(Continued from Page One) not irrevocably link the Peking government with the dispatch of Chinese military units.

The United States has maintained a steady course of doing everything to prevent the spread of the Korean war to involve the huge land armies of Red China.

Russia's foreign minister, Andrei Gromyko, replied on Secretary of State Acheson this afternoon and State Department officials listed it as a strictly courtesy visit.

Nationalist China was reported ready to fight side by side with Western powers if events in Korea led to a new world war.

The New York Times quoted Marshal Tito as saying in an interview that Yugoslavia will abide by United Nations decisions if the fighting in Korea ceases.

Times correspondent C. I. Sulzberger, in a dispatch from Belgrade, said he asked the Yugoslav premier last night what his country's stand would be should events in Korea result in hostilities between the United States and the Chinese Reds.

My attitude is, of course, the same as that of our delegation to the United Nations. If such a situation as you mention should develop, we would take a stand against any and all aggression.

It was still difficult to assess the Korean policy of Mao Tse-tung's government, not even the United States, he added, appeared to have any opinion on the matter.

It is in Moscow, Marshal Semion Budennyi called, that the Soviet people are the freest-loving people of the world.

British Prime Minister Attlee declares the "World Peace Congress" opening in Sheffield next Monday has been organized by Communists and fellow travelers...

The Premier made this statement at a Foreign Press Association dinner in London. Despite the gravity of the charge, he added that the Communists were welcome to "blow off steam"...

Speakers can damn anybody or anything to hades and back without getting a rise from Robert Butler. But let the ranter change his allegations to a call on the crowd for ACTION and the constable himself takes a hand.

That's the key for police intervention—unlawful action, not hot air. And that's the key word for official intervention in any such gathering as the "World Peace Congress."

In keeping with this idea of non-interference, the Manchester (Eng.) Guardian says "It is an odd thought that while the Sheffield Peace Congress has been filling the broadcast program of Russia and her satellites, the Prime Minister's speech was almost the first the British listening audience has heard of."

The second All-Union Conference of Soviet Peace Partisans closed in Moscow Oct. 28 by choosing a delegation of 65 which would seek visas to attend the projected Sheffield congress.

The delegation included some of the most distinguished Soviet citizens. Among them were the Metro-politan Nikolai of the Russian Orthodox Church, and Dmitri Shostakovich, the composer.

Mr. Attlee didn't indicate whether he had any of this delegation in mind when he said not all foreign delegates would be admitted to Britain. The day after the delegation was named, the British Council of Churches refused to be represented at the Congress, describing it as chiefly an instrument of Communist propaganda.

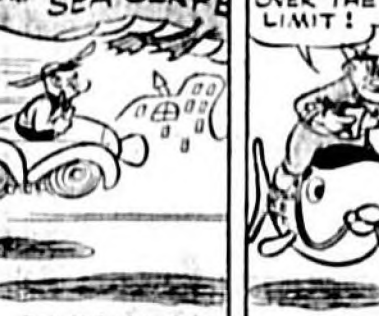

Helicopters Are Essential Aid To Blitzkrieg Tactics Of Modern War

WONSAN AIRFIELD, Korea—(AP)—The machine age has developed its own angel of mercy: the helicopter.

The awkward flying windmill has proven its worth in Korea. Time after time, Marine, Army and Navy helicopters have rescued pilots shot down behind enemy lines or at sea. They have taken out whole cut off units. They have carried wounded to safety; by ambulance over rough roads would have meant death.

The land is located in Santa Rosa county and was obtained by the State from the federal government in 1947 for use as a public park at a cost of \$100,000.

The private individuals paid taxes and made improvements on the land until 1933 when it again was deeded to the United States by the State of Florida.
