

Guess how many residents showed up on Wednesday night to voice an opinion about the pay cut the Seminole County Charter Review Commission is suggesting for county commissioners?

None.

Five minutes into a public hearing, a motion was made to adjourn. It produced a 5-5 vote, and laughter.

County Attorney Robert McMillan suggested a recess to allow others to arrive.

Ten minutes later, the commission agreed to adjourn.

"If no one's here, there's no reason to be here," said commission member Jimmy Ross of Longwood.

The commission wants to reduce the salary of county commissioners from \$66,000 a year to \$49,995 by the year 2002. The public hearing was advertised to get input from citizens.

A second proposal by the group is to have charter review commissions each eight years rather than six.

The present charter group meets again on June 28. Tell a friend.

Dealer says he's in love with cop

ORLANDO — Convicted cocaine dealer Antonio Holley testified he is in love with Sanford Police Officer Darlene Ladoczky, who is accused of supplying him with drugs and sex, in the second day of her trial on Wednesday.

Ladoczky, 34, is charged with providing 26-year-old Holley, a confessed Sanford drug dealer since age 16, with cocaine and giving him details of under-

cover police investigations.

Meanwhile, defense attorney Charles Greene claims Holley is lying. Under cross-examination by Greene, Holley testified he previously lied to federal

agents.

During his first two interviews with federal agents following his arrest on Nov. 22, Holley admitted he told investigators he had a non-sexual relationship

with Ladoczky, and she never discussed police matters with him or supplied him with drugs.

"I did not say anything about Darlene at the time because of our relationship," Holley said.

"Because I love her, and I wanted to pro-

Board OKs tighter water restrictions

Some wells beginning to run dry

The St. Johns River Water Management District's Governing Board voted Tuesday to maintain current restrictions on outdoor watering, while directing its staff members to tighten restrictions in areas hardest hit by the drought.

"These are the minimum recommendations," said St. Johns

spokesman Jeff Cole. "Many cities and some counties have imposed their own rules. If theirs are stronger than ours, then they will be in effect."

While St. Johns does not have specific enforcement capabilities, Cole said repeat violators may face fines.

While St. Johns covers all or parts of 19 counties, Cole said there is concern over the water level in Seminole County. "We have monitoring wells throughout the area," he explained.

"And the one in Longwood is now at a record low, as of the end of May." He said the previous record low at that well was

Investigators narrow leads in Erving case

SANFORD — Investigators believe they may have a lead in the search for Cory Erving, the 19-year-old son of basketball legend Julius Erving.

Cory Erving, missing since May 28, was reportedly sighted on Saturday June 10 at the intersection of State Road 436, Douglas Avenue and Wymore Road in Allamonte Springs. According to tips to investigators, he was seen with a white woman with blonde hair.

Steve Olson, spokesman for the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, said this is the "most important and credible informa-

tion" in the search for Cory Erving.

Authorities have received leads from hundreds of phone calls to a hotline established in the search for Julius Erving's youngest son.

Seminole County Sheriff Don Eslinger said tips have centered on an area east of Allamonte Springs, areas in Eatonsville, and areas near Paramore Avenue in Orlando.

In addition, Eslinger said investigators believe Cory Erving had a relapse into the alcohol and crack-cocaine addiction he has been struggling to overcome.

Sanford's Natalie Weld seeks Miss Florida title

A famous father yearns for his missing son

We knew his joy, and now his sorrow. He made basketball a form of art. He lifted us with him on his flights to the rim. Today, Julius Erving — Doctor J — needs us to lift him.

Erving's 19-year-old son, Cory, has been missing since May 28.

A nationwide search is in progress for the youngster, who was born with a learning disability described by his father as a mild form of dyslexia and attention deficit disorder.

As the hours tick off to Father's Day, Julius Erving's heart yearns for his missing son. How sweet it would be for the entire Erving family to embrace Cory and to celebrate his return.

"We felt Cory was on course to have some success in a life that has been very trying, living in the shadow of a public figure like myself and a high profile family," Erving said.

The famous father is at 50, handsome and fit. His hair is salt 'n' pepper. He looks like the cover of a gentleman's maga-

zine, his taste and clothes impeccable. If someone played Doctor J in the movies, that someone would be Denzel Washington.

