Mica said Friday he was placing no blame on Billberry, the city or previous HUD attempts to correct problems at SHA.

Instead, the congressman said wants to focus on "bringing Sanford's public housing up to the highest standard.

"This is a drastic measure. I know, but I've reached my limits with the problems within the agency," Mica said. "The housing authority has been plagued with problems during almost my entire 11 year career in congress." Mics met with top HUD officials two

Senford city officials must over-

come a \$1.4 million deficit in their 2003-2004 preliminary budget by July 1. in order to balance next year's

budget within two weeks, the city's finance director, Kevin L. Smith, along with the interim city manager, Andrew Van Gaale, will evaluate each cost item. The two will present a balanced budget, no later than the July 1 deadline, for the Sanford City Commission to

"The budget is tight and it remains to be seen what we can and can't do with revenues," said Smith. "At this point, we're doing the best we can to examine our See Budget, Page 2

"It's a tough situation right now, but we will get through it," he added. "It will involve some tough choices that remain to be seen."

Once the balanced budget is presented, the mayor and city commissioners will have the opportunity to discuss it and make any necessary changes during two work sessions scheduled for July 8 and 9. During this time, Commission will also set a proposed millage, which determines whether tax rates will increase.

"We have to forget about streamlining the budget and do some major body work instead," said Mayor Brady Lessard. "This

After riding 166,000 miles, Beasley nears goal

LAKE MARY — Thomas Beasley knows exactly how much time he's spent living on the road. It's been 12 years, five months and 12 days since he first got on his bicycle to begin a journey that has taken him across the United States

The 35-year-old man from Anaheim, Calif., won't quit riding his bicycle on the highways of America until he raises \$80,000 for the National Multiple Sclerosis

Society (NMSS). He may be on his last trip across the country - he only needs \$1,960 to reach his goal.

My original goal was \$100,000, and I thought I could do it within five to 10 years," Bessley said.
"But, the economy was bad when I first started. And, it's not been easy the last few months. It could take me six more months to finally hit

Since he was a teenager, Beasley has been an avid bike rider. When he was 15, he began training for the Tour de Prance and was well on his way when tragedy struck. His

trainer and good friend died at the age of 29 as a result of MS - a discase that affects the central nervous

After his trainer's death, Beasley was unable to qualify for the Tour. So, he decided to focus his energy on trying to help find a cure for the disease that killed his friend. He got on his bicycle; and, 12 years and 166,000 miles later, he road into Lake Mary on Thursday in hopes others will see the importance of finding a cure. As of

Continued from Page 1 Friday, he already collected more than \$100 from local businesses, including Salon, The Salon Diva. First Health Chiropractic, Tom's Naturals of Lake Mary and Anne Rue Interior.

Beasley's Lake Mary visit is also his first time in Seminole County. Each time he starts a new crosscountry trip, he chooses a different route so he can raise more money.

Every penny that is given to him as a donation goes toward the society. When he needs a place to sleep, he seeks help from local hotels. Often he finds a place that will give him free room and board. If he doesn't, he's out of luck. It's the same with meals. After telling a restaurant manager about what he is doing, he often is invited to eat for free.

"What I do doesn't cost much," Beasley said. "When I need

money, I usually try to find the odd job - yard work or working at a carnival.

Beasley said many people have questioned why a man in his mid-30s is determined to live his life on the road — especially since he has already raised \$78,040. Even those close to the rider sometimes question why he does it.

"My friends all say I should quit and do something regular," he said. "But, when I'm 80, I don't want to look back and think that I had an opportunity to do some-

thing special but I quit half way."
So, Beasley won't give up on his
goal. Broken ribs and a collarbone, head injuries, a bout with bronchitis and collisions with cars and a semi-truck haven't made him quit. And, even though he said it is getting harder and harder for him to get out of bed each morning, he won't stop until he raises \$80,000

for the society.
"We admire him very much," said Joan Welder, office manager for the NMSS Iowa chapter where Beasley sends his donations. "He has helped with our fund-raising tremendously. I admire his dedication to the cause, and I admire him personally. He feels deeply about this disease, and he wants to do what he can to help find a cure."

