

TEW YORK-The other day we were talking about a tour of duty we took through Spansh Harlem on an ambulance one night.

Spanish Harlem is sometimes called lower Harlem; its borders are, roughly, 125th street and 90th atreet, and in between these edges are thousands upon thousands of transplanted Puerto

The Puerto Ricans live in railroad flats-amelly and airless clusters of rooms, with brightlypainted walls of red or pink contrasting sharply with the dreariness of dirt and poverty. It is hard to believe, but to them these solled

hothouses are luxury. I have never been to Puerto Rico and I am not a student of its affairs. However, the life that these poor souls leave behind, when they strap themselves into the bucket seats of those cattleboat planes that bring them to the States, must be miserable beyond imagination. It must be, if what

they have in Spanish Harlem is the good life to them.

It does not affect you so much to see the fat and of ones waddle through this squalor. It gives you pause to see the young men and girls, and the adolescents. However, the little children are the ones who just take your heart and tear it right up the middle.

They are dark and undersised and wide-eyed, and their legs and arms are skinny and rashy. They are countless-sleeping in tiny beds, four or five together, or crawling around on dirty kitchen floors, or sitting on doorway steps looking out on the foley and profese street scene.

I WAS THINKING OF THEM TODAY when I came across the story of Juan, a little 12-year-old who lived in Spanish Harlem for about a year. The rest of them are still there, and Juan got out, but the question is moot, as they say, whether ae got the break or the kids who stayed behind did.

came across him in a little town. He was hungry and he was lost. They were generous people and they took him into their family and for three years he was happy with them. Then, two years ago, they all climbed into one of the bucket-seat

Five years ago, a friendly but not wealthy Puerto Rican couple

planes and flew up to New York. There was only one place for them to go, of course. Their lack of money made them choose Spanish Harlem auto-

matically. If they had had money, landlords in New York have a habit of looking the other way or fiddling impatiently with the "No Vacancy" sign, if apartment applicants are not white and reasonably Anglo-Baxon.

For a little while Juan was happy—unsettled by the roar and flash of the city, but happy with his foster parents. Then the father died and almost simultaneously Juan was stricken with rheu-


I don't want this column to begin sounding like a pitch for all

However, they seem to have Juan straightened out a little up at Irvington House and I thought It was worth mentioning.

His heart is mending, and that is the big thing. Not only that; he is going to school at P. S. 408—a Manhattan school maintained at Irvington House for New York children—and he has learned

Woodworking has been fascinating him lately. When the spring comes, if it ever does, he will discover the remarkable things that a walk through the woods in the smalight will do for a heart that has been weighed down by the concrete jungle of New York.

Who gets the break—Juan, going to school, waiting patiently while his heart picks up the pieces, eating good food and living the happy life that is the just due of all kids... or the small ones back in Spanish Harlem, whose hearts are sound and solid but who must crawl over drunks in the dourways to go home at night?

It is only Juan's body that is in danger, after all. The others can lose their souls.
