## Work Is Finished On Compromise OPA Bill

War Probe Group To See Why Adequate **Defenses Were Not** Built Before Raid WASHINGTON, July 22

(P)-The joint flouse and Senate Conterence Committee completed its task of writing a new OPA bill, and the legislation will be submitted to both branches of Congress tomorrow. The joint conference agreed that if OPA is revived, no price rentrols should be placel on meat, poultry, dairy products and other basic roods better Aug. 20.

Whether controls are to be re-stored at all on those items will be decided by a three-man board with higher authority than OPA. The compromise was signed by 11 of the 14 senators and representatives making up the joint committee. Those who refused to sign were Senator Eugens Milliken of Colorado and Representatives Jesse Wolcott of Michigan and Frederick Smith of

Ohio. All are Republicans. It's beginning to look as if Congress will have to remain in session longer than most mem-bers had anticipated. The thing that's likely to postpone their rummer vacation is the compro-mise hill to revive the OPA

Senate Majority Leader Albeo Barkley talked with President Truman about the OPA measure teday. After his visit to the White House Senator Barkley ad mitted that he sees no prospect of adjourning Congress the middle of next week at the very earliest. Previously the law makers had hoped to be on their

fore he makes up his mind whether er he'll sign it or resort again to the veto. The majority leader expressed hope that the Presidant will sign the Ol'A revival measure.