With only a few weeks a year to rest, Beasley is ready to settle down after he reaches his goal. He hopes to raise the money before his current trip ends in Maine. When it's time to gult, he plans on visiting friends and then settling down in Atlanta, Ga. He also wants to have his book, "The Most Famous Bike Rider Nobody Knows," published by Christmas

As for any regrets about putting his life on hold for more than a

decade. Beasley said there may be a few, especially when it comes to settling down with the right

"I've lost 13 girlfriends because of this," he said. "They all told me they would have married me if I would just quit the trip. But, I couldn't. Most people don't understand why I do it, and it's hard to explain unless you are in my shoes."

According to Smith, one of the largest contributing factors to the budget overage is the economy and lack of revenues based on lower interest rates.

With the economic downturn, the city's revenues are not increasing at the same rate it had in previous years. In the past, \$800,000 in interest earning was seen. That number has sunk to approximately \$200,000.

That money would have bought a lot of police cars," said

Also attributing to the budget woes is personnel-related costs, including significant increases in health insurance, raises and additions to staff. Public safety departments led the way in new hires, fulfilling the need for heightened security due to the war on terror-

"We missed a real opportunity with hiring freezes," said Lessard. However, we still have a number of opportunities to save."

Commissioner Randy Jones agreed, stating, "We have raises every year. It's not out of the ques-

tion not to have them. Companies in the private sector do it all the

Other factors that have attributed to the budget include the effects of Sept. 11 on general liability and property insurance, which increased by 42.6 percent this year. It is unknown what rates for

the 2003-2004 fiscal year will be.

The city also picked up the slack for the police and fire departments pension invest-ments, which have struggled because of the sluggish stock market. The city saw a \$400,000 shortfall this year, and was forced to

dip into its reserves. Although the official results will not be announced until February, this It's not expected to change in the coming year, especially if the market remains at its current level.

According to Smith, the \$1.4 million overage does not include \$700,000 in improvement requests from the fire and police departments, parks and recreations and

Commission will hold a public hearing to adopt a tentative budget and millage Sept. 8, followed by a final budget and millage hearing on Sept. 22.





Too many cooks?: With three congressmen representing Seminole County — 6-term veter-ans Corrine Brown (D-Jacksonville) and John Mica (R-Winter Park), and freshman Tom Feeney (R-Oviedo) — residents have more than fair chance of receiving a hearing at the federal level regarding local issues. There's also the chance that a few congressional egos will be bruised if one of the three takes action on a sensitive local matter. A good case in point is Mica's request to have the federal government take total control of the Sanford Housing Authority (SHA).

News of Mica's proposal broke about 9:30 a.m. Friday. The Orlando Sentinel posted an article on its Web site about noon. Brown's staff, however,

didn't hear of the news until about 4 p.m. and the pro-posal initially got a chilly reception.

"She wasn't happy that she was not consulted," said her spokesman David Simon.

Brown, who counts housing issues as one of her top priorities, later released a statement saying, "The Sanford Housing Authority is indeed in need of help. ... **Both Congressman** Mica and I need to work together to

help the Sanford Housing Authority move out of this troubled status because portions of Sanford fall within both of our congressional districts." She also added that she has been "in constant contact with board members, elected officials, housing residents and my district office is con-

stantly monitoring the situation."

Mica's staff had no comment on the matter other than saying. "The congressman is taking a leadership role." Mica serves as the chairman of the Subcommittee on Criminal Justice, Drug Policy and Human Resources, which includes jurisdiction over HUD policies.

Budget cuts: The news at Orlando City Hall hasn't been good this week. Some 220 city employees were dismissed from their jobs because of budget cuts. Expect similar cuts, albeit much smaller, coming from Sanford City

Hall in the coming weeks.

Kevin Smith, Sanford's finance director, is: working on next year's budget and the city is \$1.4 million short (see Jamie Anderson-Potter's article on Page 1). That number doesn't include the \$700,000 in improvements department directors want for next year. It doesn't take a math whiz to figure out the numbers don't add up. City commissioners will have to find budget items to cut, and unfortunately, I don't see any way to do it without affecting some jobs.

And then there were four: The search for a new Sanford city manager should be complete by Friday, June 20.

The four candidates - James F. Coleman of Lady Lake, Danny Crew of Gastonia, N.C., Al Grieshaber Jr. of Albany, Ga., and James Rose O'Connor of St. Charles, Mo. — will begin arriving Wednesday and Thursday. Thursday will be a "free" day for each of the four to explore the

city and do on-site research.