The game of life is a lot longer and tougher than a basketball game. Erving found out even with his successes life was not a slam dunk. The Doc made mistakes. A year ago we found out he had a daughter with a woman other than his wife, Turquoise.

One day 20 years ago, Erving came to a small island camp for boys in upstate New York. It was a summer bible camp run by the Word of Life. Erving was brought to the island in a motor boat. He was wearing a warm up suit and sneakers.

The campers waited for Erving at an outdoor basketball court. They applauded when he arrived. There were 80 or more kids. My own sons were there. And they were plenty excited to meet Julius Erving, then a star with the Philadelphia 76ers.

Erving took a basketball and drove immediately toward one

of the baskets. As he went airborne, the children watched in awe and wonder. He did a reverse slam dunk, retrieved the ball and walked to midcourt.

Rolling the ball away, Erving told his admirers, "We won't be needing this for awhile."

For the next hour, Erving talked about the difficulties of his youth, about drugs and associating with the wrong crowd. He talked about straightening out the messes he had created and about his faith in God.

"The Preacher Wore Sneakers" was the headline on a column I did that day for the Albany Times Union.

Another writer — for one of the wire services — asked Erving that day if he was frustrated that the Sixers hadn't won an NBA title. Erving said he hoped there would be a title but that his visit that day to the summer camp was not about basketball.

Erving's life today is about the recovery of Cory Erving. What father wouldn't exchange the titles or fame he has won for the embrace of a missing son?

DEAR DR. GOTT: My husband used to drink two gin and tonics a night. He also wore heavy cowboy boots because he had repeated attacks of gout, he switched to bourbon and drank water. He gave up his boots and has not had a gout attack in two years. He was even able to stop taking aspirin. Do you think the problem was the gin or the boots?

DEAR READER: The boots are a disease of either excess uric acid production during metabolism or reduced uric acid excretion by the kidneys. The increased amount of uric acid in the body is converted to sodium urate crystals that settle into joints and other tissues, causing pain and swelling. Acute gouty arthritis is often triggered by minor trauma to joints, such as would occur from wearing shoes or boots that pinch.

To my knowledge, no scientific studies have linked gout to bygone days, lead was added to wines to promote clarity. This caused lead poisoning (saturnine gout) but is no longer a problem because of prohibitions against adding lead to alcohol drinks.

Although your husband no longer suffers from gouty arthritis, he still has gout. The elevated level of uric acid probably remains in his system. Therefore, he should be under the care of a physician and would be helped by continuing to take allopurinol, a drug that blocks the formation of uric acid. Despite the absence of joint inflammation, your husband's sodium urate may continue to cause painless damage to internal organs, such as the kidneys. Ladoczky, a 12-year-veteran of the Sanford Police Department who is suspended without pay, sat silently next to her attorney throughout the second day of the trial. She occasionally shook her head "no" during Holley's testimony about their relationship. She denies their relationship was sexual.

During each recess, she spent time talking with her husband, Longwood police officer Robert Ladoczky, and other family members.

Robert Ladoczky, 31, sat outside the courtroom of US District Judge Patricia Fawcett throughout the proceedings Wednesday, because he will testify on behalf of his wife later in the trial.

Assistant US Attorney Matt Perry will continue presenting evidence on Friday. The state is expected to rest its case on Monday.

Holley, who received a reduced sentence of seven years and eight months for trafficking in cocaine in return for his testimony against Darlene Ladoczky, is the main witness for the prosecution. His sentence was reduced by more than three years.

Holley testified he provided money to Ladoczky on several

occasions, including \$400 to cover a mistake in her checking account. He also testified he gave Ladoczky \$40 and \$50 for work on her hair and nails.

Holley said he was suspicious of Ladoczky when they first started talking. But, his fears were eased when she provided him with oral sex in a squad car on the waterfront of Lake Monroe.

After Holley testified about having a three-year relationship with Ladoczky, the defense attempted to discredit Holley based on his previous contradictory statements to federal agents.

The prosecution also presented an audiotaped conversation that took place Jan. 28, in which Ladoczky told Wonda Grooms, the mother of two of Holley's children, how to avoid being stopped by undercover police officers following her. She told Grooms she could call 911 and have the cars pulled over.

