uitcase stuffed with money and stashed in a chicken coop put another twist today in the bizarre tale of the Rev. Jim Jones and the mass suicide of his 900 blindly loyal followers. The U.S. troops who stuffed the blackened, swollen bodies into green plastic sacks and sent them back to the United States in aluminum cases burned their possibly contaminated uniforms and prepared to return to their home bases today.

Meanwhile, in Washington, the FBI reported finding a short, handwritten note of despair on the body of Peoples Temple leader

or did not write it'

Rev. Jim Jones. "The note was turned over to the FBI for examination in the FBI crime laboratory to try and ascertain who may have written the note," the spokesman said. "As of this point.... we cannot say for a fact that Jones did or did not write it."

Handwriting experts were working to clear up the matter, but, the spokesman said, there was a paucity of Jones handwriting samples. The two-paragraph communication "written from one person to another person" - could not be classified as a suicide note. However, the tone was described as one of

Prokes were told to take the suitcase to an unspecified embassy. The suitcase later was found to contain a letter to the Soviet Embas-

For the record, the cold numbers were \$ members of the People's Temple sect dead. These included 908 Americans and one Guyanese citizen who died at Jonestown, three of them - including Jones - of gunshot wounds, and the rest apparently from cyanide. The appalling toll appeared to have coured up one mystery - the whereabouts of hun-dreds of sect members who seemed to be missing after the Guyanese government's initial, grossly inaccurate count of 400 dead. But it was still unclear how Carter, 28, of Boise, Idaho, and his two companiens ob-tained guns and escaped the mass suicide.


The Carter brothers and Prokes opened the suitcase in the commune chicken coop, Tim Carter said. They found 35 to 40 pounds of money and a letter to the Soviet Embasay. The Carter brothers said they stashed the money in the coop. Guyanese authorities later confinented if confiscated it.

As Carter told his story to reporters on the veranda of a ramshackle hotel in the heart of Georgetown, Gerald Parks, 48, of Ukiah, Calif., who with his wife, two children and mother defected from the commune, verheard Carter's remarks.

Parks said Tim Carter, brother Michael, 30, and Prokes, 32, of Modesto, Calif. were "part of the leadership clique, part of the elite crowd" surrounding Jones. "It seems funny." Parks said. "that we had

to escape with our lives at state, and these three guys walked out with these and Parks was the husband of Patricia Parks,





## Sadat: Sooner Or Later A Treaty Will Be Signed

#### **By United Press International**

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat says peace negotiations may drag on beyond the Dec. 17 target date for an agreement but "sooner or later" a treaty will be signed. Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin says he sees no need to send his negotiators back to Washington.

"I cannot set a date, but I am sure of one thing, sooner or later we shall be signing an agreement," Sadat said. "How long it will take, I do not know."

#### Pope Appeal: Human Dignity

VATICAN CITY (UPI) - Pope John Paul II has openly challenged the forces of religious oppression in a landmark speech that church observers said was aimed at the rulers of his native Poland and other Soviet-bloc countries. The 58-year-old former Archbishop of Krakow, his voice loud and sometimes trembling with emotion, issued a powerful world-wide appeal Sunday for freedom of religion and human dignity.

#### Teng: 'Time Is Ripe'

TOKYO (UPI) - Vice Premier Teng Hsiaoping said publicly the late Mao Tse-tung was wrong when he appointed Hua Kuo-feng as premier and that the "time is ripe" to correct the error, Japanese reports said today. But Teng, the architect of China's post-Mao turn toward the Western world and its drive for economic development, denied there was a schism in China's leadership and discounted fears that new political convulsions would sweep China.

### Fraud Charges Spur Unrest

TEHRAN (UPI) - Charges that Iran's political elite had siphoned off \$2.4 billion of the nation's oil revenue and stashed it in foreign banks triggered new unrest today. Earlier clashes in provincial towns killed at least 14 persons. Striking employees of the Central Bank who disclosed the alleged foreign exchange transfers refused to return to work today. They were joined by employees of the National Iranian Oil Co. central offices, who began a partial 15-day strike today to press political demands.







## Those MiGs And The U.S.

The Carter Administration has reluctantly confirmed reports of Soviet nuclear planes in Cuba - reports made by columnists Roland Evans and Robert Novak, and by L. Edgar Prina of the Copley News Service's Washington bureau.

"It is believed that a number of MiG-23 aircraft are in Cuba," the State Department said. "The matter is under ... investigation .... "

And the Copley News Service learned from official sources that the administration is trying to decide whether to ignore the development or make a strong protest to the Soviet Union.

