FORK, Ky. (AP) - Federal officials and the owners of the Scotia Coal Co. face a grim decision today whether to seal a southeast Kentucky coal mine and temporarily entomb the latest 11 victims of explosions there. WASHINGTON (AP) - Farmers and feedlot operators are building up their inventories of grain-fed cattle, meaning consumers will see more choice and primegrade cuts of beef in the grocery store, the government

The Agriculture Department said Friday that as of March 1, 8,121,000 cattle were being fed for slaughter in seven key states. That was a gain of 48 per cent from 5,481,000 a year earlier. The seven states produce about 70

Although the new report did not include price forecasts, department projections indicate producers can expect some recovery in cattle prices this spring after markets slumped in the winter.

Companies Admit Pay-offs

WASHINGTON (AP) - Three more major American companies, including the giant International Telephone and Telegraph Corp., say they were involved in making payoffs to officials and customers in foreign countries. The three firms, ITT, General Tire and Rubber Co. and Westinghouse Electric Corp., said internal investigations were made as a result of the disclosure of foreign bribes paid by other large American firms and as a result of probes by the Securities and Exchange Commission. A fourth firm, Universal Oil Products Co., reported Thursday it had made \$290,000 in questionable overseas

Supplies Await Decisions

WASHINGTON (AP) - Almost limitless supplies of renewable energy are lying around on the earth's surface waiting for the political decisions needed to develop them,

Organic matter from plants, trees and wastes store the energy of sunlight. This energy can become useful forms of fuel, heat and electricity through bioconversion if there is a commitment to do so, the experts said Friday. Several hundred persons representing science, government and private industry attending a three-day conference on bioconversion heard reports on a worldwide need to develop biological sources of energy.

Talk Wins Calloway Case

WASHINGTON (AP) - Howard "Bo" Callaway, President Ford's campaign chief, won permission to expand his Colorado ski resort on government land after personally arguing his case before Agriculture Department officials last summer in his Pentagon office. The approval reversed a previous U.C. Forest Service

J. Phillip Campbell, retired undersecretary of agriculture, said Friday night that Callaway requested the meeting to present his case for expanding the Crested Butte resort in western Colorado near Aspen.





Training Control Suggested

training in public schools, community colleges and vocational schools should be controlled by community college boards of trustees, a state panel says. The Florida Public Post-Secondary Education Finance Committee said in a report released Friday that all three types of schools are making pioneering efforts, but fragmentation of control allows competition and unnecessary duplication.

The committee was headed by Education 240 Chainer Ralph Turlington and included Senate Education Chairman Philip Lewis, D-West Palm Beach, Board of Regents member Marshall Harris and former Senate President Jerry Thomas.

Vaccine Progress Claimed

MELBOURNE (AP)-Researchers at Florida Institute of Technology say they have taken a major step toward finding a vaccine for syphilis by discovering a way to grow the organism in a test tube. However, scientists at the National Center for Disease Control in Atlanta say they have been unable to duplicate

the Florida group's claimed breakthrough and will send its own researcher to FIT later this month to further study the work. Dr. Ronald H. Jones, director of the FIT research team said Friday that the group's success in growing syphilis in a test tube will allow scientists to study the veneral

disease away from a living animal for the first time. Experts Costs Defended

TALLAHASSEE (AP)-House Growth and Energy Chairman Hyatt Brown says consumers can save \$10,000 for every \$1 he spends on expert witnesses to support his plan to reduce electric rates.

Brown, D-Daytona Beach, said he has invited professors Jay Livingstone of Georgia Tech and David Ewert of Georgia State University to testify to two committees Wednesday on his bill mandating a \$60.3million decrease in electric rates. Brown said he is paying for the witnesses out of his committee's budget. He said the \$6,000 cost is a good deal be-

cause Livingstone and Ewert are charging one-third the fee they charge to represent private companies. Flunking Of Students Urged

"Open access to our universities in important, but don't think we owe any obligation to a student to keep him in school unless he meets competitive academic standards," Robinson said in a civic club speech Friday. The Board of Regents has proposed a 10 per cent reduction in state university enrollments, but Gov. Reubin Askew said that won't be necessary if the legislature adopts his state university budget recommendations.

TALLAHASSEE (AP)-The ability of the Ethics Commission to discipline officials for misconduct has been seriously weakened by Atty. Gen. Robert Shevin's opinion that it cannot recommend temporary suspensions, Chairman E. Harris Drew says.

