Population Of County Is 18.6 Percent Higher

22,226 Inhabitants Are Counted In Decennial Census For Increase Of 3,491

The population of Seminole County has increased by 18.6 percent in the past decade, according to information released today by Dick Bell, district commissioner of Orlando who is tabulating the results of the census made in this county.

The 1930 census gave Seminole County a population of 22,226 as compared with a total of 18,735 residents in 1920.

These figures, he pointed out, are subject to change until the final tabulation is forwarded to Washington, although he expressed a belief that the final figures would not be altered materially.

Because of the fact that the city limits have been brought substantially since the 1920 census, there is no material increase in population in Sanford proper, leaving most of the increase of 3,491 distributed through the rural precincts, Mr. Bell pointed out.

The preliminary figures give Seminole County a population of 19,170 as compared with 16,100, an increase of 19 percent, despite the fact that the number of square miles in the county limits was reduced by more than half.

Mr. Bell did not have available comparative figures for all of the county towns and precincts, but he has completed the preliminary tabulation of all precincts with the exception of Precinct Two, which includes Lake Wales.

He reported that the portion of Precinct Three which lies within the city limits had 2,811 residents, an increase of 10 percent over the 2,556 reported in 1920.

Blitzkrieg Said To Come Friday

Chilean Minister Reveals U. S. Proposal For Protectorates

An apparent "trial balloon" peace offer to Great Britain by Axis powers—with the alternative threat of a full-blown assault on the British Isles—was floated by diplomatic circles in Rome today.

Simultaneously the international picture was darkened by the resignation of the Japanese cabinet headed by Premier Admiral Mitsuama Yonai. It appeared likely that the Yonai cabinet would be succeeded by a group favoring stronger action against the western powers in the Orient, including the United States.

This report coincided with the departure of strong forces of the United States battle fleet from Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, numbering two battleships, 18 cruisers, the aircraft carrier Enterprise and a powerful array of destroyers.

While the Navy Department maintained silence, speculation was aroused that American operations may be planned to patrol the British and French Isles in the South Pacific.

In Santiago, Chile, Foreign Minister "Cristobal" Saura disclosed that he has received and is studying a note from the United States on the establishment of a protectorate over European possessions in Central and South America. He did not reveal details of the communication.

Without confirmation elsewhere, the French newspaper "Le Petit Parisien" quoted foreign diplomatic quarters in Switzerland as saying that this Friday might become the "zero hour" — weather permitting — for a master cross-channel invasion of the British Isles by a German expeditionary force of 600,000 men in hundreds of ships.

The newspaper said that the long-awaited storming of the island fortress was originally set for the night of July 8-10 but was believed delayed because of a disagreement among Hitler's generals.

Nazi ships were reported poised along the Channel coast from Brest, France, to Bergen, Norway.

The Nazi-Fascist peace move, as described by diplomatic quarters in Rome, would be soundly rebuffed by Adolf Hitler in a three-point plan as follows:

Settlement of European affairs, presumably with Germany and Italy to dominate the continent—and Britain to keep "hands off."

Return of the British-held colonies owned by Germany before the World War.

The economic rehabilitation of Europe.

Prime Minister Winston Churchill, in a broadcast Sunday night, scornfully rejected in advance any axis suggestion of a peace parley.

Daily German raids on Great Britain tapered off sharply. Planes were sighted over northeast England but no bombs were dropped and a lone raider was believed to have been shot down off the southeast coast.

The British for their part appeared to be striking at Germany. A dozen or more radio stations in Germany and German-held territory fell silent last night and early today, indicating that British planes were in the neighborhood, although no announcements were made at the time.

\$11,000,000 Awarded By Army For Tanks

WASHINGTON, July 16 —(AP) — The Army awarded a contract yesterday for \$11,000,000 worth of tanks to bring its tank fleet to 1971—enough to outfit the new new mechanized "straw-burner" divisions and have a few hundred left for other purposes.

At the same time, the navy reported that its bureau of yards and docks, which deals with shore establishments, made the heaviest contract award in history during the past year when it was \$6,000,000, outstanding the World War fiscal year of 1939, the previous high award, by nearly 500 percent.

1728 Boys To Be Trained In Florida Armament Plans

JACKSONVILLE, July 16 —(AP) — The government's approval of Florida's defense plan to train 1728 boys this summer for places in the nation's armed up armament program was announced yesterday by State School Superintendent English who said the first allotment of \$50,000 to provide instruction had been made.

Florida asked for \$425,000 for the program which will continue for 15 months and English indicated additional funds will be obtained as needed. The certificates for the first appropriation already had been sent to the treasury by the office of education, he said.

Summer training in eight counties will be on this basis:

- Duval — \$11,000 for 320 students, seven crafts.
- DeKalb — \$700 for 200 students, eight crafts.
- Hillsborough — \$4300 for 320 students, eight crafts.
- Escambia — \$700 for 40 students, one craft.
- Florida — \$600 for 240 students, four crafts.
- Orange — \$750 for 160 students, two crafts.
- Jackson — \$450 for 40 students, one craft.
- Leon — \$125 for 200 students, five crafts.

Robert D. Doherty, state supervisor of trade and industrial education will be in charge of the training program.

Some of the courses include machine shop, welding, Diesel engine, auto mechanics, motor winding, and other mechanical and electrical training.

In addition to summer training, 1728 boys will be trained in the state's armament program during the school year.

Legionnaires To Sponsor Seminole Home Guard Unit

Citizens May Enlist At Police Station All Day On Thursday

Members of the Campbell-Loring American Legion Post voted unanimously to sponsor, the organization of a home guard in Seminole County composed of every American citizen in the county between the ages of 18 and 45 who has qualified for military service, Col. S. Field, commander of the post, said this morning following the organization's monthly dinner-meeting in the Legion Hut last night.

The chief purpose of the home guard would be to assist civic officials in time of emergency in maintaining order. They would act principally in lieu of the National Guard, subsequent to the induction of the Guardsmen into federal service.

Those who are interested may enroll at the Police Station next Thursday. All enrollees will be fingerprinted and their record of service, if any, will be entered on the specially prepared card. Two N.Y.A. workers will assist Mr. Field and Chief of Police Roy G. Williams in enrolling those who apply.

Mr. Field emphasized that those enrolling do not have to be members of the American Legion and he also pointed out that the organization would have no connections with the regular army, no term of enlistment, and that the expense of training must be paid by the individuals, if they desire to practice shooting rifles, pistols, or other firearms.

Arrangements are underway, however, to obtain ammunition supplies and the use of rifles and other equipment from the War Department.

Seminole is the third Central Florida county to undertake the organization of such a unit. Orange county legion officials reported unexpected success in the formation of a battalion with headquarters in Orlando while in Lake county, four complete companies, composed of more than 600 men, have already been formed.

Following the enlistment on Thursday, the enrollees will be mobilized at the Legion Hut next Tuesday night for the purpose of choosing officers, who will in turn appoint the sub-commissioned officers.

The officers will be chosen by a vote of the recruits which will be taken at the meeting when the previous military records of the enrollees will be read as a basis for consideration by the group.

Those desiring further information on the organization should contact Mr. Field or George Winston, District commander for the Legion. The officials of the Rev. Dr. Doherty of which Mr. Winston is pastor, gave the ceremonial ground for the unit at a meeting in Orlando last Sunday. Mr. Winston reported on the program.
