partisan cllizens group working to protert constltutlonal libertles. The report card from the "Lookin
at History" panel of five histortan and educators rated 13 new lext
and "good to excellent:"
The critics called earller edillons dumbed.down - oversilmplified to ther pulut of being Inadequate. But
the educators sald the new crop of history books were "smartened up." wlth more than halr of the texis doing a relatively good job of
covering the role of women and blacks. "White the new texts offer better
coverage of most subjects. they coverage of most subjects. they