Meanwhile, as an indication he will pursue the former policy, the president spoke of improved relations with the Soviets and referred to progress in nuclear arms negotiations.

Even so, Mr. Carter has made a prudent decision to resume reconnaissance flights over Cuba

The ominous significance of this development, of course, is the offensive character of the MiG-23 now stationed 90 miles off our southern coast.

It is not a defensive fighter; it is the nuclearattack aircraft that comprises the Warsaw Pact's most advanced nuclear-delivery tactical strike force; its 2,400-mile range could threaten the eastern half of the United States.

Moreover, because the MiG-23 model in question has never before been delivered to a Soviet ally, it is not unreasonable to assume that those now stationed in Cuba are manned by Soviet pilots.

The people should have no misunderstanding about what this means: The Soviet MiG-23s confront the United States with more than a calculated, provocative threat; they are a disdainful violation of Moscow's agreement following the 1962 Cuban missile crisis, which prohibited the introduction of any nuclear-capable weapons.

In his report to the nation about this on Nov. 20, 1962, President Kennedy referred explicitly to the Soviet agreement "...to halt the further introduction of ... all weapons systems capable of offensive use...

One can only guess why Moscow would take such an alarming step in the full knowledge that it would jeopardize acceptance by Congress and the people of a new strategic arms limitation treaty reported to be almost completed after years of negotiation

A possible explanation is the classical Soviet gambit of gaining an advantage in exchange for restoring the status quo that was disturbed by an outrageous Soviet move.

Remember, the Soviet reward for removing its offensive missiles from Cuba in 1962 was a U.S. promise not to threaten Castro and rem NATO missiles from Turkey.

The president should lose no time in making clear to Moscow that it risks much more by its MiG-23s in Cuba than it stands to gain. To be sure, radically changed conditions, in-

cluding Soviet superiority now in certain strategic weapons, preclude another U.S.-U.S.S.R. showdown like that of 1962. But this not to say the president is without potent persuasions. He can and should advise Moscow that the

painful consequences of not removing the MiG-23s will include a rupture of detente, an end of the SALT II agreement prospects, and a freeze on trade and equipment the Russians need so badly. One Savvy **Babbitt** 

PHOENIX, Ariz. (NEA) - The exceptions popularity and versatility of one of the country's most promising new politicians, Arizona Gov. Bruce Babbitt, was exemplified by his back-toback appearances at a pair of recent parties

At the first event, a cocktail party at a fashionable resort hotel in a wealthy Phoenix suburb, Babbitt mingled easily with an elite group of silk-suited business executives and their carefully coifed wives.

Slightly more than an hour later, he was received with equal enthusiasm in the ballroom of a downtown hotel where Hispanics and blacks were heavily represented at the annual awards dinner of the city's anti-poverty program.

Elected to his first full four-year term as governor in this month's balloting, the 40-yearold Democrat was barely visible in the crowd of new political faces. But political insiders already have taken note of Babbitt and his prospects for future advancement

One of the Carter administration's senior political operatives, who met hundreds of Democratic office-seekers while traveling throughout the country during the 1978 campaign calls Babbitt "the most impressive politician I've seen all year."

When Larry Sabate, author of a just-published book on the "new breed" of govenors elected in recent years, was asked in a recent interview to name some outstanding state executives, Babbitt was the first he cited.

Elected Arizona's attorney general in 1974, Babbitt quickly became a popular statewide figure as a result of his successful prosecution of organized crime figures, violators of anti-trust laws, land-fraud swindlers and other whitecollar criminals.

Democratic Gov. Raul H. Castro, also elected in 1974, resigned in October 1977, after being nominated by President Carter to be ambassador to Argentina. Because Arizona electa no lieutenant governor, Castro was succeeded by Wesley Bolin, the 68-year-old secretary of state. After serving as governor for only five months,

Bolin died early this year. Babbitt, next in the at 7:30 a.m. on March 4 to be told I was gover-

Perhpas the most valuable assets displayed during his brief tenure as appointed governor have been a sense of humility and an unusual measure of sincerity, both of which have inspired public confidence and trust.

During the recent gubernatorial campaign, Babbitt became the first Democrat in at least three decades to win the endorsement of every major newspaper in the state - including this city's Arizona Republic, which traditionally has preferred conservative Republicans.

That action disappointed Babbitt's Republican opponent, businessman Evan Mecham, who secribed the governor as an "ultra, ultra freespending liberal." A GOP leader in the state legislature characterized Babbitt, an avid hiker. as "Jerry Brown with a backpack."

