

sary celebration in 1969 after a 10-year layoff. In 1969, he substituted for President Dwight D. Eisenhower. But more important matters of state face Nixon Monday, namely, the nomination of G. Harrold Carswell to be a justice on the Supreme Court,

The Senate votes on the nomination Monday and Nixon indiclaims in Washington Post Sports Triber Bill Chica he wanted to be at the White House to keep more closely in touch than he could at RFK Stadium. The White House merely said Nixon had a scheduling conflict.



Modular Home Site · Control Proposed

Sanford Zoning and Planning Commission last night approved recommendations to the City Commission to control the creation of a modular home development indicated for possible construction in the Woodmere Park area off Sanford Avenue.

According to Lynn Risner, city building official, Harry Licht, of Orlando, has proposed to build a subdivision of modular (manufactured economy housing)

Risner said because of the city code which outlaws mobile homes locating within the city and the possible relationship of the modular homes with same type construction as mobile homes, a problem could develop in zoning

homes within the city.

City Manager W. E. Knowles told the planner that as long as the building code is met by the modular units, they could not legally be stopped from lo cating within the city. Risner said he had told Licht that he could not ap-

prove the units unless it can be proved that the electrical and plumbing systems are satisfactory. Arthur Harris, zoning chairman, recommended that a city ordinance be passed requiring all manufactured off-site homes to meet standards of the Southern Building code and inspected by either city building official or by a reciprocal agreement with another

qualified building official where the units are made. mmission and Gerald Dake, city planner, mentioned the need to put modular housing in a separate zoned R-2 and R-5 areas for one- and two-family dwellings. Urban renewal plans of city were outlined by Martin Gainer, Dake's assistant, and he disclosed that a work schedule starting April 1 and running until June 4 would be needed to research what area will be renewed under the urban revewel plan adopted by the

Sections of Georgetown and Geldsboro will be checked to determine what three- or four-block area will be delineated for the city's first renewal project. Application will then be forwarded to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in Washington for a survey grant, Gainer said.


