Sheriff To Request 100% Budget Hike

\$500,000 Is Sought

It will cost twice as much to operate the Seminole County sheriff's department next year... if Sheriff Peter Milliot has his way. He announced today he intends to request the County Commission to double the present budget for his department.

Milliot said that since the public is asking for more and better protection it will be necessary to employ at least 12 more deputies and an investigator and to purchase several more patrol cars.

He indicated he would seek a 100 per cent budget increase from the County Commission, bringing the present \$250,000 figure up to a projected \$500,000. Most of the increase will go for salaries for new personnel, so the present road staff can be doubled.

Updating the department's identification system and investigation files on all type criminal violators, streamlining bookkeeping and clerical work and the addition of a closed circuit television system in the county jail are also needed, the sheriff said.

Milliot added that deputies are spread too thin - "There is only one man for each 32 square miles."

Copter Crashes, 23 Persons Die

PARAHAMOUNT, Calif. (AP)—A commercial helicopter carrying 23 persons from Burbank to Los Angeles crashed on Wednesday, killing 22 and seriously wounding one.

The helicopter, a Sikorski HO4S, crashed through the 20-mile flight to Los Angeles International Airport.

The cause of the crash was listed as "loss of control of the aircraft after a rotor blade spun off the craft."

Witnesses said they heard a loud pop before the helicopter plunged to earth.

Two large sections landed a few feet apart and debris was scattered in places scattered over the two-block farm.

Most of the passengers' bodies were still strapped to seats when the helicopter crashed.

The possibility of a collision was suggested by Los Angeles Airways, owner of the helicopter service. But William Byrny of the Federal Aviation Agency said investigators had no evidence of it.

Officials worked through the night, Wednesday, securing the wreckage and recovering and identifying the bodies.

Identifying the dead was laborious, with only sketchy information available, but it was reported the list included persons from throughout the United States.

The crash was the first fatality in the helicopter firm's 21-year history. The HO4S carries a crew of three.

Miami Teacher, Student Shot

MIAMI (AP)—A popular young teacher and a 12-year-old student were shot and seriously wounded Wednesday afternoon at Drew Junior High School, by a 15-year-old boy police said had been disciplined earlier in the city.

Ernest Lee Grissom, 15, was arrested at his home shortly after the shooting and held for a hearing before Juvenile Court.

Norwood Dean, 26, a graphic arts teacher, was listed in serious condition at Jackson Memorial Hospital Wednesday night, and Larry Jones was listed as critical.

Five teachers, including Dean, had found Grissom and four other students causing a disturbance and took them to the office of Assistant Principal George Ellis, 32. Charles Harbort, of the Dade County Sheriff's office said.

Grissom left the office alone after being reprimanded, then returned a few minutes later to find the teachers still there, Harbort said, and the shooting began.

Dean was shot in the chest and another bullet went through the sleeve of a second teacher and into the wall.

Harbort said Grissom then ran from the office. He met a group of students coming down a flight of stairs and fired once, hitting Jones in the head, Harbort said.

The shooting was the fourth such incident since September, when Harold Lucas, 16, shot a 15-year-old classmate, Major Brown, in a Booker T. Washington High gym class.

January 24th, Miss G. High School basketball star John Mattox, 17, was slightly wounded when a gun brought to school by some classmates discharged accidentally.

On January 20, 16-year-old Linda Lipscomb was shot and killed in a corridor of Jackson High School after an argument over a ball-point pen. Blanche Patricia Ward, 16, was accused of the shooting.

Rap Brown Found Guilty

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—H. Rap Brown remained free on bond today pending appeal of his federal court conviction on a charge of violating the National Firearms Act.

Brown, 24, chairman of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, drew the maximum penalty of five years in prison and a \$2,000 fine after the three-judge jury returned its verdict Wednesday night.

Under terms of the \$15,000 bond, Brown's travel was restricted to the Southern District of New York State.

The immediate sentencing by U.S. District Judge Lanning L. Mitchell was at the request of William M. Kunstler, of New York, chief defense attorney for the Black Power advocate.

Kunstler included a plea for leniency, describing the government case as an effort to "silence" Brown, a frequent and fiery speaker at civil rights rallies.

Brown was convicted under a section of the act forbidding anyone under indictment on a felony charge to transport a gun across state lines.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House passed today a sweeping consumer credit protection act to require that full information be given borrowers and buyers on the cost of credit.

Extortionate transactions are defined as those including excessive interest rates and inequitable practices or implied threat that violence or other criminal means harming property will be used to enforce collection.

The financing of extortionate credit also is forbidden. Sponsor said this provides means to get at the upper echelons of those underworld organizations which put up the money for loan sharks' operations. Another enforcement weapon is provided by specifying that persons involved may be required to testify, under promise of immunity from prosecution.

