

Ford Proposes Tax Increase To Take Effect Next Year

WASHINGTON (AP) - Social Security will take a bigger bite from workers' paychecks in 1977 if a proposal by President Ford is approved by Congress. And congressional approval seems likely

Ford will ask the Congress in his budget message next Wednesday to increase the Social Security tax rate from 5.85 per cent to 6.15 per cent, effective Jan. 1, 1977. That would mean that a worker would pay \$6.15 out of each \$100 he earns for Social Security compared to \$5.85 this year. The worker's payment would be matched by his

Ford's budget also will include an increase in the defense budget, an expected tax decrease and a provision requiring Medicare patients to pay more of their own

Angola Aid Vote Delayed

WASHINGTON (AP) - House leaders, predicting that Congress will cut off U.S. aid to factions fighting in Angola, have decided to delay a final vote on the issue so the break won't come while Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger is in Moscow.

The final House vote on a cutoff of U.S. aid now is sched-The vote will be on Congress' final approval of a \$112.3 billion defense appropriation bill to which the Senate has tacked a rider prohibiting any further U.S. aid to Angola



Public Housing Tenants May Sue Over Charges

JACKSONVILLE (AP)—A group of public-housing tenants says it will file suit against excess utility charges if federal officials continue to permit the charges to be assessed against persons living in the state's 77

The issue was a focal point of a meeting Friday between Florida Tenants Organization leaders and R.W. Buskirk, director of the area office of the U.S. Department of dousing and Urban Development (HUD). Buskirk said officials of a housing project determine the normal utilities usage and pay that amount with public funds. Any excess must be paid by the tenant.

Loan Cuts Investigated

TALLAHASSEE (AP)-House Education Chairman Richard Hodes says he is upset that student loans were cut off to several thousand Floridians who were counting on the money to go to college. Hodes, D-Tampa, announced Friday that the Education Committee is investigating the Education Department's handling of the student loan fund. Zoological Park The Logical Site

A proposal to establish an educational nature center for children in Seminole County has merit. However, some wisdom in selecting a site for such a center appears to be lacking.

Mrs. Bettie Palmer, coordinator of science and PHOTO FORUM education for the Seminole County School Board said she envisions such a nature center which can be used by all principals of county schools. Top officials of the school board and the Board of County Commissioners met last week and

discussed joint participation in the project with Big Tree Park East as the proposed site to be developed into the nature center. County Commission Chairman Michael Hattaway and Commissioners Richard Williams and

Harry Kwiatkowski agreed to the concept and to cooperate with the school board. While we completely concur with the project

we must take exception to the proposed Big Tree Park East location for same. Primarily because the Central Florida Zoological Society has already spent in excess of

\$350,000 on approximately 100 acres of property just north of Sanford, on U.S. 17-92, which was left as environmentally sound as is possible. According to John Sobik, newly elected president of the Zoological Society, the zoological park, in itself, was "solely designed to be used by

the citizens and students of Seminole County at no At the park, there are roads, a water system. Mrs. Elsie Myer, Mid Florida group shelters, parking areas, sanitation facilities Lakes: "We always come and soon-to-be-completed nature trails and with friends when they come boardwalks.

Therefore, with these facilities already at our disposal, why spend more hard-to-come-by tax dollars to duplicate the work that has already been done at the zoological park?

Doesn't it make sense to perhaps add a few more dollars to the zoological society's coffers and let that organization expand to the extent that its facilities meet the criteria set forth by the school board and the county commission?

It's also worth mentioning that a service contract already exists between the school board and the zoological society, therefore students can and do visit the zoo free of charge on their field

We sincerely feel the school board, county commission and zoological society should get their collective heads together, decide what is needed to improve the zoo park to bring it up to the requirements for an educational nature center and proceed accordingly.

It's ridiculous to spend any more tax dollars on another park when we've got one right in our back

Eldridge Beach, director of the Florida Highway Patrol (FHP), parents are urged to "impress upon young mini-bike and go-cart operators of the dangers of improper maneuvers such as turning without signaling, driving without

lights or failing to stop for stop signs." Operators of any motor driven vehicle must be at least 15 years of age and have a license, Col. Beach said. Too, until the operator becomes 16 years of age, he will have a restricted license requiring daylight operation only and he may not ride a motor driven bike rated more than five-brake Mini-bike operators are also reminded that they

are required to wear an approved crash helmet and eye protection in the State of Florida. In order to operate in public roadways, Col. Beach said, these vehicles must be equipped with headlight, a tail light, tag-light, stop light, horn, rear view mirror and adequate brakes. 





Zoological Park The Logical Site

A proposal to establish an educational nature center for children in Seminole County has merit. However, some wisdom in selecting a site for such a center appears to be lacking.

Mrs. Bettie Palmer, coordinator of science and education for the Seminole County School Board said she envisions such a nature center which can be used by all principals of county schools. Top officials of the school board and the Board

of County Commissioners met last week and discussed joint participation in the project with Big Tree Park East as the proposed site to be developed into the nature center. County Commission Chairman Michael Hat-

taway and Commissioners Richard Williams and Harry Kwiatkowski agreed to the concept and to cooperate with the school board. While we completely concur with the project,

we must take exception to the proposed Big Tree Park East location for same.

Primarily because the Central Florida Zoological Society has already spent in excess of \$350,000 on approximately 100 acres of property just north of Sanford, on U.S. 17-92, which was left as environmentally sound as is possible. According to John Sobik, newly elected

president of the Zoological Society, the zoological park, in itself, was "solely designed to be used by the citizens and students of Seminole County at no

If so, please remember that these vehicles are regulated the same as any other motor vehicle. According to Col. Eldridge Beach, director of the Florida Highway Patrol (FHP), parents are urged to "impress upon young mini-bike and go-cart operators of the dangers of improper maneuvers, such as turning without signaling, driving without

lights or failing to stop for stop signs." Operators of any motor driven vehicle must be at least 15 years of age and have a license, Col. Beach said. Too, until the operator becomes 16 years of age, he will have a restricted license requiring daylight operation only and he may not ride a motor driven bike rated more than five-brake

Mini-bike operators are also reminded that they are required to wear an approved crash helmet and eye protection in the State of Florida. In order to operate in public roadways, Col Beach said, these vehicles must be equipped with headlight, a tail light, tag-light, stop light, horn, rear view mirror and adequate brakes. Too, they must have a current motor vehicle inspection sticker and license tag.
