

#### **Exploiting The South**

The National Emergency Council paints such a distressing picture of our beloved. Southland that the Wonder is irrepressible why anyone ever remains here at all. As a matter of fact, the Council insists that hardly anyone does stay here except children and old folks who are non-productive and that most of them are anaemic and have hookworm.

Average bank deposits in the South are \$150 per peron as compared with \$471 for the nation as a whole. The per capita income in the South is \$314 as compared with \$604 for the rest of the country. The average assessed calue of taxable property is \$163 as compared with \$1,370. Pellagra is an "almost exclusive" Southern disease. Four million families should be rehoused. Labor receives on the iverage 16 cents an hour less than in Northern cities, while educational opportunities lag far behind with the nighest rate of illiteracy of any part of the country.

Fortunately the Council was kind enough not to stame this unfavorable state of affairs entirely on Southerners themselves. The difficulty of obtaining credit in he South has something to do with it, the Council admits nterest rates often run as high as 20 percent, according o the Council's report. But we believe some of our state ctorneys could show instances where it has run many mes higher than that.

Freight rates, too, are an adverse factor affecting he South's prosperity. The Southern manufacturer is at 39 percent disadvantage as compared with his Northern ompetitor in getting his products to markit, while in the southwestern part of the South the disadvantage runs is high 75 percent. As much or more could be said with spect to the freight rate disadvantage which the celery armer bas.

And the Council admits that the nation's tariff policies ire partly to blame for the poverty of the South. "The outh has been forced for generations", it says, "to sell is sgricultural products in an improtected world marke, and my its manufactured goods at prices supported by high arills." The net effect of this is that the things which the South has to sell bring low prices, while he things the South has to buy command a high price.

What to do about all this, the Council is strangely alent, except to throw the entire problem into the lap of ongress where as a master of fac, it has been ever since ne Civil War. Who made the tariff rates which have een ruining the South anyway, if not the Northern senaors and representatives who control Congress? Who sano loned the freight rates which discriminate against he South if not the bureaucratic Interstate Commerce ommission?

And who restricts cotton production throwing thousinds of farm hands out of employment, encouraging its cultivation in foreign countries, and causing the lowest ash market in terms of gold in the history of this counry, if not the Agricultural Adjustment Administration of secretary Wallace?

If the National Emergency Council doesn't like the overly which exists in the South-and we for one do no then let it jump on those politicians representing Northern industrial areas who for generations have been exproiting the South for all it was worth,


