



Nearly 75 per cent of those polled said President Ford's greatest advantage in his attempt to be elected next year is the fact that he is the incumbent. Reagan's greatest advantage was nearly split down the middle with about

one-third saying it was his philosophy, another one-third his record while in public office and the balance indicating "other" reasons.

Following Watergate and the disclosures that led to former President Richard Nixon's resignation more than a year ago, many young people said they were through with politics and wouldn't venture any help in future political battles.

However, 74.42 per cent of the Young Republicans attending the conclave said they would become involved in the primary

elections while only 16.28 per cent said they would not. The balance of those polled said either 'maybe' or offered no

It was unanimous that all would unite behind the nominee, no matter who wins the nomination. Too, 83.72 per cent of those

voting said the Republican presidential primary would have a healthy effect on the entire Republican Party.

The results of the poll were released by State Chairman Ed Havill of Eustis.

Brush Fires Threaten

Lives, Homes Near L.A.

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Fierce winds swirled flames across more than 68,500 acres of brushland in two separate fires near Los Angeles early today, threatening at least 100 homes and forcing evacuation of more than 600

The Mt. Baldy fire 35 miles east of downtown Los Angeles spread over about 10,000 acres in a few hours late Tuesday as 50-mile-an-hour winds off the deserts raked the slopes. Two ranger stations and four penal camps were abandoned as the blaze grew to 23,000 acres, making it the second biggest brush fire in the nation this year. Meanwhile, the biggest, a fire twice that size, flared up again in spots in the Big Tujunga Canyon on the northeast edge of Los Angeles and forced residents to flee several homes. Fire has already destroyed at least 20 homes and damaged 30 others there.

Physician Plan Promoted

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Ford administration i pushing new legislation designed to produce more family physicians and move them to rural areas and urban slums where there are shortages of medical help.

The plan, which contains elements of other proposals pending in Congress, consists of a scholarship program that requires recipients to work for a term in the Public Health Service or as private practioners in assigned

The plan also would continue a federal program under which government grants were made to health schools on the basis of the number of students enrolled. The program also would be changed to make it another means of encouraging more physicians to serve in poor areas. The administration previously had opposed continuing the

Israel Boycott List Coming

WASHINGTON (AP) - Commerce Secretary Rogers C. B. Morton says that in an attempt to avoid a political confrontation he will provide a House panel with a secret list of American firms pressured into joining the Arab boycott of Israel.

In a letter released Tuesday, Morton said he will offer the list, provided it remains confidential, to a House commerce subcommittee that has voted to cite him for contempt of Congress for refusing to supply information on the firms. However, a leading critic of the boycott and Morton's

handling of it, said the plan to keep the names confidential is unacceptable and that he will fight to have the full House Commerce Committee reject Morton's compromise when it meets next week after the Thanksgiving

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP) - An Alexander City physician named in a \$2 million medical malpractice suit brought by a Florida man has lost an attempt to have the court record of the case sealed because of extensive

U.S. District Judge Robert Varner dismissed Tuesday a motion by lawyers for Dr. M. S. Brasfield asking that the records be closed on the grounds that newspaper reports have made it impossible for the defendant to receive a fair

Brasfield was named in the medical malpractice suit by Alfred B. Gordon of Fort Walton Beach, Fla., who charges that his daughter, Dawn Elizabeth, suffered permanent brain damage from spinal meningitis, which Brasfield had failed to diagnose.

Pampered Pot Cultivated

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - For more than 100 marijuana research programs across the nation and overseas, their grass supply isn't from the neighborhood "dealer." Instead, it's grown with federal money on a heavily guarded plantation just outside this university town. This pampered, pedigree marijuana is from the University of Mississippi's five-acre farm, the country's only researchers at other universities including Columbia Tulane, Stanford and Berkeley because scientists desire a standard variety of marijauna that allows experiments at different locations to be compared.

Nixon Willing To Testify

WASHINGTON (AP) - Former President Richard M Nixon says he is willing to testify in the Senate intelligence committee's continuing investigation of spy agency activities, although he says he will reserve the right to claim executive privilege. A committee spokesman said Tuesday night that Nixon

has told the panel he will testify on all subjects within its jurisdiction, including such subjects as covert operations against foreign goverments and CIA domestic spying. "Nixon has decided he wants to testify," the spokesman said, adding that the former president is "reserving his right to claim privilege."

Kelley Won't Punish Agents

WASHINGTON (AP) - FBI Director Clarence M. Kelley says he probably won't punish agents involved in a harassment campaign against thousands of Americans if the Justice Department doesn't prosecute the agents. Kelley said in an interview Tuesday that he is not considering disciplinary action against the agents "in the absence of any direct allegations of involvement in something illegal."





Nuclear Agencies Are Necessities

An agreement to supply two nuclear reactors to Egypt for power plants may emerge as part of the U.S. aid package stemming from the Sinai agreements. Since the safeguards to prevent diversion of nuclear materials into weapons would be stricter than any the United States has demanded in the past, there should be no criticism that we are "escalating" the war potential in the

Yet this impending deal can only add to the uneasiness created by the burst of traffic in nuclear technology around the world. Paradoxically, the United States is seeing its own conversion to nuclear power bog down amid concerns over cost and safety factors while the rest of the world is stepping up its nuclear development.