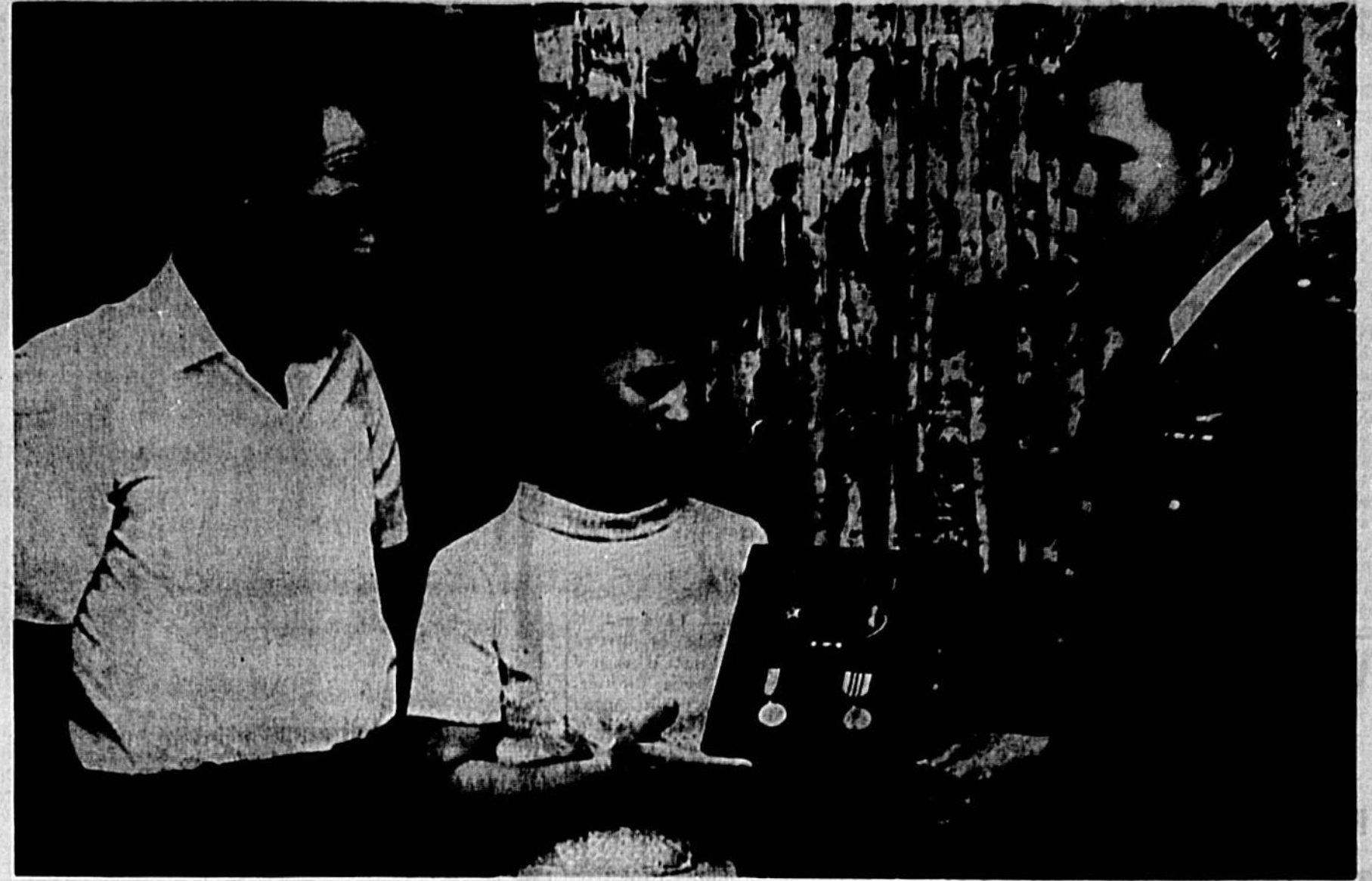

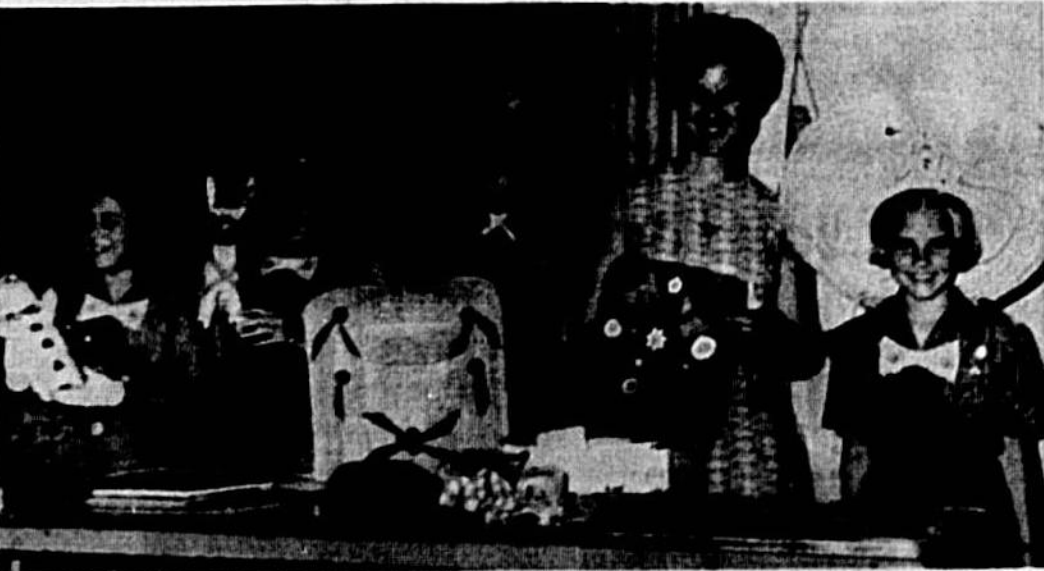
