Airport meets baggage deadline

Dale says all luggage will be screened for explosive materials

SANFORD — Officials with the Orlando Sanford International Airport announced last week that they will meet the Dec. 31 deadline to screen all checked baggage for explosives.

Congress approved in November 2001 the Aviation and Transportation Security Act, which created the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) to handle aviation security and imposed a deadline requiring airports to screen all checked baggage.

Many of the country's major airports are

struggling to meet the deadline because the Explosives Detection Systems (EDS) required for screening are large — about the size of a minivan — necessitating renovation of baggage systems and facilities.

"Some airports will have to get extensions. We won't," said Larry Dale, president and CEO of Sanford Airport Authority. "We are in a position to screen 100 percent of the checked luggage coming into Orlando Sanford International Airport."

Meeting the deadline was not easy, Dale said. Early on Dale and airport officials were at odds with the TSA over OSIA's classification. The Federal Aviation Administration categorized the airport as serving less than 250,000 passengers a year. Last year OSIA served nearly six times that many people.

"If I had any hair to pull out, I'd be as bald as I am now," Dale said. "It's a testament to our whole staff that we met the deadline, particularly Jack Dow. He's been working

more than 20 hours a day for the last several weeks."

Federal security guidelines restrict Dale from releasing what procedures or equipment is being used to meet the new screening standards. In general, the TSA is using a combination of EDSs and Explosives Trace Detection (ETD) devices to check all luggage for explosives.

Utilizing technology similar to a CAT Scan, EDSs use probing radiation to take fundamental measurements of materials in bags to automatically recognize the characteristic signatures of threat explosives. EDSs

"What an outstanding accomplishment for our County Finance Department," said Seminole County Clerk of the Circuit Court, Maryanne Mome. "Achieving this award for the 20th consecutive year is quite an honor. I am very pleased and extremely proud of my staff. Their effort and hard work are the reasons why we continue to receive this prestigious award year after year."

Included in the annual financial report are statements of revenues and expenditures, balance sheets and an independent audit opinion of all funds managed by

Hazardous materials team responds to oil leak

SANFORD — Following an anonymous tip, members of the Sanford Fire Department, Seminole County Hazardous Waste Department and Code Enforcement, converged on Joe's Garage at 13th Street and Olive Avenue in Sanford on Friday, Dec. 13.

Fire Inspector Tim Robles said he and other inspectors were able to establish that the building was unsafe, and in eminent danger. There was also an electrical deficiency uncovered. As a result, the occupants of the building were ordered out of the structure.

Further investigation showed that there were oil drums leaking outside the building. The

Resisting Arrest

On Thursday, Dec. 19, Altamonte Springs Master Police Officer Darin Farber was operating his marked police motorcycle on Douglas Avenue. He observed a gray pick-up truck traveling south on Douglas at a speed appearing to be higher than the posted speed limit.

The vehicle sped into a parking lot where the driver appeared to temporarily lose control. The truck came to an abrupt stop when it hit a curb. The driver entered the business.

Farber turned around and made contact with the vehicle. He called the vehicle information in and was advised the tag was expired. The driver, who was later identified as Alan W. Davis, 47, emerged from the business and waved for Farber to come to his location. When Farber arrived, Davis began to verbally attack him.

Farber made several attempts to calm Davis down with no results.



Davis refused several times to produce any identification. Davis then turned and began to walk toward his truck, ignoring Farber's verbal commands to stop. Farber made one more attempt to obtain Davis' identification, with no result. Davis was taken into custody and transported to the Altamonte Springs Police Department for booking. He was charged with resisting arrest without violence and issued traffic citations appropriate for the violations observed.

Traffic Fatality

At 12:14 p.m. Dec. 20, the Winter Springs Police Department responded to a traffic accident at the intersection of State Road 434 and Timberlane Trail involving a Seminole County School Bus and two pedestrians.

The school bus had three students that were not injured on board at the time of the accident. The school bus was turning east onto SR 434 from Timberlane and struck the pedestrians.

One of the pedestrians, a 70-year-old woman, was fatally injured at the scene.

The other pedestrian was a 38-year-old female who was taken to ORMC in stable condition.

The two pedestrians were mother and daughter visiting from Costa Rica for the holidays.

There are no charges pending and the investigation is continuing.