Developing countries see nuclear power as the answer to the new high price for oil they now use to generate electricity. European countries see the export of nuclear technology as a way to offset their own high payments for Middle Eastern oil. This impetus to international trade could have its benefits in the long run, but there is a danger that it will break down the restraints and safeguards which members of the original nuclear "club" tried to attach to the spread of nuclear know-how.

Some countries acquiring nuclear reactors and fuel processing plants are not subscribers to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty, which would pledge them not to develop atomic weapons. France has been negotiating to export its technology to Argentina, South Korea, Pakistan and Taiwan. The Soviet Union is reported ready to provide a nuclear power plant to Libya, a country under the leadership of the unpredictable Muammar Khadaffi, and possibly to Cuba. The atomic device detonated by India last year used materials from a reactor supplied by Canada for

It is reported that Brazil decided to buy nuclear reactors and fuel-processing plants from West Germany because the restrictions attached by the Germans were less strict than those demanded by the United States. The nuclear exporters should be competing on the price and quality of what they offer - not by being more lenient on controls.

Last summer Secretary of State Henry Kissinger proposed that new international agencies be formed to cope with this nuclear boom — not just for safety's sake, but to prevent waste of uranium resources that are becoming scarce around the world. His concept of developing regional nuclear power centers would provide for more efficient use of those resources and simplify the problem of preventing diversion of materials into weapons production.


Nuclear power remains the most promising means at hand to produce electric power in an era of declining availability of fossil fuels at economical prices. In spite of all the benefit that can flow from the harnessed atom, it will be highly dangerous for the world if safeguards against reckless proliferation of nuclear technology are sacrificed to the interests of trade, diplomatic advantage and national prestige.

Common Cause, for one, has mounted what promises to be a multimillion dollar campaign figures in terms of money and volunteer man hours - to hold candidates feet to the fire. But this campaign will fail because it heads in

the wrong direction. It's based on the premise

that hard questions will expose a candidate's true aims and make possible an accurate prediction of what he will do once in office. Much of the emphasis is on more press conferences, more interviews, more questioning by panels - the questioning to be done by men and women not chosen by the candidate or his people. That is, the emphasis is on more talking

 and more promises. Now I submit that this is a candidate's dream. By the time a man is old enough to run for president, or for the Senate or House, he's pretty well set in his ways. Very few men change stripes. What they have done or not done in the lesser offices they've held is likely what they'll do or not do when elected to a higher post.

We need, therefore, more impartial studies in depth of the complete voting records of men who have been legislators, not selected votes intended to reinforce the bias of this polling organization or that.







sex therapy proceed? Cautiously, says W. Keith Daugherty, director of FSAA and himself a veteran marriage counselor. First step: a thorough examination by a physician to be sure no physical reason exists for their sexual problems. Next, they should seek the best possible advice on choosing a sex therapist — from a local medical society, a hospital with a sex clinic or one of the more than 300 FSAA local agencies around the country.

The FSAA also urges that state legislatures act quickly to license sex therapists with criteria based on rigid educational, experience and character requirements for anyone planning to practice. Says Daughterty: "We must not leave the sex lives of troubled people at the mercy of



Longwood To Sue

The City of Longwood is asking a circuit court to order Sanlando Utilities Corporation to reveal the names and addresses of all persons in Longwood that the utility sold water serviced to between Dec. 1, 1970 and May 1, 1975.

In a civil suit assigned to Circuit Judge Kenneth Leffler for trial, the city seeks an accounting and judgment against the utility firm of all utility tax funds the city is due under a atility tax ordinance passed in

The law calls for a 10-per-cent tax on water service in Longwood. The city alleges Sanlando Utilities sold water service during the 1970 to 1975 period without paying the city all taxes

The lawsuit alleges areas served by the firm include, but are not limited to, Devonshire, Winsor Manor, Winsor Manor First Addition, and The Moorngs subdivisions. No date has been set for a hearing in the lawsuit filed for the city by Sanford attorney

utility firm is believed to owe the city at least \$4,370.88.

Hanukkah Kindles Freedom The Herald Services

Hanukkah, the Festival o Lights, celebrates the victory of Judas Maccabee over the forces of the Syrian dictator Antiochus IV in 164 B.C. This year the eight-day celebration begins with the lighting of the Hanukkah candles on the evening of November 28.

It is worth noting that for most of its long history. Hanukkah has been considered a fairly minor holiday. As Mae Shafter Rockland writes in "The Hanukkah Book," (Schocken), "Simple, pleasant domestic customs grew up around it, varying from country to country of the Jewish exile. During the past century, and especially since

popular imagination." Although the kindling of the Hanukkah candles is a major feature of the celebration, Ms. Rockland explains that "this one universal ceremonial act has in fact nothing to do with the historical origins of Hanukkah."

"This is a lovely legend," Ms. Rockland says, "but by the time we have come to understand the struggle between Hellenism and Hebraism, with the ultimate victory of the Maccabees as the basis for the holiday, we know as we kindle the lianukkah lights that the miracle of the oil is a poetic substitution for the miracle of Jewish survival. 
