

Know The Candidates

Discussing the "invasion" of the State of Florida by J. Edgar Hoover and his agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation who seem to believe there is something crooked in Denmark, or rather in Florida, Senator Pepper who objects to the activities of the FBI in this state, is quoted as saying, "If the people of a state want crooked officials, and elect crooked officials, the state is entitled to have those officials."