The sport utility vehicles following Grooms were undercover police cars, according to the testimony Thursday of Special Agent Robert Mitchell, a Sanford police officer assigned as a task force agent with the federal Drug Enforcement Agency office in Orlando.

The call was a set-up. Grooms

had agreed to work with investigators in the hope of helping Holley.

At the time the call was placed, Ladoczky was responding to an emergency regarding a home invasion and possible shooting, Mitchell said.

During the conversation, Ladoczky told Grooms "chances are, it's probably DEA or CCIB (City-County Investigative Bureau)."

She agreed to check the tag numbers of the vehicles as provided by Grooms. In addition, she warned Grooms to be careful.

"Just because Tony (Holley) was arrested doesn't mean the heat is off," Ladoczky said on tape. "They're going to keep on going."

However, under cross-examination by the defense, Mitchell said Ladoczky did not check the tag numbers of the vehicles or make a return phone call to Grooms.

Ladoczky is charged with one count of conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute and distribution of crack cocaine, two counts of lying to federal agents and carrying a firearm during a drug trafficking offense. If convicted, she could receive 15 years to life in prison.

Because of the new leads, Eslinger said he is "much more optimistic about Cory's well-being" than he was on Tuesday.

Julius Erving said he last spoke to his son over the telephone about 1:20 p.m. on Sunday May 28. Cory told his father he was picking up bread at Panera's for a barbecue to be held at the home of Orlando Magic player Corey Maggette.

Cory Erving and his Volkswagen Passat have not been seen since May 28. Eslinger said finding the Passat "is a critical link to finding Cory."

Eslinger said the teen was involved in some type of altercation with an individual in the east Altamonte Springs area just prior to May 28, but declined to give details on the altercation. It occurred in an area where numerous drug arrests have been made, authorities said.

The search is focusing on the east Altamonte Springs area. The teen did not have access to credit cards, and Eslinger said Cory Erving has "limited financial means." Investigators have been interviewing all of Cory Erving's friends and associates.

Cory Erving, who has been in-and-out of alcohol and drug rehabilitation centers, was turning his life around by enrolling in classes at Seminole Community College for a high school equivalency diploma, said his father. He was also buying tables for Panera Bread. a

Lake Mary bakery located about three miles from his family's million-dollar home in the gated Alaquia community. Born with mild forms of dyslexia and attention deficit disorder, and attended schools for children with learning disabilities until the eighth grade.

The family is offering a \$25,000 reward for information relating to the whereabouts of Cory Erving.

Known worldwide as "Dr. J," Julius Erving played for the New Jersey Nets and Philadelphia 76ers for 16 years in the 1970's and 1980's. He is a member of the basketball Hall of Fame. Currently, he is Senior Vice President of the Orlando Magic.

Erving said he first searched for his son through "private contacts," then reported him as missing to the sheriff's office June 4. After more than two weeks of searching, the family made the decision on Monday to publicly ask for help in expanding the search.

A toll-free line for the public to call with tips has been established. The number is 1-800-679-2529.

Cory Erving was last seen driving a Volkswagen Passat, Florida license plate No. A67-LFE. He has been known to frequent the Suburban Lodge on Oxford Road in Casselberry, the Eatonville area, and the Lorraine Drive area of Altamonte Springs.

in September of 1960. The well doesn't supply water for any municipalities, but he said public wells draw water from same sources, and the low level in Longwood is an example of the low levels throughout the area.

The board emphasized the need for residents and businesses to comply with the district's rule prohibiting outdoor watering between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. to reduce water consumption and help avoid water resource problems, including the potential formation of additional sinkholes in Central Florida.

Record drought, along with resulting high ground water withdrawals during the past few months have resulted in conditions being favorable for the formation of sinkholes in Central Florida. With forecasts predicting a return to normal rain patterns this summer, concern has shifted to the potential formation of new sinkholes.

heavy rains after droughts often cause enough pressure on the ground to create sinkholes.

The district's staff will scrutinize rainfall and groundwater data throughout the area and consider possibly imposing even tighter restrictions during the next two weeks.