"We're left now in a rather intolerable position," Drew said Friday. "The idea we can't impose a suspension poses a rea! problem in the work of this commission.' The panel recommended recently that Gov. Reubin Askew suspend Homer B. Sikes Jr. for 90 days. Sikes subsequently resigned Thursday as a Putnam County

Many Impressed With Brezhnev

Those in Moscow who watched Leonid Brezhnev's appearance before the 25th Soviet Communist Party Congress were impressed with his vigor and endurance in delivering a speech that lasted more than five hours. The party chairman. turning 70 this year, seemed determined to show that reports of his failing health have been exaggerated.

Turning to what he said, Mr. Brezinev also seems determined to establish that the Soviet Communist Party is as bound as ever to the idea that Communists the world over should toe the mark of Marxist-Leninist philosophy as interpreted from Moscow. He gave no hint of a rapprochement with Red China, and the opening of the party congress drew a blistering attack on Soviet policies from Peking.

The absence of a Peking delegation at this major Communist pow-wow was to be expected. but Mr. Brezhnev may have been nettled to see that the head of the Prench Communist Party was missing, too. French and Italian Communists who apparently are trying to pull their parties away from Moscow's direction for the sake of being more palatable to the people in their own countries clearly were the target of Mr. Brezhnev's reference to "opportunists." He said it would be a betrayal of "proletarian internationalism" for Communists to take part in Western parliamentary governments. This could be a signal to such parties that any support they have received from Moscow in the past is in jeopardy. For them to reject Moscow doctrine would only encourage the

Whether this was Mr. Brezhnev's swan song remains to be seen. Contrary to rumor, he gave the impression he is not yet ready to quit. For that matter, the substance of his speech gave the impression that Soviet communism is also not ready to stop being what it has always been - the source of both a rigid revolutionary doctrine and the strength of arms to impose it wherever the opportunity presents itself.

Insurgents Ask Parliament

To Oust Lebanese President BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Lebanon's military coup

leaders called on Parliament Saturday to dislodge a defiant President Suleiman Franjieh and end the civil war that has torn this county for nearly a year. The Moslem parliament speaker, Kamel Assad, sum-

moned leaders of the assembly's political groups to seek a legal and facesaving way to get the 65-year-old Maronite president to quit office without further gunplay. But the streets of Beirut and most of the Lebanese countryside were under control of rival bands of gunmen, army mutineers and private militias staking territorial claims in the absence of state authority.

Troops behind the 57-year-old Moslem coup leader, Brig. Aziz Ahdab, worked in cooperation with leftist Moslem militiamen and Palestinian guerrillas, indicating at least passive acceptance of his two-day-old takeover from Syria and the Lebanese left.

Blazing Ship's Crew Rescued

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (AP) - A Canadian research ship rescued the 23-man crew of the fishing vessel Cape Freels on Friday from the storm-tossed Atlantic, 120 miles southeast of St. John's.

OTTAWA (AP) - The federal anti-inflation board said Friday it has ordered 31 companies to restrict their dividends to shareholders.

The announcement said the anti-inflation guidelines basically restrict dividend payments during the 12 months ending next Oct. 13 to the level paid in the last financial year before the controls were imposed. The board did not list the amounts by how much the companies were ordered to cut dividends.

Sponsored by the Seminole Mutual Concert Association, "William Windom, Plays Thurber" was enjoyed by a small but appreciative audience. Captivated

by the actor's relaxed style, they were entertained by a series of narrative dramas, interspersed by Thurber's own quaint fables, each with a sly but funny moral twist at

Windom's longer pieces were a true Thurberesque bundle of sad yet funny poigna.cy: ontailons, unter embarrassingly real, were created for the audience by Windom using nothing more than his talent for story

True, he wore the eyeshade, sweater and heavy spectacles that Thurber favored, and occasionally tapped a word or two on an ancient typewriter. But other than that, it was the tales, and the way Windom told them, that captivated his audience.

His interpretation of Thurber's "My Own Three Rules for a Happy Marriage," evoked knowing chuckles. He had his audience squirming in embarrassed sympathy as he related "Teacher's Pet," the story of an aging man relivian the time in his childhood when he was reduced to

Student Artists Exhibit In Mall