Mostly likely, commissioners will meet Thursday night without the candidates to discuss their trips to each candidate's current hometown. Commissioner Randy Jones is visiting St. Charles to gather information on the city and O'Conner's performance. Mayor Brady Lessard will do the same in Albany. Commissioner Art Woodruff will visit Gastonia and Commissioner Velma Williams will visit Lady Lake. Commissioner Kevin Hipes must have won the office pool because he'll stay home while his colleagues do the legwork.

On Friday, commissioners will meet individually with each candidate. The commission will then meet publicly Friday night and most likely select a candidate.

Deputy position open: Regardless of who is selected as the city's next top administrator, one of their first personnel decisions will be whether to fill the deputy city manager's position left vacant by Roger Dixon's resignation.

With Dixon's leaving, Andrew Van Gaale is serving as interim city manager, and as such could be considered a front-runner for the position. However, deputy city manager is a relatively new position in the city's hierarchy and Dixon was the first. Faced with a tight budget year, a new city manager may choose not to fill the posi-







Time to pay honor

Flag Day is Saturday

It's feast or famine today. Should I write about Father's Day on Sunday or Flag Day on Saturday? Both deserve the highest honors we can bestow. I could write volumes on the things I learned from my father — I hope every one of you can do the same. Let's remember our fathers, those still with us, and those who have passed.

As I have written these columns on Father's Day for a dozen years, I focus today on Flag Day. The flag should probably be called the United States Flag rather than the American Flag. America consists of Canada and Mexico as well, and they have their

But, for the sake of common reference, I'll call it the American Flag. It has 113 stripes for the 13 original states. (Can you name them?) It has 50 stars for the

50 states.

This is the 226th anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes by the Continental Congress in 1777. Whether Betsy Ross made it or not is a point argued for many years, and not worth going

Why do our military forces display flags when they march into battle? Simple. In the Revolutionary and Civil War, many soldiers had no uniforms. Without a flag flying in front of their marching columns, who would know which side the oncoming force was supporting.

At times, a number of flags fly on the same pole. According to flag tradition, the U.S. flag is at the top. Others are below. In military circles, the U.S. Army flag is second, followed by the U.S. Marine flag, the U.S. Navy flag, the U.S. Air Force flag, and the U.S. Coast Guard Flag. That's also the way proper parades should be aligned, in the order of military service described above.

Since 9-11, we have probably seen more flags flying in our nation than World War II. They are on our cars, flags or decals, they are at our homes, and our businesses. Perhaps on this flag day they will also be placed appropriately at certain grave-

When I think of honoring the U.S. Flag, I think of the days when I covered the police reports for the Seminole Herald. Part of my routine was to go to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, then located at the present Orlando-Sanford International Airport.

The secretary at the sheriff's office was named Mary. It wasn't her job, but she took it upon herself to run the U.S. and Sheriff's Department flags up the poles in front of the sheriff's office. (Eventually, it was assumed she would do it, and no one else tried, even when she was on vacation.)


Mary was a very short senior citizen lady. She would take the folded flags out front and hook them up to the flag lines. She was alone at the time, and could do two things at once, so she would raise the flag, tie down the lines, then stand back and give a military style salute. Not just a whip of the arm, but a bonified salute that lasted long enough for what I assumed was a short prayer.

To me, that was an example of REALLY honoring the flag of the United States. I hope every one of us can give that some consideration on this Flag Day. After all, seeing the flag often inspires us to honor and respect our country and the people who protect us. Isn't that what Mary was doing?

And getting back to Father's Day — isn't protecting the flag and its meaning from tyranny the reason we lost many fathers over the past years?

LONDON — "America the Scary Benda Democracy; Not the country we thought we knew," was the headline last Monday over the editorial column of the American-friendly

Financial Times.

The editorial itself was mostly concerned with the post-Sept. 11 imprisonment of hundreds of illegal aliens for months without benefit of counsel or publicity, saying:

"Many people find the recent behavior of

the United States frightening
— and they are not all French.
... Most countries have chosen
to adjust the balance between
liberty and security since Sept.
11. But in America the adjustment has gone beyond mere
tinkering, to the point where
fundamental values may be
jeopardized."