Rainfall through the 19 counties covered by St. Johns is between 6 and 14 inches below normal for the year and aquifer levels have dropped one to three feet.

Drought conditions can lead to a variety of water resource concerns, such as an increase in outdoor watering, water supply utility capacity and pressure problems during times of peak demand, loss of pressure and flow in private wells, a decline in drinking water quality, sinkhole formation and low lake levels.

Board Chairman Bill Kerr observed, "While water restrictions can cause some inconvenience to residents and businesses, limiting outdoor watering is critical throughout the year, and especially during a drought. We ask that the public assist us with our efforts and help ensure long-term water resource protection."

In this district, the following restrictions are now in effect:

- Outdoor watering is not allowed between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

- Residents and businesses are encouraged to limit outdoor watering to no more than two days a week (voluntary).

- This applies to commercial, industrial and residential properties, as well as to private wells, surface water and public utilities.

- Exceptions are for use of reclaimed water and other special circumstances.

- The stricter regulations by St. Johns apply only to Southern Duval County and northwestern St. Johns Counties.

Firefighters continue to work wildfires

Firefighters and support personnel continue mop-up activities at 60 fires, and the monitoring of 231 fires throughout the state. As of the beginning of this week, 3,003 personnel are participating in the fire fights.

Thus far in 2000, a total of 3,834 fires have burned over 137,000 acres across the state. While the number is high, it is still below a comparable period of 1999, when 4,092 fires had burned over 303,000 acres. Monday alone, there were 27 new fires reported.

Although rainfall has improved over the past week, the state continues to show the effects of

the long-term drought.

Thus far, 22 counties, including Seminole County, have put restrictions on the sale and/or use of fireworks. Volusia County hasn't established a county-wide ban, but the cities of DeLand and Deltona have announced a ban.

The Florida Division of Forestry is asking citizens to report suspicious activities in and around wooded areas. Anyone who believes they have information about a possible arsonist can report it anonymously by calling the Florida Forestry Arson Alert Association Hotline at 1-800-342-5869. Rewards of up to \$5,000 may be given for information leading to the arrest of a woods arsonist.


INDIANAPOLIS - Coaches have for years stressed that if you dominate the backboards, especially on the offensive end, you will win the game.

Dodge testing brings Cup teams together

NASCAR's crackdown on Dodge testing has been one of the big stories on the stock car tour the past two weeks, but Ray Evernham and Lou Patane, his boss and head of DaimlerChrysler racing, are downplaying NASCAR's moves.

In fact, just what NASCAR is allowing Dodge in the way of testing this summer still isn't that clear. Evernham says he will get the same seven tests any Winston Cup team would get at the tour's tracks. There is unlimited testing allowed at non-Winston Cup tracks, and that's apparently where Evernham and Dodge will be focusing much of their testing the next few weeks, in engine development.

Once the new Dodge engine is approved — and Dodge officials aren't pinning themselves to any deadline — Evernham will likely start using up those seven tests.

"NASCAR just wants to make it fair for all the manufacturers, so we'll probably be held to the same restrictions as everybody else," Evernham said. "I don't know if that's unfair, it's just a matter of which side you're on. If I still had a Chevrolet, I'd probably be complaining that Dodge is getting too much testing. But I'm on the Dodge side, so I don't think they're giving Dodge enough."

"Our next test is to shake the car down at a local short track working on the motor. We'll let the motor guys dictate our testing. We're looking for a good solid stretch of testing in July and August. We keep pushing our testing schedule back because we want to test with the real motor. This shakedown in the next week or so will probably dictate when our next big test is. It could be Vegas, but we're looking at some other venues, too, like St. Louis, Kentucky. We will be making some endurance runs by the end of June."

"August 8 is the deadline for presenting the car to NASCAR. The engine, without knowing how that will go, I just don't know. I'd like to present the engine [to NASCAR] at the same time, but whether all the development will be done, I don't know."

"We are going to be behind next season," Evernham said. "We've got a brand-new car, brand-new race teams, brand-new engine and an awful lot to learn. But we've also got a lot to gain."

During the opening months of this new Dodge venture, the four teams plan to work as closely as possible, in a plan that not everyone thinks will work as well as Patane hopes.

"We were told we'd never be able to get more than one Winston Cup team to work together, but we're doing that," Patane said.

