



### Floating Mines

The havor wrought on Allied and neutral shipping during the past few days by floating mines illustrates the possibilities of modern warfare should it ever develop into a free-tor-all fight with no holds barred. There is an old

a free-for-all fight with no holds barred. There is an old saving that whatever man can imagine, he can do, but when it comes to modern warfare it is a little bit terrifying to let one's imagination run away with him.

The British charge that the German deliberately set these floating mines loose to drift wherever the wind or tide might carry them, and equipped them with some sort of magnetic device so that they would be drawn to the side of whatever all, they might approach; sinking it by their explosion. The Germans of course deny this, probably because it is a violation of infernational law and might conflict considerably with world opinion.

The law holds that mines should be anchored and so

The law holds that mines should be anchored and so equipped that in the event they break loose because of a storm or for some other reason they would be immediately rendered harmless. Only in some such manner as this can the indiscriminate sinking of ships and the destruction of neutral civilian life be prevented. Floating mines, otherwise, might be a constant menace on the seas for years to

The use of mines, in the manner in which the Germans are now accused, is similar in effect to the ruthless bombing of civilian centers of population. All belligerents in this war are agreed not to bomb from the air non-military objectives where women and children might be endangered. Yet Hitler admitted in a recent Berlin speech that in war one thing leads to another and before long just such bombing might be taking place without anyone knowing just who started it.

If mines are to be set adrift to do whatever damage they may regardless of military considerations, if women and children are to be ruthlessly bombed from the air, if poison gas is to be recklessly used in this war by both sides, we wonder if anything at all will be barred, and if the horrors of war, even for non-combatants will be limited only by what mar can imagine.

For years there has been talk of germ warfare. Scientists have pointed out that spies located in some such large city as Paris might contaminate the water supplies with deadly germs and thus bring a plague of sickness upon the people.