Meanwhile at home, the focus was on the scary prospect that the White House had doctored intelligence reports to persuade the American people that our very existence was threatened if we did not wipe out Saddam Hussein and the weapons of mass destruction he supposedly had ready to use against us. Last Sunday, administration officials, led by Secretary of State Colin Powell and National Security Adviser Condoleezza Rice, fanned out to the morning public-affairs television shows to tell us to be patient, to trust them. But patience and trust, or

lack of same, as the Financial Times indicates, are not the real problem. The fundamental question Americans have to face is whether the Bush administration is using fear of terrorism, the real and the

exaggerated, to change the nature of American democracy and governance. Are we still the country we think we are?

Do we care? And are we willing to do anything about it?

That question, as it applies to our relationships with the rest of the world, was raised earlier this year during a symposium of the American Political Science Association.
Two scholars, Loch K.

Johnson of the University of Georgia and Kiki Caruson of the University of South Florida, argued that, as the Financial Times did, this is not your father's USA — or President

Bush's father's, either.

Their paper was titled "The Seven Sins of American Foreign Policy." This is their

(1) Ignorance, (2) Lack of Empathy, (3) Isolationism, (4) Unilateralism, (5) Precipitate Military Action, (6) Presidential Imperialism, (7) Arrogance.

None of those words, or categories, are particularly new, but what is new is the combining of the worst tendencies in American history, in a time of great perceived threat, to change us into America the Scary. It is very hard to see ourselves that way. We are used to being loved or believing that we are loved and envied, a shining city on a hill. To many, we now seem to be a menacing fortress on a very high hill. And that shocks us.

It should not, say professors Johnson and Caruson, because among other things, we know very little about other nations. One fact they use in their "Ignorance" section is that our



Foreign Service is the only one in an industrialized country that does not require diplomats to know a single foreign language. It is also possible, they report, to graduate from 55 of our highest-rated universities without taking a history course of any kind.

As far as empathy is concerned, the report focuses on the lack of U.S. aid (other than military) to poor countries (without oil). That's true enough, but our lack of empathy goes much deeper than statistics can probe: We just don't give a damn about the wretched of the Earth because in our hearts we think it's their own fault. If they were smart enough and worked hard enough, they would be ... Americans!

Unilateralism and arrogance in U.S. foreign policy could be seen as hallmarks of this Bush administration. One example used by Johnson and Caruson is that German Chancellor Gerhard Schroeder learned of

America's new doctrine of "pre-emptive war" from a newspaper. But the roots of those traits do go deep into unstudied American history. Congressional attitudes reflect that as well, according to the two political scientists, who wrote:

"Profound issues have arisen over where and when America should use military force in the war against terrorism, including whether lawmakers should set the parameters ... or instead merely hold the president's coat and offer patriotic exhortations from ringside."

In other words, if the United States is becoming scary, the bully of the world, and if this president is literally and dangerously jeopardizing fundamental American values, he and his team are not doing it alone. We are all part of it; the administration is merely bringing out the worst in the American character.



Big reds hitting on the flats this week

From Staff Reports

Large redfish have been roaming the flats this week. Reds ranging from 11-pounds up to 35-pounds have been landed this past

Monday while fishing with Captain Bryan Pahmeier we landed three reds which weighed in at 30-pounds, 24-pounds and 13-pounds. Tuesday produced nine redfish for my charter with the largest weighing in at 19-pounds. Wednesday produced another day of big reds as Alan Sullivan boated two reds which weighed in at 16 and 17 pounds.

There are some important things to remember when trying to catch these large fish. First of all, these fish did not get big by being stupid. It is important to approach these fish with the silence of a stealth fighter. Once you locate a school of reds, be patient and always try to cast across the face of the lead fish while leading him at least 10 to 15 feet. Once you have properly placed the bait wait until your line becomes tight and smack the fish, then hold on. A big red can take anywhere from 20 minutes to an hour to land. After landing the fish it is important to properly revive the fish by holding his tall and moving him side to side until he kicks away. Be sure to watch him swim away so the fish may be enjoyed another day.

Look for the big trout to go on a feeding frenzy after the next full moon. Most trout will spawn and they will be really hungry. This is the time of year when big GATOR trout can be caught. A trout is considered a GATOR when they reach five-pounds or more. It is important to release these large trout, because it takes a long time for them to reach GATOR status. If you like to eat trout the samiler ones (15-22 inches) are the

Post 53 also won the Southeast Regional and World Series In 1997 and was the Regional runner-up in 2001.

