DAUGHERTY SAYS PAYMENT OF BIG FUND JUSTIFIED

Defense Counsel Indicates There Were Good Reasons For Payment of \$7,000,000 To Allen Interests By U. S.

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—(AP)—One defense indicated by cross examination of the chief witness on far in the trial of Harry M. Daugherty and Thomas W. Miller on charges of bribery is that payment of \$7,000,000 by the United States to alien claimants was justified. The former attorney general and the former alien property custodian are accused of accepting \$391,000 in bribes as return for compensation of all claims for war-time seizure of German-owned stocks of the American Metal Company. Documents submitted at Washington in order to obtain money were perfectly truthful, Richard Merton, German copper magnate and former army captain, testified yesterday. He showed, he said, that German owners of a seized 49 per cent of stock in the American Metal Company had transferred their claim to the Societe Suisse Pour Valeurs des Metaux. They did not reveal, however, that a majority of the stock in this corporation of a neutral country was German owned. Merton's cross examination will continue when the trial is resumed Monday.

Two checks, said Mr. Merton in direct examination, for \$3,500,357 and \$2,953,622 were delivered to him in his New York hotel room by Mr. Miller. Because of the prohibition law he did not know where to get drinks for his guests at the hotel. He gave the checks to the late John T. King, then Republican national committee chairman for Connecticut, to get two bottles of champagne for him. The German copper magnate gave gold cigarette cases as souvenirs to Miller and King, who had arranged introductions for him, and Jess Smith, Daugherty's right-hand man, who shared in the other checks. After dinner the other asked Merton to go out but he testified "I did not go out, because having \$7,000,000 in my pocket, I did not feel like going out."

Next day, Merton said, he gave Mr. King \$391,000 in Liberty Bonds from a block of \$544,000 paid on the claim as commission for facilitating the negotiations. The government has yet to introduce evidence connecting the defendants with the \$391,000.

20 Reported Dead in Japanese Rain Storm

TOKIO, Sept. 11.—(AP)—Reports to the vernacular newspaper today from Hiroshima say that a severe rainstorm flooded the city submerging 20,000 houses. Twenty persons are reported dead and a number injured and missing. Railway communication between Kobe and Shimomaki have been suspended as several bridges were swept out. The city is described in the dispatch as "a sea swirling mud," most of the telegraph and telephone lines in the region being down and news of the disaster is extremely meager.
