

## **Good Eating Programs Vital** To Youngsters

In the rush of back-to-school days, don't let your youngsters lapse into the bad eating habits that cause almost half the nation's teenagers to suffer from malnutrition in the midst of plenty.

Dr. Evelyn B. Spindler, nutritionist for the U. S. Department of Agriculture, estimates six out of ten teenage girls and four out of ten boys have poor diets and serious nutritional deficiencies. Poor eating habits among these youngsters result in lowered resistance to illness, frequent colds, skin eruptions, irritability, lack of energy, and unusual fatigue.

What are the reasons for this, and what can be done aabout it? Dr. Spindler blames teenage undernourishment largely on skipping breakfast and filling up on snacks made up mainly of full of sugar, fat, and starch es, but very little protein, minerals and vitamins.

# Danger Season Nears

From October on until the spring rains start again, somewhere in Seminole County someone will let a trash fire escape.

The spring and summer rains, along with Florida's long warm season and fast growing vegetation, create a special problem. Winds will be high and underbrush brittle and brown making it easy for wildfires to be started which will affect all of us since they waste an important natural resource.

Maybe you have been burning trash all summer in the back yard and still haven't been responsible for starting a fire. Yet you must remember that in a month or two, when the grass turns brown and the winds start to blow, a single little spark will start a wildfire.

Records from Seminole County Forest Ranger Albert Harris show that there have been 55 less wildfires to date this year than in 1962. Cooperation from residents has helped reduce the number from 148 to 93 and further cooperation. which will continue to lessen the number, will mean a great deal to the Forestry Service.

The Rangers, in turn, stand ready to assist any landowner with his burning or fire line plowing if only he will request it.
