"What you'll be doing this morning is wing riding not wingwalking," says dapper air ace Joe C. Hughes. The words come from somewhere beneath his handlebar mustache.

This news does not dismay me. I will be more than satisfied merely to be strapped to a harness attached to the top wing of Hughes' Super Stearman biplane for a spin or two around the Sanford-Central The wingwalking will be performed by Hughes'

19-year-old assistant Donna Behrendt at the Central Florida Air Show at the airport Saturday and "I start out in the cockpit, and when we get up

there, I climb out on the wing and hang by my hands - stuff like that," she says cheerfully as she straps my feet to the wing and tightens a wide belt around

"This might feel a little tight now, but it'll loosen up a bit once you're in the air," she adds. In fact I can hardly breathe. I am wearing a tight-fitting leather helmet complete with goggles.

March Jobless Figures Show Dip From 7.5 To 7.3 Per Cent

WASHINGTON (AP) - The nation's unemployment rate dipped from 7.5 to 7.3 per cent in March as a half-million Americans found jobs and factories recalled workers from energy-spawned layoffs, the government said today.

Labor Department analysts said the improvement indicated that the ill effects of the severe winter weather and related energy shortages had only a temporary effect on the

The March jobless rate was at the same level as in January. It rose two-tenths of a per cent in February largely because of layoffs resulting from energy shortages.

Total employment increased by 513,000 ir March to 89.5 million, continuing an expansion that has totalled 1.7 million persons since last

Bureau Revamp Due In June

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Carter, armed with new powers to carry out a major campaign pledge to reorganize the federal bureaucracy, will not make his first move

until June, an aide says. Carter, who plans to sign the reorganization bill next Tuesday or Wednesday, will act first to propose a revamping of his own shop, the Executive Office of the President, deputy

press secretary Rex Granum said. The President wants to make the Executive Office a "model" for reorganization, Granum

The House voted 395 to 22 on Thursday to give Carter the authority he sought to reorganize federal agencies. The Senate then voted without dissent to send the measure to the White House for Carter's signature.

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) - Rock singer Elvis Presley's failure to keep a concert date at Louisiana State University brought howls of protest from a crowd estimated at more than

Presley was scheduled to begin his performance at 9:30 p.m. Thursday. At 10:10, after preliminary performances had been extended, it was announced that Presley could not perform due to "exhaustion" caused by stomach flu.

A spokesman said Presley was flying to his home in Memphis, Tenn., and would check into a hospital. Ticket money would be

Hanafi Leader Goes To Jail

WASHINGTON (AP) - Even as he held more than 100 people hostage, Hanafi Moslem leader Hamaas Abdul Khaalis was talking of a "fourth phase" of revenge, a federal prosecutor says.

Khaalis was termed a danger to the community and jailed Thursday after U.S. Atty. Earl J. Silbert told a judge the cryptic reference to a fourth phase "means to me he (Khaalis) will unleash some of his men, just as he unleashed them March 9, 10 and 11." Silbert said also that Khaalis was overheard Tuesday over a court-ordered wiretap, making "blood-curdling threats" that included the statement, "I'm going to kill somebody now they are going to pay . . . pay in blood . They can't do this to the Moslems."

Wood From 'Ark' Not Old Enough

WASHINGTON (AP) - If you're looking for Noah's Ark, keep looking. It's not on Mount Ararat. Scientists who tested some old wood found on the Turkish peak say it's not old enough.

University of California scientists say a pile of oak timber found 22 years ago on Ararat, near the Turkish-Soviet border, is about 1,200 years old. That's about 2,700 years too young to be Noah's Ark as indicated by Biblical

Speculation about the tooled wood has increased with recent filmed and written accounts suggesting it comes from the Biblical vessel. But scientists say the timber is

from a tree cut down around 700 A.D. Dr. Rainer Berger, a UCLA archeologist, said Thursday in an interview that new studies of the wood confirm earlier tests made in England and at UCLA in 1970. Those

tests were questioned by critics. Berger said the new tests were so thorough they should end any speculation that the wood is from the Ark.

Florida Child Neglect Law Struck Down By Court

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - The Florida Supreme Court has declared unconstitutional a law protecting children against negligent

The high court also struck down Thursday a law allowing landlords, through authorities, to seize property in payment of overdue rent. In a 6-1 opinion, the court overturned a state statute which made it a misdemeanor to illegally deprive children of food, clothing, shelter and medical treatment.

The court ruled that the statute was "unconstitutionally vague, indefinite and overbroad" because it failed to give guidelines on what constituted an offense.

Ad Calls For Lt. Governor

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Dale Parker, who is running for governor as an independent candidate, has hit upon a unique approach to finding a running mate. He's taking out newspaper ads.

The ads will run in four major cities and ask those interested in the \$36,000-a-year job to phone Parker. Parker last week became the sixth person to

officially enter the 1978 governor's race. He said his unusual search was part of his pledge to open up the governmental process. "It's a novel approach, but newspaper ads are used to fill all kinds of highly technical jobs, why not the lieutenant governor's position as well?" asked Parker, 51, who is a

MIAMI (AP) - A court challenge could delay a referendum on a Dade County ordinance banning discrimination against homosexuals, county election officials say. Circuit Judge Sam Silver issued an injunction Thursday barring prosecution of cases under the law which prohibits job and housing discrimination against homosexuals. The order also bans action on a referendum on

Silver scheduled arguments on the validity of the law April 8. The county commission had voted to hold a referendum on the law June 7.

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - The former state treasurer of the Republican party is scheduled to be tried on an Internal Revenue Service claim that he owes back taxes on \$45,000 he allegedly siphoned out of a campaign fund for former Sen. Edward Gurney. Federal officials said Thursday that George Anderson faced a civil trial June 27 in Tampa. The IRS alleges Anderson, a former Winter Park ComBank president and Gurney's 1968 campaign treasurer, and his wife owe \$18,771 in taxes and penalties on the money.





