Editorials **County Home In Need Of Attention Today**

Seminole County's "House on the Hill" is in need of immediate attention.

The "House on the Hill" in this case is the County Home. It houses some of this county's elderly citizens. Conditions at the Home are bad. Most Seminole residents are aware of the shortcomings, most of which could be solved with money.

· A reporter for The Herald paid an unannounced visit to the County Home. What she saw there was recorded in yesterday's issue of The Herald. It was not a pretty story. Conditions being what they are, it could not be pleasant.

The second of two articles about the Home appears in today's Herald. It is based, for the most part, on an interview with the officials at the Home.

Officials are attempting to do a good jub. But they have found, as have most others, that a dollar will stretch only so far. Officials were quite frank about the situation. They didn't try to hide the facts. Neither did they give the reporter "helpful hints" in an effort to impress the public with the urgency of the situation.

Mrs. Robert Coun saw tattered curtains, mayonnaise jars for water pitchers, mattresses too short for beds, cracks in the ceiling and many other evidences of wear and tear.

But, she also saw something else which impressed her. The Home was clean. The sitchen was bare, but clean. Against a backdrop of an ancient building, furniture and equipment, this cleanliness told the story of the challenge which workers at the Home have accepted.

The County Home was mentioned several times last fall during the campaign which preceded the county election. Each time, the speaker was "for" doing something to correct the situation.

Of course, the primary need is money. Where it will be found is another problem. It must be found, however, if Seminole County is to remedy a situation which borders on disgrace.