U.S. Rep. Richard Kelly, 52, R-New Port Richey, married his former secretary and ex-Sanfordite Judy Wilder Foley, 28, on Thankagiving Day in the House of Representatives Chapel in Washington. It was in the spring of 1976 that the former Mrs. Foley, who had been a member of the junior class at minole High School in 1999, joined Kelly's staff as an \$8,000-a-year case worker in the congressman's Altamonte Springs office.

His local office has since been moved to the Longwood Village Shopping Center in Longwood. Mrs. Foley, while a Kelly case-worker, enrolled in short-hand class at Seminole Community College. But, before she could complete the course, she was transferred to Kelly's Washington office as his personal secretary and her salary was raised from \$8,000 annually to \$16,000.

The new Mrs. Kelly was previously married a young man who had been a Seminole High School lassmate. She has a son from that marriage. Kelly and his third wife of 17 years, Lorraine, were still married, and the parents of two children, a son and a daughter, when Mrs. Foley joined the congressman's staff. Kelly also has two daughters

from one of his two previous marriages. In

biographical information released by the congressman, there is no mention of these two daughters. Early in his political career, Kelly was the subject

of Articles of Impeachment against him by the Florida House of Representatives. The impeachment hearings, held from June 14, 1963 to Sept. 24, 1963 before the Florida Senate were not

After it became known that Mrs. Foley's salary was doubled when she was promoted from caseworker to personal secretary, a Kelly press aide announced that part of the additional money was to cover her moving expenses from Florida to Washington and her salary was reduced to to \$12,000

Shortly thereafter she went to work to the Senate Banking committee and then was employed by the Heritage Foundation for a time. Last summer Kelly's wife, Lorraine, agreed to a divorce. The divorce hearing was held on a weekend

The Hai Hong is not the sort of ship that invokes the romance of the seas. It has acquired a certain significance on its. current voyage, however, that points up one of the more distressing aspects of the human condition in today's world and the extent to which efforts to help can be complicated by

Out of Singapore and of Panamanian registry, the scruffy freighter has been plying the waters of Southeast Asia seeking to unload a human cargo, some 2,500 former residents of Vietnam. Such people are nothing new to the countries of the area. Camps, particularly in Thailand and Malayasia, are overflowing with fugitives from the Communist victory in

But the Hai Hong's passengers are not the usual "boat people" who for the past three years have been seeking freedom by sea, frequently finding death. They are for the most part ethnic Chinese. And they are believed to have bought their way out of Vietnam.

As a consequence, the countries which with varying degrees of reluctance have been havens are taking the position that the Hai Hong's passengers are not refugees but emigrants. As such, they are not wanted and condemned to remain aboard the ancient ship in what press reports describe as horrendous condition Governments of the area and in the West and particularly United Nations authorities are / disturbed by what they see in the voyage of the Hai Hong. The flow of refugees has been increasing of late coincident with the worsening relations between Hanoi and Peking. Chinese from the once large and largely affluent community that had dominated Vietnamese commerce have become increasingly numerous.

It will provide you some general guidelines on what you can do about your diet to help prevent the buildup of fatty-cholesterol

Prior to her election, which she won with a margin of more than 10,000 votes, Mrs. Jamieson had practiced law

# Sanford Approves Plan To Widen Sewage System

A plan to extend Sanford's lakefront sewage treatment plant to serve Lake Mary and the rural northern portion of Seminole of the state legislature. The expanded system would cover an area from the northern boundary of the county to the Wekiya County was unanimously approved by the Sanford City Commission Monday.

The plan was developed by a committee made up of representatives from Lake Mary, Sanford and the county. The plan will be forwarded to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for final approval, according to Paul Porter, engineering consultant with Clark, Diets and Associates. The Sanford Commission was required to approve the plan

before it was forwarded to the federal Environmental Protection Agency, because Sanford is the "lead applicant" for the plan. That means that Sanford is asking for approval of the plan in its


However, once expansion of the treatment system is complete, an authority will be formed made up of representatives of all the governmental entities involved to operate the system, said Porter. Formation of such an authority will require a special act


Of that total cost, the federal government will fund up to 75 percent or \$5,62,600, Porter told the commission. The local share of that expansion would be \$2,792,700, according to Porter.

By 1980, when the expansion is expected to be completed, the cost per household in Sanford would be \$11.50, according to Porter. However, that does not mean the average sewer bill for a Sanford customer would be that high.