Said Evernham: "I hope we all get competitive with each other when the Dodges are all running in the top five every week, but first we need to develop a car, engines and race teams quickly, and the only way you can do that is by working together. You have to be open until you get to a point. We've all got to get to the top of the mountain, then we can start staking our own claims."

Patane says he's now much more interested in a Busch Grand National program next season than he had been earlier. That's certainly good news for car owner Bill Davis, who has two Busch teams.

"The Busch program is interesting, because once you get your Winston Cup car body approved, you have essentially got a Busch car. And our truck engine, with a carburetor change, if it were submitted to NASCAR for Busch, could be the engine of choice," Patane said.

Getting that Cup car body approved, however, may be a little trickier than it might have appeared a month ago during the Homestead test, because NASCAR's common templates program appears to be stalling in the face of stiff resistance from General Motors and Ford.

NASCAR's common template plan is to give all brands essentially identical bodies, to keep the manufacturers from complaining about aerodynamics.

the Man black in Back is Back

Not content to live off his legacy, Dale Earnhardt rebounds from a year of ill health to dispel questions about his age and ability

Dale Earnhardt is back. The loquacious, the teasing comments, the jaunty stroll across the garage. It's all there. On the track, he's aggressive and charging, bumping and grinding past the competition in the garage, he's signing autographs and putting other drivers on the back. He looks like a man with a plan that is on track.

He looks like a champion. In Sunday's Kmart 400, Earnhardt finished second by scraping past Bobby Labonte on the final lap before the race was called for rain. He moved up to second in the Winston Cup points standings as he pursued a record eighth championship.

"He'll rub you, he'll bump you, he'll do everything he can to get the spot," said Jeff Burton. "That's the way it ought to be."

But not the way it has been. Although Earnhardt hasn't fallen out of the top 10 since 1992, he hadn't shown that fire that marked his career in the 1980s and early '90s. Instead of battling challengers, he sometimes allowed them to slip by easily. It wasn't the Earnhardt that drivers knew.

"He was more prone to not put up a real big battle with you a few years ago because he knew that his car wouldn't do it," Burton said. "Now that he's competitive — I never raced against him years ago, but I watched him race, and it looks like to me that's the way he was."

In the past four years, the seven-time champion has dealt more with comments about his age and ability than vying for titles. The struggle wore on him.

"Every driver goes through years or situations that aren't favorable," Earnhardt said. "I could have bailed out on Richard Childress' team when things didn't seem like they were going our way, when your job's sort of on the line and people write you off as 'He's too old' or 'He's not competitive anymore' or whatever. But Richard and I have a better relationship than that."

A few years ago, Barry Dodson — the crew chief who led Rusty Wallace to a narrow championship win over Earnhardt in 1989 — watched the driver struggling in qualifying. He couldn't stand to see him falter, so he offered some advice.

"I said, 'You're doubting yourself right now, and you don't need to do that. You are probably the best and don't ever believe you can't drive,'" Dodson said.

Still, Earnhardt struggled to compete with the leaders. Nagging neck pain dogged his efforts. He fractured his collarbone and sternum, even fainted in his car. Earnhardt seemed to be losing his edge.

He couldn't settle for just running around the track and living off his legacy. Off-season surgery to fuse two vertebrae ended the numbness he had felt in his hands and arms late in races. In-house changes gave him a car matching his skills.

"Dale's healthy now, and that's a big key," owner Childress said. "I know he was hurting last year. He's a new person physically."

Earnhardt shines. He talks breezily about the two-car team he owns, compliments the success of his son. He won a race early in the season and watched his son win two. People hounded him with questions about his business and son. They questioned him about the days when he and Darrell Waltrip raced at the front.

"I've pretty much got the best of all the worlds, really," he said. "I'm a car owner that's sitting here watching these guys that race well and win. I've been able to race and win myself, so I'm pretty excited about that."

The talk about Earnhardt's age and ability disappeared. Earnhardt says he'll stay in the Childress-owned car until he retires. But that won't happen anytime soon. He's as tough at 49 as he was at 29. Just a little more relaxed.

"I'm happy as I can be," he said. "It's fun to get in the race car and go race."