Thanksgiving safety belt enforcement nets 23,000 citations

The Thanksgiving Safety Belt Enforcement Wave ended with nearly 23,000 citations issued across the state for adults and children who were not buckled up.

However, the nine-day period also saw results that may not be expected during a safety belt concentration.

More than 300 stolen vehicles were recovered, nearly 800 fugitives were apprehended and about 1,600 impaired drivers were arrested during the safety belt crackdown.

The secondary effect of catching criminals during a safety belt enforcement wave is a welcome outcome, according to Al Roop, program director for Buckle Up Florida.

"The focus of our program is to save lives by getting more people buckled up," Roop said. "Of course, we know that 'ordinary' traffic stops can lead to finding much more than just the original offense. We are proud of the officers who take the time to protect motorists and reduce crimes in the process."

A total of 318 city, county and state law enforcement agencies participated in the statewide enforcement wave, which was held from Nov. 23 to Dec. 1.

Ticket totals were: 23,855 safety belt citations, 915 child safety seat citations, 32,713 speeding citations, 1,056 reckless driving citations, 1,610 DUI arrests, 795 fugitives apprehended and 342 stolen vehicles recovered.

As the Christmas and New Year's holiday period approaches, Florida's law enforcement agencies will turn their attention largely to impaired drivers. The number of fatalities in the state attributed to driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol has continually increased in recent years, climbing from 936 in 1999 to 1,000 fatalities in 2001.

In a joint effort, officers from across the state will conduct wolf packs, sobriety checkpoints and other special enforcement activities to apprehend impaired drivers. The campaign is called "You Drink and Drive, You Lose."

All law enforcement agencies are planning DUI (Driving Under the Influence) checkpoints and saturation patrols, and are scheduling more officers to work evening shifts as part of the effort to identify and arrest impaired drivers.

Individual police departments will

also be involved in the crackdown. "Many people choose to celebrate the holidays with alcohol," said Oviedo Police Chief Dennis Peterson, "but when they choose to drive after drinking they are likely to kill or injure others."

Peterson urged people who plan to drink to make arrangements ahead of time for a designated driver.

AAA headquarters in Tampa is estimating 3.7 million Floridians are expected to be traveling at some time during the Christmas/New Year's holiday. Of this number, 2.8 million will be traveling by car, the remainder by plane.

Kevin Bakewell, senior vice president of AAA Auto Club South indicated the number of drivers is down one percent from last year, attributing the decline to the fact that the holidays fall in the middle of the week.

The Florida Department of Transportation reminds us that there were 24 alcohol-related traffic deaths in Florida during the Christmas and New Year's holiday period last year. Another 583 persons were injured as the result of alcohol-related crashes.

ETDs work by collecting samples and detecting vapors and residues of explosives. The human operators collect samples by using swabs to rub different areas of the bags. Swabs are then dropped into chemical analyzers that separate and identify any threat explosives present in less than 10 seconds. ETDs cost about \$40,000 each.

The effectiveness of ETD is determined by the effectiveness of the human operator in collecting the sample.
The screening devices are not expected to cause delays, Dale said. The EDS machines are built in-line, meaning baggage travels through the machine on a conveyor as part of the airport's overall baggage handling system.

"This is an efficient system," Dale said. "The airlines are pleased with the improvements we have made because it increases security and won't cause them any delays."

Tenants capitalizing on soft real estate market

With commercial vacancy rates in Central Florida high and showing no signs of improving any time soon, now is a great time to be a tenant.

That is the observation of tenant and business owner Paul A. Whiting of Creative Office Environments in Altamonte Springs who says the lean times mean "greater opportunities across the board for commercial real estate tenants."

"Today's commercial real estate tenants have more leverage than at any time in the last five to 10 years and they are using that leverage to their advantage," says Whiting, whose 13-year-old company specializes in the moving and installation of office furniture and workstations for company's throughout the state.

Whiting says office occupants are aggressively renegotiating their lease renewals - even beyond their lease expiration dates - in order to get the best deals from their landlords like new paint, carpeting and shorter lease periods.

"Face it, this is now a tenant's market," Whiting adds. "They hold the cards in a game of commercial poker and they know it. In many cases a tenant will stay but only after the landlord agrees to sweeten the pot," Whiting adds. "It's not a bluff. It's good business."

The higher vacancy rates coupled with record low mortgage interest rates also have fueled a buying blitz by tenants, according to Whiting who says it cheaper to own than it is to rent.

