The Irish Position

The Irish people are united in their desire for peace, but if either British or Germans attempt to take one foot of Free soil De Valera's army of 260,000 will fight to the last man to repel them, according to a signed statement by Genearl Frank Aiken, De Valera's right hand man, published recently in the American Magazine.

"I wish to make our position clear because there is an old friendship between the United States and Ireland," states General Aiken, who came to this country in an effort to obtain arms and ships for the defense of Irish neutrality. "Some 20,000,000 Americans are of Irish ancestry. In all eventualities we will defend our independence to the utmost of our power. Our people are united upon this policy and if we are attacked and overwhelmed we would go down together in good heart and with clear conscience, fighting for our own free democratic institutions and for the soil God gave us."

General Alken states that the British government made no mention of the need of Irish ports until four months after France fell. Then Prime Minister Churchill spoke of the "intolerable burden" which the lack of Irish ports placed on Britain. "Since then the chorus demanding Irish ports has risen," General Alken states. "Actually the strategic importance of these ports in the battle of the North Atlantic has been greatly exaggerated. For nearly a year the southern route around Ireland has been practically unusuable for shipping because of its proxi-




