## Church Duty Emphasized By Pontiff

ROME (UPI)—Pope Paul VI told the Ecumenical Council today his historic pilgrimage to the United Nations had increased the responsibility of the Roman Catholic Church to the cause of world peace.

The 68-year-old pontiff returned today from New York with words of praise for UN leaders "and all the people of the United States of America."

He was visibly tired but instead of resting he drove immediately to St. Peter's Basilica to report to the more than 2,000 council fathers who are debating the church's relationship to the modern world.

"In the name of Christ, we preached peace to them," the Pope said. "You know that this announcement implies great duties . . . ."

"The church has assumed a greater obligation to the cause of peace. It is certain that our task is to enter the fields of politics and economics where civil peace is built, and that we must help in its construction through moral support and working charity—also material charity."

The Pope left New York late Monday night at the end of a 14-hour schedule that included dramatic speeches at the Commission, and in the United Nations General Assembly, a private meeting with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission, and in the Florida Directory Publishers association award for outstanding community service. This is the first award presented in Seminole County by this group, publishers of the North Orlando directory now being put together.

B-52 bombers from Guam blasted "War Zone C" again today in a pre-dawn raid aimed at disrupting the tunnel headquarters of the Viet Cong.

## 81 Africans Die In Train Wreck

DURBAN, South Africa (UPI)—Rescue workers toiled through the night to free survivors from the twisted wreckage of a derailed world train in which at least 81 Africans were killed and 150 injured.

Frantically survivors killed one white railroadman and wounded another in confusion of rescue operations.

The derailed was described as the most railroad disaster in South African history. Three cars of the packed train left the rails at 6 p.m. Monday but the accident went unreported for more than three hours.

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (UPI)—Pope Paul VI left a legacy of his humanitarian mission to the United Nations to world leaders before the pope's greatest diplomatic forum implied those who heard him and vastly enhanced the UN's global posture.

Even Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko, a tough, ubiquitous diplomatic veteran, apparently was moved by the pontiff's 25-minute speech to the General Assembly Monday.

A leading Western diplomat quoted Gromyko as saying it was "the best of the most important statements ever made before the United Nations in its entire 20 years."

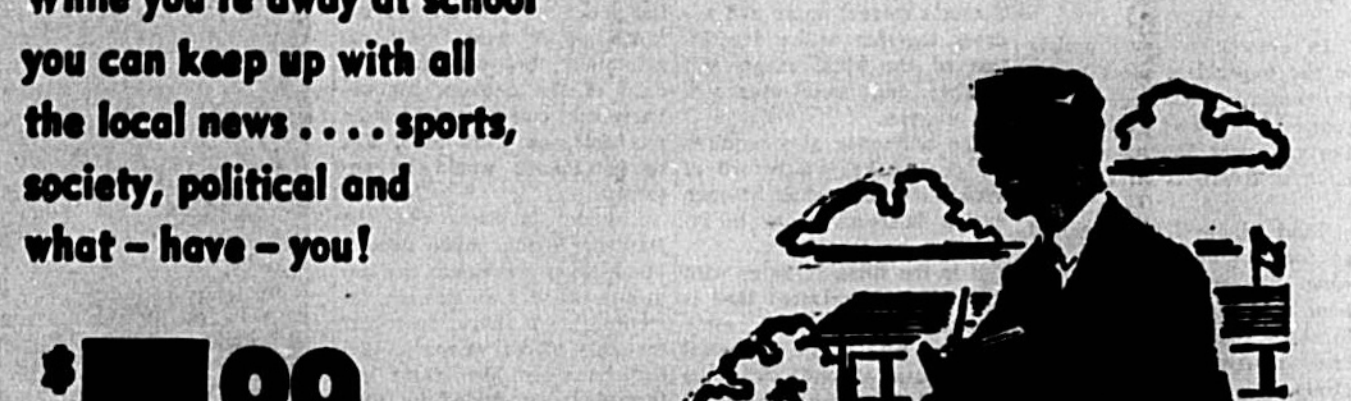

Many groups and agencies co-operate with the district in helping landowners develop and apply soil and water conservation plans on farm and ranch land.

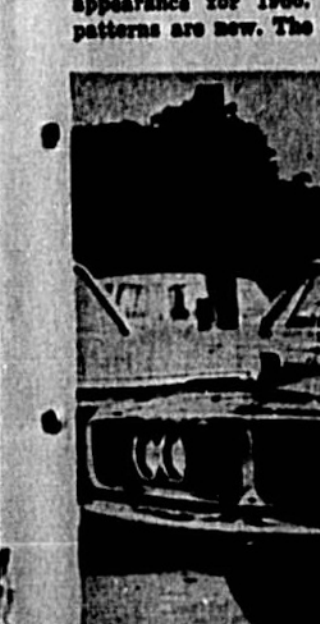

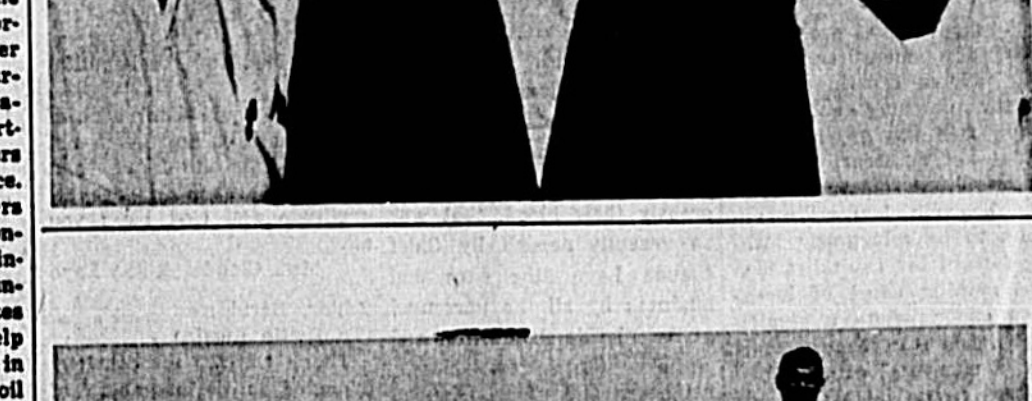