Not every turfgrass problem is a disease problem

Not every turfgrass problem is necessary a disease problem. Improper cultural practices are many times responsible for the brown areas that are frequently found in many lawns. Unfortunately, the climate in Florida frequently favors disease

development. Many of these diseases require similar Ferrer environmental conditions to begin, as well as increase in severity and organisms that cause dis-

eases are already present in the turigrass. In such a hostile environment it seems almost impossible for the plants to survive but simple cultural practices that enhance plant vigor and increase tolerance to disease are the key to proper turf health.

Diagnosia

Turf diseases cannot be diagnosed by the shape or color of the spot.

Disease symptoms can be confused with improper cultural practices, pesticide damage, nematode or insect injury. Brown areas that increase in size and spread to new areas may be induced by disease causing organ-

Proper diagnosis of turi

diseases requires laboratory analysis.

> Contributing Factors Diseases can be expected to occur on poorly maintained turf. Imbalances in nitrogen and potassium levels, as well as thatch accumulation, will result in less vigorous, more susceptible turfgrass. Periods of high humidity, over-irrigation, rain,

heavy dew or fog will favor the incidence of many of the fungal diseases of turf as high moisture is needed on the plant surface for infection to take place.

Mowing

Improper mowing height and frequency can weaken the grass and lower its tolerance to disease. Duli mower blades inflict greater tissue damage than sharp blades. The damage is first evident as unsightly white to brown discoloration of the turf 1 to 2 days after mowing. The damaged tissue also provides an avenue through which pathogens may infect the grass. When a disease is active on a particular area of turfgrass, increase the mowing interval and collect clippings to avoid spreading the disease to other areas.

Irrigation

Irrigating early in the morning allows the grass to dry thoroughly before evening. This irrigation schedule reduces the time moisture is present on the leaves. Never water plants late in the afternoon this will keep moisture on the plants for the longest period of time and will contribute to the development of diseases. Turfgrass that enters the night period moist from irrigation is more inclined to become diseased. Do not water turfgrasses lightly on a daily basis walt until the turf begins to show signs of wilt before watering.

Fertilization

The susceptibility of turfgrasses to disease is also affected by nutrition. Properly fertilized grass is more resistant to disease and recovers faster if it should become diseased. In general, moderate fertilization and use of slow-release fertilizers should be practiced.

Chemical Control

Turfgrass diseases can be chemically controlled with proper use of fungicides. A uniform application over the entire planting is usually necessary and will be most effective if done early in disease development. Most

fungicides are effective for a relatively short time, often not more than 14 days.

Sunlight, rain, irrigation water, and mowing affect the rate at which the protective chemical is broken down and removed from the plant. Repeat applications are often necessary to control a disease during periods when weather conditions favor disease. Fungicides should always be used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions on the product label.

Information on the label includes the diseases for which the fungicide is effective, proper rates, cautions with respect to mixing with other chemicals, frequency of application, and safety

precautions.

Some of the fungicides are effective only for control of specific diseases so it is important to obtain an accurate diagnosis in order to select an appropriate fungicide. Fungicides should be applied as needed for disease control as soon as possible after diagnosis.

2 teaspoons peeled and grated fresh

• 1 That red chili, seeded and sliced


• 1 tablespoon Asian sesame oil

 1/3 cup crushed vanilla wafers • 1 1/2 8-ounce tubs fat-free cream cheese, softened

• 1/2 cup sugar

1 tablespoon all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon vanilia

• 1/4 cup refrigerated or frozen egg product, thawed

• 3/4 cup fresh fruit (such as halved grapes, cut-up pineapple, cut-up peeled kiwifruit or papaya, red raspberries, blueberries, sliced strawberries or plums, or orange and grapefruit sections)

• 2 tablespoons chopped fresh mint

• 1 tablespoon chopped fresh

• 1 small summer melon (such as cantaloupe or honeydew)

• 8 to 10 ounces thinly sliced smoked or oven-roasted turkey breast (about 16 slices)

8 fresh chives, unipped

 Sprinkle of ground red pepper (optional)

Place the strawberries in a blender.

Process until pureed. Place in a small serving bowl. Add the yogurt or sour cream, honey, mint and chopped chives.

Cut the melon in half, and

scoop out the seeds. Place the melon, cut side down, on a cutting board.

Using a sharp knife, remove and discard the rind.

Cut melon into 3/4-inch thick wedges.

Wrap each melon wedge with

a slice of turkey.

Top with the snipped chives and sprinkle with the pepper, if using.
