## Authorities seek Longwood area bank robber

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is seeking information that will lead to the arrest of the person responsible for a robbery this Monday afternoon at the Region's Bank, at 425 S. Highway 17-92, near Longwood.

The robbery occurred just before 2 p.m. The robbery suspect is described as a black male, about 5 feet 6 inches to 6 feet tall, wearing a light blue/gray jacket, and having a bandanna covering the lower portion of his face.

The suspect presented a black bag with a drawstring to the tellers and ordered them to put money inside. He implied that he had a gun. Nobody was hurt. He left the bank on foot, heading eastward toward the nearby Sun Shadow Apartments.

The suspect was given bait money with dye packs. According to the major crimes investigators assigned to the case, it appears the dye packs went off, which may have turned the money a reddish color, and could have stained the suspect's hands red.

# Gaming outfit bets on downtown

SANFORD — Opening any new business is a gamble, but Rosemarie Hall and her partners are wagering that an "adult video arcade" will hit the jackpot in downtown.

"This will pump some life into downtown," Hall said. "There's nothing down here."

Hall plans to install 50 video gaming machines in her business, Joker's Palace, at 207 Magnolia Avenue.

## But city questions 'adult arcade' that offers free food and drinks

Patrons will put money into the machines in hopes of winning tickets which can be redeemed for trips, merchandise and gift cards at stores like Wal-Mart and Albertson's.

"It's similar to the gambling boats except we don't give out cash," Hall said. "That's against the law. The peo-

ple who like the boats or like Bingo (they) like these games."

But Hall's business bet may not pay off. City officials have lots of questions about the business. Andrew Van Gaale from the city manager's office said administrators are reviewing the laws that regulate such busi-

ness. There is not a similar type of business in town, Van Gaale noted.

"I'm requesting more information about the nature of their business," said Andrew Van Gaale with the city manager's office. "I need to get a better understanding of what it is they want to do. I'd rather get everything addressed up front instead of waiting and then reacting to something down the road."

One of Van Gaale's concerns is

# Another go around for Civic Center

Sanford commissioners voted unanimously Monday night to place plans for a downtown conference center on hold for at least a year.

The decision comes after months of negotiations between the city of Sanford and the private developer, Suncor Properties, Inc. The most recent proposed plan involved a multi-level off-site hotel, renovations and additions to the existing Sanford Civic Center, retail space, an outdoor amphitheater and a surface parking area.

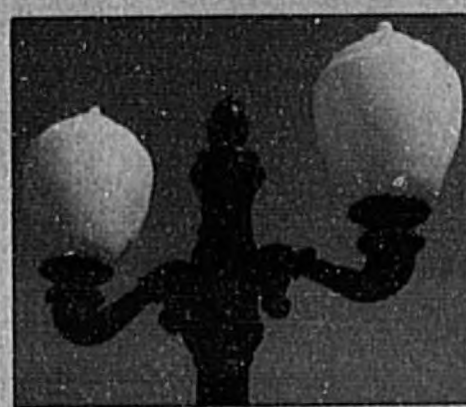
According to Sanford Mayor Brady Lessard, it was not the opportune time to bring this plan to fruition. Although the city could have financially handled the \$170 annually,

the Sanford Downtown Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), who was asked by Lessard to match the funds, would have struggled.

By waiting at least 12 months, the city will allow CRA revenues to increase and mature. The CRA and city staff could then make a more informed financial decision, basing their calculations on reality instead of assumptions of what the numbers could be.

Instead of the conference center, Lessard and commissioners directed city staff to focus its efforts on renovating and upgrading the city's existing

# LOVELY LIGHTS

Sanford Historic Trust begins installation of streetscape lighting

The city of Sanford and the Sanford Historic Trust have joined together to bring historic lighting to the city's downtown district.

Twelve lights — reminiscent of turn-of-the-century gas light posts with double hanging acorn globes — have been installed on Park Avenue between Fourth and Fourteenth streets.

The Trust has plans to install nine more lights on Park Avenue and 17 on Palmetto Avenue by this time next year.

"This is important for security in downtown Sanford," said Tony Daniels, a Historic Trust member. "It seems we are having another local crime spree. Lighting always reduces theft and it also improves the ambiance of the area."

