That at least seems to be the opinion of some people ho are just now hearing about it for the first time as result of Elvira Garner's "Ezekiel" who conceived the oright idea of bringing it home in his wagon for a Christ-

From Miss Ella E. Dosweil of Tarboro, N. C. comes a ote today declaring that she has just read "Ezekiel" and the white fox whispers he hat in it is an account of a huge cypress tree-"171/2 feet n diameter, 48 feet in circumference, 125 feet high and 3,000 to 3,500 years old"-and she doesn't believe it.

"I taught school in Sanford about ten years ago," she writes, "and never heard of this tree, though I did quite a bit of sight seeing all over Florida. Will you be good enough to tell me if this is true, and just where the tree

well, believe it or not, with apologies to Ripley, there is a Big Tree. It is located in a swamp between Longwood and Lake Mary. Mrs. Garner had the dimensions exactly right, and scientists estimate its age at approximately 3,500 years. It is thought to be the oldest tree of its kind in the United States and possibly in the entire world. The Big Tree does not stand alone in this swamp but enjoys the company of quite a large group of other cypresses, at least two of them hig enough to rival the Big Tree in age if not quite in size. One of them has a diameter of 13 feet as compared with 17½ for the Big Tree.




