Hicks charges the hospital failed to have on hand material and equipment necessary to diagnose the condition of his mother, who was admitted suffering from a cerebrovascular accident, according to the complaint. Court papers additionally charge the hospital failed to properly treat Mrs. Hicks as her condition worsened.


















MOSCOW (UPI) — Small groups of Soviet dissidents tried to mark Human Rights Day with silent demonstrations in Moscow and Leningrad, but police broke up the rallies and detained 15 to 20 men and women. Two dissident sources in Leningrad said a tear gaslike substance dispersed a crowd of about 50 people who gathered Monday outside a former cathedral now used as the Museum of the History of Religion and

The Leningrad group had been standing outside the old cathedral for just about one minute when the choking furnes spread through the air, but it was not clear how the gas was generated.

#### Gold Soars To New Levels

LONDON (UPI) - Gold soared to new record opening levels in London and Zurich today, triggered by renewed concern about oil prices. The dollar fell back in Europe.

Gold jumped \$8 in Zurich to \$439.00 and rocketed by

\$11.75 overnight in London to open at \$443.25 - a record opening price in both centers.

One dealer in Zurich anticipated spot prices might touch \$450 in the course of the day.
"Gold made a sharp jump today because there is a
feeling on the market that the Americans won't hold a gold auction before the OPEC meeting in Caracas on Dec. 17," a Zurich dealer said.

#### Canada Oil Supplies Tight

OTTAWA (UPI) - Two of Canada's major oil suppliers will discontinue discounts on home-heating fuel to senior citizens, says NDP member Stanley Knowles, and Prime Minister Joe Clark said he would

Imperial Oil Lts. and Shell Canada will be asked to senior citizens, Clark told the House of Commons

Knowles said the two firms have told distribution agents to discontinue the discounts and he said the firms' action must be "offensive" to Clark since the government recently asked Imperial to explain a 2.4 percent increase in gasoline prices.

#### Unions 'Not Responsible' For Wildcats: High Court

WASHINGTON (UPI) — In a victory for the United Mine Workers, the Supreme Court has ruled a parent union is not responsible for wildcat strikes by local The justices Monday unanimously held labor unions

have no legal duty to take steps to stop wildcat strikes ov their members. The ruling upheld a federal appeals court decision the UMW was not liable for nearly \$500,000 in damages from a series of local strikes in southern West Virginia from 1969 through 1973. However, a \$722,000 judgment against three local unions remains intact.

#### Animals Aid Cancer Search

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Research into cancers that strike animals has had more immediate success than research directed at similar human illness. Agriculture Department officials told Congress Monday their researchers have discovered Marek's disease of poultry, a leukemia-like malignancy, was caused by a virus. The first commercially applicable vaccine

developed for use against any such cancer has reduced annual losses from the poultry disease from \$200 million to about \$30 million. Leukemia in cattle also has been found to have a viral origin.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - The courts will have to decide whether it's fair for automobile insurance companies to charge men and singles higher premiums than women or

married couples. The major insurance companies filed an administrative suit Monday challenging Insurance Commissioner Bill Gunter's order keeping them from using a driver's sex, marital status and academic achievement in setting rates after March 1. The Insurance Services Office, a New York-based rating service representing 342 companies, asked the Department of ustration's Division of Administrative Hearings to strib

down the Gunter order. Similar petitions were filed by State Farm, Florida's largest auto insurer; Allstate, the second largest; Government Employees Insurance Co.; Lumberman's Mutual Casualty and United States Fidelity and Guaranty.

Whichever side loses in the administrative proceeding is bound to appeal to the 1st District Court of Appeal. Companies have traditionally charged young men more than young women and singles more than married persons and sometimes offered discounts to youngsters making good grades in schools or people with college degrees.

Gunter ordered the practices halted, saying they are "unfairly discriminatory." He did say companies could continue

to use age as a factor. Gunter vowed to fight the challenges.
"Those companies which brought the suit have sent a clear message to Florida motorists: When it comes to automobile insurance reform, they are part of the problem, not the solution," Gunter said. Gunter is accused of violating Administrative Procedures Act requirements in imposing the rule, including failing to pre-pare an adequate economic impact statement.