As funds are made available, lights will also be installed on Magnolia, Oak, Myrtle and Elm avenues. Once the five-year project is complete, more than 200 historic posts will light up the downtown district.

# Georgetown's Mike Thomas returns from military duty

Dozens of friends and relatives greeted Sanford native Mike Thomas with open arms this past weekend for good reason: he returned safely home from a seven-month deployment in Iraq.

Thomas, a U.S. Army communications E6 staff sergeant based out of Fort Stewart in Hinesville, Ga., was welcomed home Saturday afternoon with a party at his parents home in Georgetown.

Thomas was assigned to an engineering unit during his Iraqi tour. His unit marched from the Kuwait border at the beginning of the war and ended up settling in Al Fallujah, a city just west of Baghdad. Thomas said he was stationed in the Iraqi

town during his final two months of deployment providing radio communications to engineers as they worked to restore water and electricity to the area.

"We moved into an old military compound there," he said. "It got us out of tents, which was good."

However, it was a job that often became repetitive, he said. For example, as military engineers would fix a transformer, a saboteur would blow the improvements up.

"There's just a few people there that don't want us there," he said.

Thomas endured a few narrow escapes during his deployment, including a SCUD alert as the military units assembled near the border and a mortar attack on the mayor's office in Al Fallujah just before he

# Iraqi Diary: The Middle East version of CSI

June 22, 2003 Last night I was sent to a grid to see if a dead body was there so I used my GPS [Global Positioning Satellite] connection which directed us up a highway. We soon realized that we had gone too far, so we did a U-turn and went back until we could pick up the exact grid. There I found the body of an Iraqi male, 30 to 40 years of age, shot in the back and hand, and dumped out.

I investigated and made out my report for headquarters. The body had both liver

mortis (pooling of blood in lower part of body) and rigor mortis still present (usually leaves the body after 10 hours through the extremities) I tentatively determined the individual had been dead for about five hours.

IPF was there and I explained via my translator to the Iraqi police that the subject appeared to be a victim of robbery, then killed and dropped off there. I noted that his pockets were turned inside out, no shoes on his feet, and there was one shoe near his body but the

other was missing (probably at the location he was killed where it fell off when they loaded him into their vehicle). They agreed which it was obvious that the above occurred.

Then we responded to a section where a guy who was "holed up" in his house with hand-grenades. We got there via a street under sporadic

gunfire. Lead was flying all over the place which soon cooled down once we rolled in. The people at the scene said the subject was no longer there but that his donkey was still parked there.

We were directed to a second location where he was thought to be, but upon arriving found ourselves in a small firefight. It ended and we went to see if

"Juan Valdez" minus his donkey was there. He wasn't so we left and called it a night about a little after midnight.

While we were at that second location I gave a little boy a bag of Skittles and an Iraqi fellow asked for a bag for his little boy, so I gave him one too. I wish I could do more for these kids but I at least I can make a few happy with candy or something.

We seem to be looking at either August or September

### Fire extinguished at Markham Woods church

Seminole County fire fighters from two stations responded Monday to a smoky Longwood area church on Markham Woods Road.

A small fire was reportedly extinguished before units arrived at about 1:30 p.m. However, the Markham Woods Church of Seventh-day Adventist was evacuated as smoke billowed throughout the structure.

According to Seminole County Operations Chief Chris Johnson, a fire started as a church staffer was testing a Coleman lantern in the lower level of the building in preparation for an upcoming camping trip. The staffer put the blaze out with a portable extinguisher. Because of the nature of the building that has large open spaces, few windows and multiple floors, fire fighters used fans in an effort to rid the structure of smoke.

Recently county fire fighters have been extremely busy with storm related calls, Johnson said. The church incident could be categorized as weather related as the church staffer was testing lanterns outside, but had to move inside as a storm rolled through Seminole County, he said.

civic center, located at 401 E. Seminole Blvd., in downtown Sanford.

The renovation project will cost at least \$800,000, and could reach upward of \$1.6 million.

"We have to use our assets to get people into downtown," said City Manager Al Grieshaber, Jr. "In order to make that happen we have to spend capital improvement dollars."

According to Lessard, the city and the CRA will discuss entering into a partnership to revitalize the current civic center.