"Interest rates are so low right now that commercial property is a great buy," Whiting notes. "It makes far better business sense to take your rental dollars and have it build equity in building ownership."

He cites his own situation as a perfect illustration. Whiting is leasing a little more than 10,000 square feet in the Josiane Industrial Park off C.R. 427 in Altamonte Springs. His \$5,400 monthly rent would

easily support a comparable facility and a \$600,000 mortgage.

"And, yes, we are looking," he admits. And while there is an upside to the current market climate, there is also a downside that is having an impact on Whiting's company. Demand for new office furniture is way down, and, as a result Steelcase, Hon and other high volume manufacturers have scaled back production.

"The market is flooded with used high quality furniture and work stations," he says. "Values are about 10 cents on the dollar. Until that used inventory is absorbed (12-24 months), demand for new furniture will continue to be low."

Dalmatian, Gucci, offered her cell phone to House and the two immediately contacted the number on Sweetie's rabies tag.

"A rabies tag is like life insurance for your pet," said Rachel Bennett of the Seminole County Humane Society. "If the pet is wearing the tag whoever finds it can make contact with the owner or the vet."

From the tag, House was able to track down Sweetie's veterinarian in North Carolina. Reluctant to release Guccio's personal information, he offered the number of a local veterinarian he had recently faxed Sweetie's medical records to. That veterinarian gave House the number listed for Guccio, which turned out to be a friend she had wintered with. The friend gave House Guccio's cell phone number.

"I had several people say, 'Take her to the Humane Society,'" explained House, who owns a formerly abused Border Collie named Daisy. "Not that they don't do a good job, because they do, but I didn't want to call them. I've lost a dog before, and I just didn't want anybody to go through what I did — I felt so afraid for the dog. You just don't know what happened to it — if it's being taken care of or if it died."

"I wanted to do my part as much as I could," she added. "If I had hit a dead end I was willing to keep the dog until I could find its owner or a good home. I just felt so happy to be a part of reuniting them. Thank goodness for Annie and her cell phone. This is such a pet-oriented community and everyone treats pets like they are their children. I wouldn't do any less for a lost child."

Thanks to the good Samaritan efforts of House and Jones, two hours after the ordeal began, Guccio and Sweetie were reunited.

"Thank goodness for Kim," said Guccio. "Otherwise I may never have found Sweetie. Because she was Sweetie's guardian angel, this ordeal had a happy ending."

According to Seminole County Animal Services, many lost animals are not as fortunate. In the 12 month period ranging from Oct. 1, 2001 until Sept. 30, 2002, nearly 14,000 lost or abandoned animals were brought to Animal Services. Of those animals, 6,634 were dogs and cats.

"We don't keep records of how many come in with tags, but I can tell you it's a very small percentage," said Mike Wittmer, manager of Seminole County Animal Services in Sanford. "When they have tags we have a very good chance of reuniting them with their owners, but when they don't it's almost impossible."

If a dog or cat brought in to Animal Services is wearing a tag, their vet is called to obtain the owner's contact information. An Animal Service employee then calls the owner. If they can not reach them by phone, a certified letter is sent to their address stating that the animal was found and how to retrieve it.

"If the animal isn't wearing a tag, none of this can happen," said Wittmer. "The most common excuse is that the animal was just given a bath and the collar is sitting on the counter. If we can

stress anything, it's to replace the animal's collar and tag as soon as the bath is complete."

Appropriate tags for cats and dogs are the ones purchased from a pet store engraved with the owner's contact information as well as a rabies tag from your local veterinarian and a registration tag from the county.

Another option to keep your pet safe is to have a microchip

implanted. Many local veterinarians perform this outpatient procedure in which the permanent identification system is implanted under the dog's skin and can be read by a scanner. The tiny transponder, the size of a grain of uncooked rice, is inserted below the animal's skin under the base of the neck between the shoulder blades.

"It's a good thing to do if you

have a need to track an animal," said Wittmer. "Most shelters have the capability to scan the chip and track the dog back to the owner."

