





#### Found Guilty

From Berlin comes the news, published first in The Sanford Herald, that Rev. Martin Niemoeller; the most prominent Protestant preacher in all Germany, has been found guilty and sentenced to jail for seven months as well as to pay a fine of \$600. Because he had already served eight months in jail before he was brought to bush subsect trial, he has been released, under observation of the secret police.

The Rev. Niemoeller was not charged with adultery or bigamy, or beating his wife, or with stealing church Hose the game, or blashing his wife, or with stealing church year funds, or malfeasance or misfeasance in office, or with murder, blackmail, or arson. In fact he was not charged with any of the crimes with which we are familiar in this country, not even with driving while drunk, or indecent exposure.

He was charged with speaking disrespectfully of Nazi leaders, and of using disparaging remarks in his pulpit against the political party which happens to be in power in Germany. It is the same as if in this country a few years ago some minister had said that the Republican party was the instrument of the money-changers, or more recently that President Roosevelt was a parlor pink.

But what is equally as important to us, as believers in Democracy, is that this outstanding Protestant minister, who made an enviable record for courage and loyalty to Germany during the World War as a submarine command-er, not only is denied the right to say what he honestly believes of the direction in which Hitler's pagan creed is leading his country, but also is not allowed a fair trial on his guilt or innocence under the charges.