A decision on the partnership, as well as an evaluation of the work to be completed on the center, should be made within the next few months. Atop the current priority list is a new roof and repairing acoustic problems.

"The improvements needed are extreme," said Lessard. "We can't just paint the building and call it quits."

After the renovations —

which Lessard hopes will allow the center to break even financially or possibly make a profit — the commission says the civic center will need to be heavily marketed.

"I believe the civic center is not in the condition to market," said Lessard. "I don't blame our staff for not filling the center with events. When you have to disclose that if it rains you have to put buckets out — it's a deterrent."

Although the plans to bring the civic center up-to-date are underway, Lessard is not ruling out the possibility of a conference center in the future.

According to Andrew Van Gaale, Sanford's community

development director, the city will revisit the idea of a conference center this time next year.

"We need to make sure the product is what we're looking for," he said.

According to Van Gaale, the city is not locked into

a deal with Bob Horian, president of Sunco Properties, Inc., the private developer who proposed the last conference center plan. The city would entertain other companies and "wouldn't want to turn others away."

"Everybody is excited about the program, especially since the first few have gone in," said Stephen Myers, chairman of the Sanford Historic Trust's Street Lighting Committee. "There is a great need for these lights."

According to Myers, the city of Sanford has provided the funds to purchase the 11-foot posts. The Trust's responsibility is to cover the cost of the ground installation and give \$300 toward the electrical installation. The Trust will also maintain the fixtures through its Street Lighting Committee.

The Trust is able to fund its portion of the project, estimated at \$70,000, through its fundraising efforts, including its annual Holiday Tour of Homes.

The homeowner is responsible for any fees above and beyond the \$300 for electrical installation and must pay for the electricity to power the posts, an estimated \$2 per month.

"The homeowners are enthusiastic because of the impact the lights will have on the neighborhoods," said Myers.

According to Daniels, the idea for the street light project came about a few years

ago when residents voted down a referendum that would have required the city

to install the lights and a power grid and residents to pay a monthly fee.

for redeployment. Great now this will be screwed over because I wrote about it and have again jinxed myself. I got an Iraqi helmet with all straps and camouflage net cover. It is in good shape. I disinfected it and cleaned it and am letting it air dry. I will put it in the duffle bag to take home. I do feel like Indiana Jones, except he had better living conditions than us.

We have perimeter tower duty this week, and the kids on the other side of the wall try to annoy us. Some will talk to us, but the mischievous ones throw rocks at us. We have fashioned sling shorts and took out ball bearings out of old machine parts to fire back at them. I knew living in a greasy machine shop would have an advantage.

It has gotten bad with these kids throwing rocks. Since Coe got hit in the face, and others in the arms and hands, we have pulled our guys out of Tower 2 and they sit in a HUMVEE. I saw one teenager climbing up on the wall out there and told him to get down. He didn't and I drew down on him with a 9mm (no magazine of course). He got down. The younger juveniles are always exposing themselves to our female MP's.

Well, I jinxed myself again. Just after I wrote we might leave in August or September, a new rumor came out, saying "We'll be here for a year or more." Another one of our soldiers was killed today, and four badly wounded.

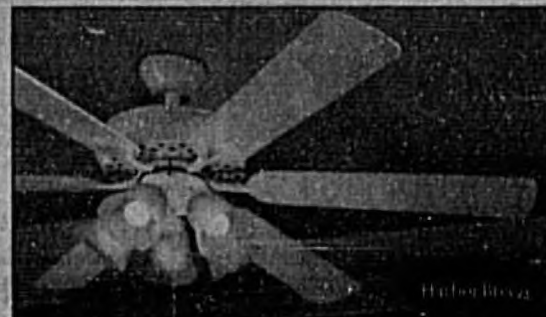

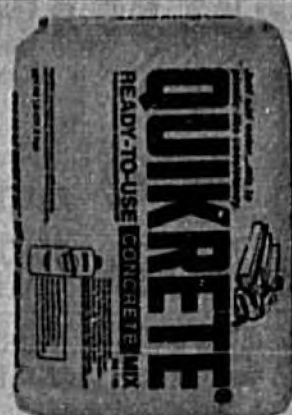

Hall's plans to serve alcohol. Like other gaming operations, Joker's Palace intends to offer complimentary finger food and drinks, including beer, to customers.