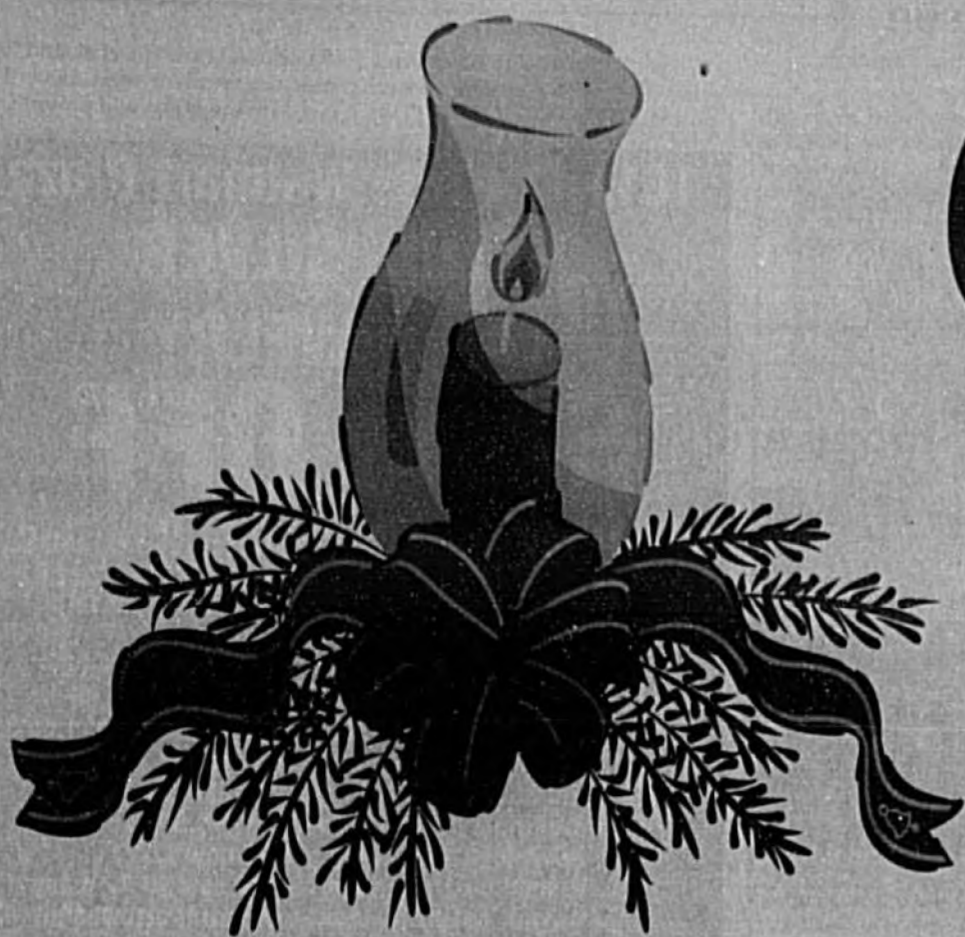

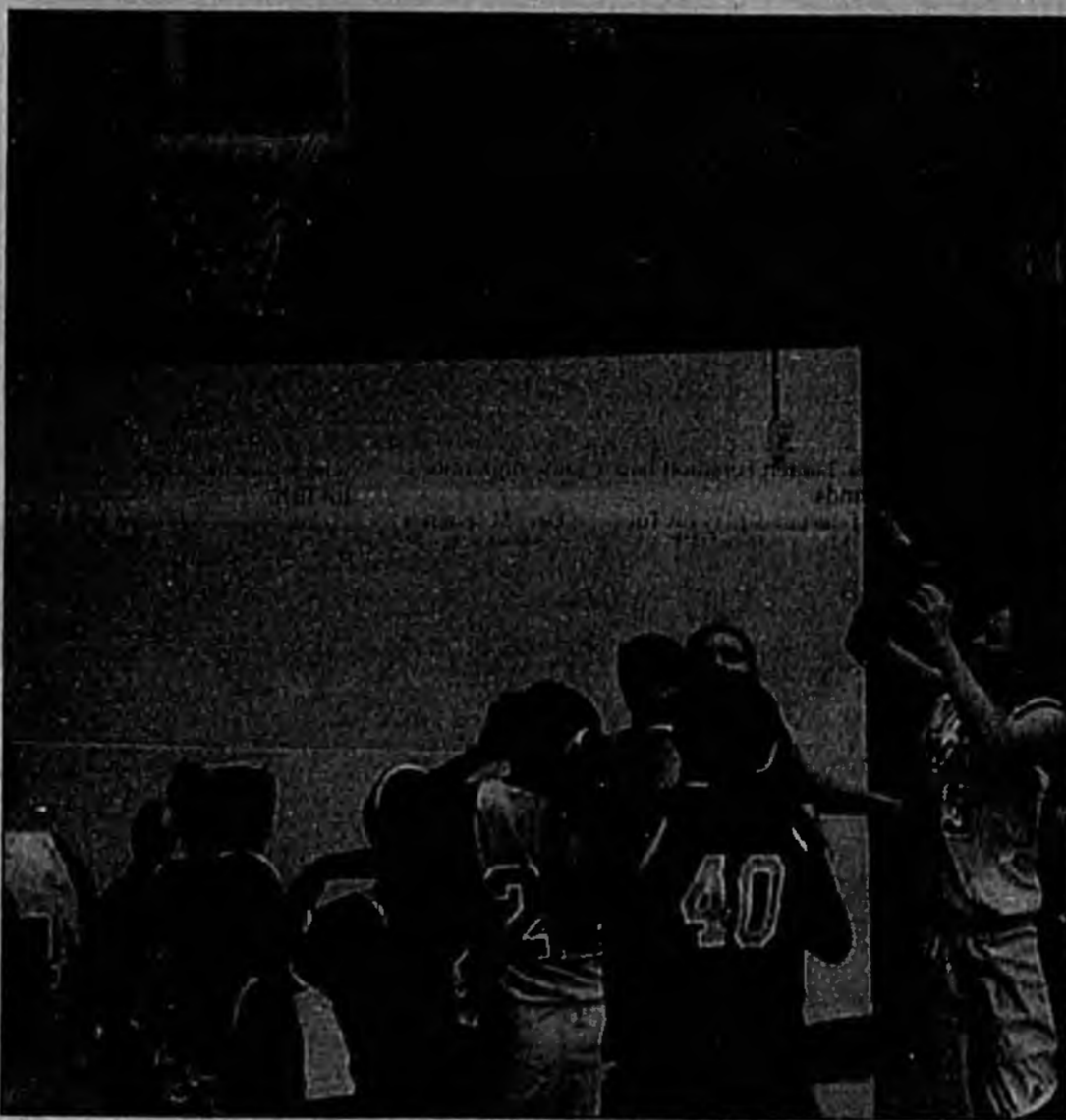

Catch and release in effect for Lake Toho

OCALA — If you catch a largemouth bass in Osceola County's Lake Tohopekaliga during the next eight months, you're going to have to let it go.

The reason? The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) wants to protect the popular sportfish from over fishing during the extreme draw down and habitat enhancement project scheduled for this spring.

Beginning Jan. 6 and extending through Aug. 31, 2003, anyone catching a largemouth bass in Lake Toho is required by FWC executive order to release it immediately back into the lake. In addition, during this time period anglers will not be allowed to possess or transport largemouth bass in Lake Tohopekaliga.

The lake boundary is considered to run east to west from the Old Tampa Highway Bridge over Shingle Creek to the South Florida Water Management District's

(SFWMD) water control structure in East Lake Canal (S-59). The southern boundary of Lake Tohopekaliga is the SFWMD's water control structure (S-61) and boat lock at Southport.

Only largemouth bass are affected by this temporary regulation. Current state-wide regulations for all other sport fish species remain in effect. This includes redear sunfish (shellcrackers), bluegill, and black crappie (specks). The current regulation is a 50-

UCF men halt rally of Eagles

ORLANDO — Ed Dotson came up one rebound shy of his second double-double of the season, scoring 19 points and grabbing nine boards and UCF (7-3) was able to hold off a late rally by Florida Gulf Coast (7-6) to post a 68-63 victory at UCF Arena Saturday afternoon.

Dotson, who scored 11 points in the first half, helped the Golden Knights overcome a sluggish first half in which UCF shot just 29 percent from the floor. He also chipped in five rebounds by the end of the first stanza. Neither team found a much of a rhythm offensively in the first half as they combined for 23 turnovers and hit just five three-point shots between them. Led by Dotson, UCF carried a six-point lead into halftime at 27-21.

The Golden Knights started the second half by going on a 12-4 run, with both Dotson and Roberto Morentin scoring four points each during the spurt.

Florida Gulf Coast, behind the hot shooting of Ryan Hopkins, was able to keep within striking distance and narrowed the gap to seven at 45-38 with 10:22 remaining in the game. UCF was able to double its lead with just under eight minutes remaining after a lay-up by Dotson made the score 54-40. The Golden Knights appeared as though they were ready to put things away after Dexter Lyons dunk gave UCF its largest lead of the game at 56-40.

