

It takes about two weeks after a bite for rables to develop. If every dog and catiwere shut up for two weeks, by the end of that time it would be definitely known where every animal that has rables is, every one of them could, and should, be killed. If it were impossible for any dogs or cals to receive any new bitten during that period, the remaining animals would be known to be free from rables.

And so we say, keep your done and cats shut up for two or three weeks, and let's get rid of this menace.

### The Tax Ratio

Total taxes which will be paid in the . United States this year will reach a new high of \$13,500,000,000, in spite of unbalanced budgets-which-means that taxes, high as they are, are not sufficient to meet expenses according to recent estimates by the United States Chamber of Com-

More than half of these taxes, it is estimated, will be collected by local and state governments, while the federal government, mainly through income, excise, and payroll taxes, will gather in the rest of some \$6,400,000,000.

National income, out of which these taxes have to be paid is expected to be considerably less than the previously estimated \$69,000,000,000 for the year. With unsmployment increasing and stock prices dropping, it is certain to be some less. But regardless, it is estimated that one dollar out of every five earned by every man and woman in America must be paid out in taxes.

As if that were not bad enough, it must further be re membered that the national income is a variable quantity which goes up and down much like the prices on the New York Stock Exchange. One year it may be way up and a few years later way down. But taxes are not that way. They have a tendency to go up and up and up,

Furthermore, taxes are inclined to go up faster and higher when national income is down than when it is up. During a depression there are naturally more calls upon the government for relief, subsidies, and one thing and another, than there are when times are good and everyone is making a good income. Consequently taxes are higher when national income is lowest.







### Roosevelt Says Measure Would Cripple Any President

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10. -(AP)-The House shelved today the proposed war referendum amendment to the Constitution voting against the floor consideration of the proposal. Speaker Bankhead announced the vote against the referendum was 200 to 188.

Just before the vote was taked President Roosevelt sent Banks head a letter which was read to the house, In it the President warned that the war referentum would "cripple any President" in his conduct of foreign affairs.

He also said it would encourage other nations "to believe that they could violate American rights with