"We don't need a license because we're giving the drinks away," Hall said.

Regardless of whether the drinks are free, Van Gaale said "I'm not comfortable allowing a business to provide alcoholic drinks without an alcohol beverage license."

Van Gaale said he is also concerned whether Joker's Palace is a good fit for downtown.

"We want to make sure that the city's best interests are upheld," Van Gaale said.

Hall said she's unsure why the city would object to her business.

"I don't know why they're busting our balls," Hall said. She ran a similar business named Gold Dust in Deltona

and named three similar business that operate in Daytona.

An advertisement in the DeLand Beacon stated that there are about 30 gaming businesses in Florida similar to the Joker's Palace, five of which are in Volusia County.

According to Hall, the businesses are legal under what she referred to as the "S&H Green Stamp Redemption" law, and cited Florida Statute 849-161 as the governing rule.

The first section of 849-161 states that it is not illegal for "... an arcade amusement center having amusement games or machines ... which by application of skill may entitle the person playing or operating the game or machine to receive points or coupons which may be exchanged for merchandise only, excluding cash and alcoholic beverages, provided the cost value of the mer-

chandise or prize awarded in exchange for such points or coupons does not exceed 75 cents on any game played."

Hall said her business is no different than "Tilt," the arcade center in the Seminole Towne Mall next to the Food Court. Most of the games in Tilt are standard arcade fare - pinball and racer, shooter, fighter-games. The business does offer Skee-Ball, a bowling type game that awards tickets based on points scored. The tickets can be redeemed for "plastic toys and animals" Hall said.

Despite the city's questions, Hall intends to open at 10 a.m. Friday. And she plans to stay open until 1 a.m.

"The machines are coming Wednesday, and we've been working on fixing this place up for two weeks," Hall said. "We're going to be open."

UCF Athletics Director Steve Orsini has announced that head baseball coach Jay Bergman has agreed to a new five-year contract. Bergman, in

his 22nd year at UCF, is now under contract through the 2008 season.

Bergman has transformed the UCF baseball program into one of the nation's elite. ## Boaters need to be safe

As the traditional summer boating season winds down this Labor Day Weekend, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) reminds boaters to be safe on the state's waterways.

"We expect a busy weekend, particularly if the weather cooperates," said Joy Hill, public information coordinator for the FWC's Northeast Region. "Many recreational boaters will want to take advantage of the three-day weekend to get a little more boating in before the cooler temperatures arrive."

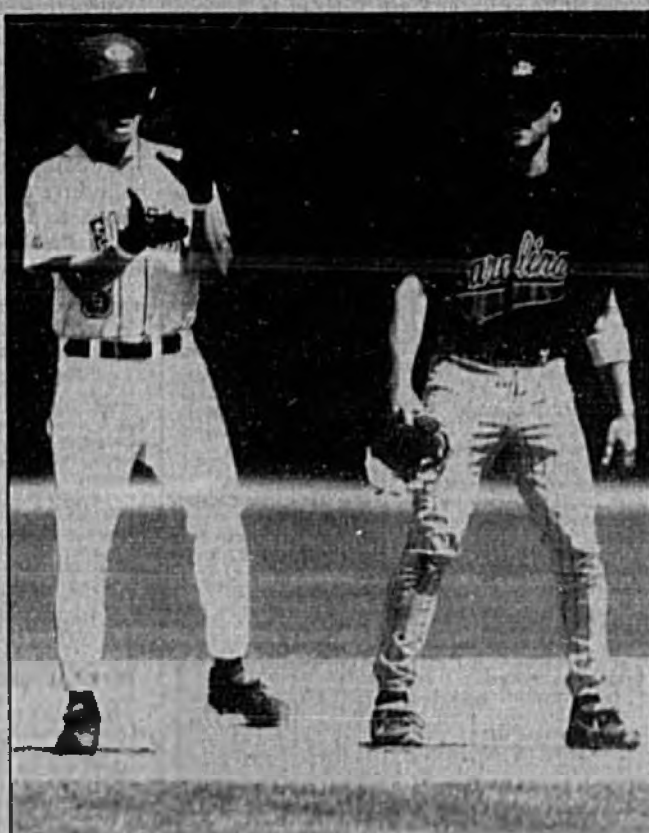
Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission law enforcement officers will be out in force from Friday through Monday on the region's most popular waterways to help ensure a safe boating weekend.