The Eagles continued to chip away as Hopkins would hit three of his game-high seven three pointers inside the four-minute mark. Hopkins final three of the game with 40 seconds remaining brought the Eagles to within five at 66-61. After staking its largest lead of the game at the 7:07 mark, UCF was held to one field goal for the remainder of the game, but hit 10 of 16 free-throw attempts to dash any comeback hopes by Florida Gulf Coast.

Al Miller joined Dotson in double-digit scoring netting 10 and also dished out five assists. Dotson's nine boards led the Knights. UCF finished the game hitting 40 percent from the floor on 22-of-54 shooting, but hit a season low three shots from behind the arc.

Hopkins led the Eagles in scoring with 26, while Bryan Crisp rounded out the double-digit scorers with 10. Roman Brown had 11 rebounds to lead

Doceide Warren scored 15 points, including a perfect 3-for-3 from three-point range, as the No. 14 ranked Mississippi State women's basketball team steamrolled UCF, 81-30, in the final game of the UCF Holiday Classic on Friday evening at UCF Arena.

Both squads got off to a slow start as the scoreboard read a 4-4 tie at 16:18 of the first half. A basket by MSU's Seneca Anderson at 15:07 jump-started a 16-4 run that included the three treys by Warren. Taking advantage of their 66.7% accuracy from outside the arc (6-for-9) and a seven-minute scoring drought by the Golden Knights (4-5), the Lady Bulldogs (8-1) took a 39-17 advantage at the half.

Freshman guard Shayla Smith hit the first shot of the second half before Mississippi State went on a 26-0 run. Freshman Shelby Weber was the first Golden Knight to hit a basket in over 12 minutes when she sank the second of two foul shots at 7:38. At 2:33, freshman guard LaShay King sank UCF's second field goal of the game - the first in 17 minutes - followed by a three-pointer by freshman forward Celeste Hudson to cut the lead to 72-28.

LaToya Thomas added 13 points for MSU, while Tan White and Seneca Anderson each had 12 points.

Sophomore center Takira Allen was the Golden Knights leading scorer with eight points.

Mississippi State outplayed UCF in every aspect of the game. The Lady Bulldogs shot 54% from the field, while the Golden Knights hit only 23.5%. Rebounds were 45-27 in favor of MSU.

In the early game, Nicole Anaejonu and Sara Crum each recorded double-doubles as the University of Detroit Mercy (2-6) defeated Bethune-Cookman, 76-61. The Wildcats (4-5) went on 16-8 run to earn a 30-22 advantage at the 7:08 mark. Despite Detroit's attempts at a comeback, the Wildcats opened a 40-36 lead at the intermission.

Continued from page 10 fish bag limit for panfish species (bluegill and redear sunfish), and a 25-fish bag limit for black crappie.

The reason we have included only largemouth bass in this temporary restriction is that historically anglers have targeted them more heavily during drawdowns than they have panfish, whose numbers generally remain abundant," said FWC fisheries biologist Marty Mann.

The goal of the drawdown and enhancement project is to improve fish and wildlife habitat by removing muck and undesirable plant communities - namely cattail, pickerelweed and tussocks - and returning to the lake a hard, sand bottom. This type of bottom is what fish need to spawn and what desirable plants need to take root, which provide cover and food for fish.

Unfortunately, when lake levels are stabilized for flood control and not allowed to fluctuate, the lake bottom never gets a

chance to dry out. As a result, plant and other organic materials decompose and create a thick layer of muck that prevents spawning and allows poor plant communities to become established.

To help reverse this, the FWC does periodic drawdowns, which are extended periods during which the lake levels are lowered to expose the area near the shoreline, and allow it to dry out. At the same time, contractors remove the muck using heavy equipment, and then plant the beneficial vegetation the fish and wildlife need.

"This lake will be a phenomenal place to fish this spring. But we want to protect our wonderful largemouth bass fishery and ensure its presence for years to come," said Mann. "So, grab your fishing tackle and get to Lake Tohopekaliga this spring, but remember to recycle your largemouth bass."

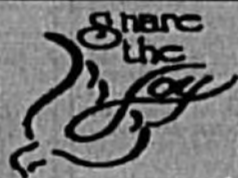