Rights Of Man Important To U.N.

President Carter has suggested that we take another look at some United Nations treaties on human rights that the United States has failed to

It is a good suggestion, considering the new emphasis that this country is properly giving to human rights issues in its foreign policy.

We should study the treaties carefully, however. There may be certain reservations that will have to be stated at the time the U.S. Senate ratifies the treaties, to make sure that it is clearly understood that our liberties under the U.S. Constitution are protected.

Mr. Carter mentioned four treaties in his U.N. talk and said he would seek ratification of these covenants:

- A convenant approved unanimously by the General Assembly on Dec. 16, 1966, covering economic, social and cultural rights. It deals with the right to work, Social Security benefits, medical care and education. It became effective March 3. 1976, without U.S. approval. It has never been submitted to the U.S. Senate for approval.

- A convenant approved unanimously by the General Assembly on the same day, covering civil and political rights. It contains provisions on freedom of speech and religion and protection from arbitrary arrest or detention. It became effective March 23, 1976, without U.S. approval. It has never been submitted to the U.S. Senate for approval.

- The genocide convention approved unanimously by the General Assembly on Dec. 9, 1948, condemming attempts to destroy racial, religious, political and other groups, entirely or in part. It became effective Jan. 12, 1951, without U.S. approval. It was submitted to the Senate by President Truman in 1949 and by President Nixon

n 1970 but has never been approved by the Senate. - The treaty for the elimination of all forms of racial discrimination, adopted unanimously by the General Assembly on Nov. 20, 1963. It became effective Jan. 4, 1969, without U.S. approval. It has

never been presented to the Senate for ratification. It can be argued that these treaties are meaningless because there is no means of enforcing them, except by pressure of world opinion. But that is a powerful pressure, and to the extent that this country stands for human rights, at home and abroad, such pressure is on our side.

Where these treaties seek to suppress "racist organizations," in the absence of violence, they conflict with our constitutional freedom of political expression and cannot be supported. But explicit reservations can be stated at the time of

The main trust of these treaties is in keeping ith our respect for human rights. Like the lelsinki treaty, they can only help us in our contest with the totalitarians of every stripe for the allegiance of free men and women on every con-

We must be bold in our condemnation of tyranny and our defense of human dignity, not only in our own land, but throughout the world.

One Of A Kind

General Sir Peter Hunt, Britain's retiring chief of the general staff, has made a gesture which we recommend. During his tenure as chief of staff, it was his unpleasant duty implement many economies and cutbacks in the British Army. These included the axing of a large number of officers. As a personal contribution to the battle against his country's economic crisis, he has decided voluntarily to renounce a field marshal's baton for himself, offered upon his retirement. Thus he sacrifices the considerable increase in retired pay that would

have accompanied the baton. This is probably the first time a British general has declined romotion to the highest of ranks. A jolly good gesture.

Who Should Prosecute On Korea?

WASHINGTON - Jimmy Carter may rue th day he decided to let the Justice Department continue its probe of alleged Korean influencebuying on Capitol Hill instead of turning the whole mess over to a special prosecutor.

The department is reportedly having difficulty coming up with the kind of hard evidence necessary to sustain indictments against present and former members of Congress who may have been on the take - and that could mean political trouble for Carter.

There are countless die-hard Nixon supporters just itching for an excuse to accuse the new Democratic team of partisan favoritism in the administration of justice. Murmurs of "cover-up" are already creeping

into newspaper columns and Republican conversations, and they are likely to mount if the Justice Department recommends anything milder than a public hanging for two-thirds of the Democrats in Congress. There is absolutely no evidence that the

Justice Department, which began its Korean probe while Republican Jerry Ford was President, has failed to pursue all available leads with vigor. But Carter's fellow Georgia Democrat, Atty.

There are still plenty of fish to be taken but more and more persistence, skill and a good deal of patience rather than luck are the tools of a successful angler. It has been estimated that 10 per cent of the fishermen catch 90 per cent of the fish.

If one is to be proficient in any endeavor, these same tools are essential. Just like an exceptional athlete there must be a program to sustain and maintain, both physically and mentally.







Casselberry: Glascock Asks, Fechtel Agrees To Intercede For Shevin Action

State Rep. Vince Fechtel (R-Leesburgh) agreed to intercede with Attorney General Robert Shevin, if necessary, to obtain an opinion on whether the majority of the Casselberry City Council hire a city manager.

Fechtel was asked for assistance in the matter by former Casselberry Council Chairman Charles Glascock after Glascock had a conference Friday morning with Assistant State Attorney petitions are presented to the city council at its 7:30 meeting

"I'll be pleased to," Fechtel said. Glascock said Dick advised him to seek the attorney general's Earlier in the week, Glascock said a resolution, adopted by the

city council last Monday night naming Mayor Gerald Christensen full-time chief executive with an annual salary of \$17,800 included powers and responsibilities almost identical to those of the city manager in the city manager ordinance. Glascock said the resolution appeared to be an attempt to

change the city's form of government and an attempt to amend an ordinance by resolution, something wholly improper. Glascock said only a document of equal dignity - an ordinance - can amend another ordinance. Section nine of the resolution states: "All resolutions and orfinances, or parts of resolutions and ordinances or policy

directives in conflict herewith are hereby repealed." City Attorney Kenneth McIntosh agreed that only an ordinance can amend an ordinance. He added, however, that adoption of the resolution naming Christensen city manager does not alter the city's form of government. McIntosh said the resolution as adopted is temporary in nature