"Most accidents result from careless operation. That's something boaters can definitely affect by understanding and complying with boating rules and regulations, and by simply paying more attention while operating a vessel," said Hill.

Last year half of the people who died in boating accidents in Florida drowned. Simply wearing a life jacket could have prevented this.

The law states that there must be one properly-fitted, U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket for each person on board the vessel; and that children under the age of six must be wearing theirs.

"But sometimes simply having it on board is not enough. See Outdoors, Page 8

## Lytle storms into lead in SAL

If Chaz Lytle was in the recording industry he would be said to be No. 1 with a bullet.

The Lake Mary resident and Seminole High School graduate has been on fire with the bat of late, taking over the league-lead in batting in the South Atlantic League heading into the final week of the season.

Just a little over two weeks ago, the left-handed-hitting outfielder was batting .306 (87-for-284), good for No. 6 in the SAL, in 81 games with the Hickory Crawdads, a Class A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

But after going 27-for-59, a .458 clip, over his last 15 games, the former Sanford American Legion Post 53 star is batting .332 (114-for-343) and leads the league by seven points with seven games to play.

Barring a complete collapse, Lytle, the son of Charlie and Brenda Lytle of Lake Mary, figures to win the SAL batting title as his nearest competition, Hickory teammate Jorge Cortes, was hitting .325 before he was recently promoted.

His closest active competitor is Delwyn Young of South Georgia, who is batting .323.

Lytle has also scored 51 runs, driven in 34 runs, ripped nine doubles and three triples, walked 26 times and struck out only 37. He also has stolen 22 bases in 24 attempts.

But Lytle is far from the only local minor leaguer having a good season.

Former Lyman High School and Altamonte Little League star Mike Lyons has bounced back from a 31 month layoff and is now one of the top prospects in the St. Louis Cardinals organization.

The 28-year-old righthanded reliever is 3-4 with 31 saves and a 3.38 ERA for the Class AA Southern League Tennessee Travelers. He also has 63 strike outs in 53.1 innings.

Tim Raines Jr. continues his outstanding play for the AAA Ottawa Lynx (Orioles) of the International League, batting .299 (64-for-214) in 52 games with 37 runs scored, 23 RBI, 11 doubles, five triples, three home runs and 23 stolen bases in 32 attempts.

Clyde "C3" Williams is batting .235 with 14 home runs and 50 RBI for the Class A Brevard County Manatees (Expos) of the Florida State League.

Rickie Weeks has adapted quickly to professional baseball as he is batting .359 (14-for-39) in 12 games with the Class A Beloit Snappers (Brewers). He also has four doubles, a triple, a home run, scored eight runs and driven in 12.

One of his teammates is former Lake Mary Little League player, Prince Fielder, who is hitting .313 with 26 home runs and 108 RBI.

enough", said Hill. "FWC officers who perform safety checks on vessels often find them in compliance in the strict sense of the word, but many times the life jackets are not easily accessible. Instead, they are stowed in a compartment and require several steps to retrieve. In fact, sometimes they are still

neatly wrapped in the original plastic wrap from the manufacturer.

"In an emergency, there is usually no time to go digging around for a lifejacket, let alone unwrapping it and then trying to adjust it so it doesn't fall off in the water. Sinking boats usually go down fast, and people who have been ejected often end

up unconscious, so it's extremely important that people wear the lifejacket, or at the very least have it readily accessible.

"Many people complain that wearing a lifejacket is hot and cumbersome, but with the new U.S. Coast Guard-approved inflatable personal flotation devices (PFDs), that argument is no

longer valid." Drinking and operating a vessel is another cause of boating accidents, and FWC officers will be looking for and arresting boat operators who have had too much to drink.

"If someone plans to drink while boating, it's critical that they designate an operator. Boating under the influence is every bit as dangerous as driving under the influence, and it carries the same penalties," said Hill.

The FWC encourages any boater who witnesses fish or wildlife law violations, or encounters a boat operator suspected of being impaired, to report the violation to the FWC's toll-free Wildlife Alert Hotline at 1-888-404-FWCC (3922). Callers whose information leads to an arrest may be eligible for a reward.

Following are some tips to help your boat outing be safe and fun:

- Boating Safety Fact Sheet**
- Be weather wise. Know the weather before you begin your outing.
- Make sure your boat and motor are sound and in good working condition.
- Check all safety equipment, including U.S. Coast Guard-approved PFDs, fire extinguishers, sound-pro-

ducing devices and visual distress signals.

• Florida law requires children under 6 years old, and all people using personal watercraft or water skis, to wear PFDs.

• FWC boating safety experts say all boaters should wear PFDs and should consider purchasing the new U.S. Coast Guard-approved inflatable PFDs.

• File a float plan. Tell a responsible person where and when you are leaving, where you are going and your estimated time of return.

• Carry a cellular phone, and be sure your VHF radio is working properly.

• Don't overload your boat with people or equipment.

• Everyone 21 years old or younger is required to complete a Commission-approved boater education course to operate most boats. The FWC encourages all boaters to take a safe-boating course. Information on course availability is at [www.floridaconservation.org](http://www.floridaconservation.org).

• Alcohol is a major contributor to boating fatalities. Also, impaired boaters come off the water and often become impaired drivers, further endangering public safety. Don't drink and oper-

ate a boat or vehicle.

## MISSING BOATER LOCATED IN ST. JOHN'S

The body of the man missing since Thursday was recovered by the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Saturday at 10:45 a.m.

Charles Joseph Maddox, 32, from Jackson, Ga., was recovered at marker #53 on the west side of the St. John's River near Hontoon Marina.

According to Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) Lt. Bill Hightower, the body will be turned over to the Volusia County Coroner's office and an autopsy will be performed to determine cause of death.

Maddox reportedly left the Riviera Resort Marina in DeLand to go fishing in Lake Beresford around 2 p.m. Thursday. A group on a pontoon boat discovered Maddox's boat, a 17-foot Bass Tracker, at about 3 p.m., embedded in the grass and brush on the east bank of the river with its motor running.

FWC officers, deputies from the Volusia County Sheriff's Office and members of the Volusia County Beach Patrol have been conducting a search for Maddox since his boat was located.

The investigation into the accident is ongoing.

The UCF football team continued to prepare for its season-opener at No. 9 Virginia Tech with a simulated scrimmage at the Florida Citrus Bowl Saturday. The scrimmage featured 93 plays and lasted for 90 minutes.

"We needed to make sure the kids know the down, distances and situations both offensively and defensively for next weekend's game," said head coach Mike Kruczek. "We got what we needed to get done today to prepare for the season opener."

The scripted scrimmage featured the first and second teams going against the scout teams. Offensively, Ryan Schneider looked sharp as he has throughout preseason camp.

Former Lake Howell standout Brandon Marshall caught a touchdown pass while Alex Haynes scored a touchdown on the ground. With the scrimmage being non-contact and scripted, statistics were not recorded.

The team then finished preseason camp with practice No. 22 Sunday morning in.

"I thought practice went well," comment-

ed head coach Mike Kruczek. "The concentration and focus was very good."

Sunday's practice also marked the final practice before classes started Monday.

"I thought camp went well," added Kruczek. "It was a different camp in terms of how the NCAA changed the format of practice with two-a-days and he had to adjust. The kids did very well with everything and we are where we need to be with just four practices left."

UCF begins its 25th season of football in front of a national audience this coming Sunday (August 31) at 3 p.m. as the Golden Knights venture to Blacksburg, Va., to face No. 9/10 Virginia Tech. The ESPN telecast will mark the first of three games for UCF vs. BIG EAST competition in 2003.

The Golden Knights begin their Silver Anniversary season as members of the Mid-American Conference, after completing their first year in the conference in 2002. UCF finished second in the MAC East Division, ending the year 6-2 in conference play, with losses to only MAC East Division Champion Marshall (26-21) and MAC West Division Champion Toledo (27-24).

UCF ended the 2002 campaign 7-5 overall and winners of its last four games. Virginia Tech completed 2002 with a mark of 10-4, including a win over Air Force in the San Francisco Bowl. The Hokies are ranked No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and ninth in the Associated Press Top 25.

Therefore, the previous FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT (FONSI) remains valid. Thus, no Request for Release of Funds and Certification is required for HUD per 24 CFR 58.53.
