

change in the fish population. The presence of people and the development of land along the St. Johns has tremendously increased the amount of plant nutrients, mainly nitrates and phosphates, speeding the growth of all plant life.

Marshes and meadows along the river, which once served to filter runoff water by drawing off the nutrients before they reached the water, have been developed for farming and housing.

Besides reducing the amount natural water purification, people have added tons of nutrients to the water by filling it with partially treated sewage effluent and runoff from cattle pastures and city streets. The river might have coped with the increase in nutrients, Moody says, but in the interest of easier boating, the

State Attorney Indicts Teacher In Paddling

dicted on a charge of committing battery when she disciplined a third grader last month, allegedly bruising him severely.

Elsa Marie Caskey, 30, of 1387 Sacramento St., Deltona, was to be issued a summons today to appear in County Court to answer charges she committed battery on May 15 by paddling Wayne Foley, an 8-yearold residing for the summer with his father, Ralph Foley, at 1806 S. Maple Ave., Sanford.

Foley is the stepson of Congressman Richard Kelly, R-New Port Richey, and had come to Sanford and attended school here only two weeks before the paddling incident, police say.

Sanford Police Sgt. W.R. Bernosky charges the child was paddled twice by Caskey on May 15, once in the morning for allegedly shoving another child and once in the afternoon for allegedly punching another child. Photos of Foley taken by Seminole Medical Examiner G.V. Garay at Seminole Memorial Hospital show the youth's buttocks were severely bruised after school on May 15.

Assistant State Attorney Steven Johnson said the child has recovered from the bruises without suffering

NEW DELHI, India (UPI) - Soviet advisers confined Babrak Karmal to his official residence after the president of the Moscow-backed Afghan regime tried to kill himself. Asian diplomatic sources said today. The 53-year-old president, whom Moscow installed in a coup last December, was not allowed to leave the presidential palace without permission from his Soviet advisers, the sources said.

Radio Pakistan and Indian officials confirmed that Karmal attempted suicide last Friday and that a shootout occurred when Soviet guards tried to disarm him. One of his Afghan guards was killed and two others suffered injuries, they said.

It was not immediately clear how the Afghan president had tried to kill himself.

Cape Town Streets Reopen

CAPE TOWN, South Africa (UPI) - Authorities today reopened streets through Cape Town's riot-torn mixed-race townships where heavily armed police patrolled under orders to "show no mercy." A police spokesman said a firebomb gutted an empty passenger train car causing a suspension of commuter

rail service for several hours but that no other incidents were reported. Despite the lifting of the travel ban, traffic was light in the debris littered townships, which still bore the scars of South Africa's worst racial disturbances since

Casualty figures compiled from hospitals said at least 42 people were killed in the rioting but unofficial sources said the final figure could be as high as 70 dead and more than 250 wounded.



National Newspaper Leader Killed En Route To Daytona

COMMERCE, Ga. (UPI) — Charles H., "Chub" Smith, president and publisher of the Knoxville (Tenn.) Journal and a national leader on many newspaper industry issues, was killed Wednesday when his World War II vintage warplane lost a wing and crashed during a storm.

The 42-year-old Smith was en route to Daytona Beach, Fla., to join vacationing family members when the Navy Bearcat nosedived into the ground and burst into flames near a cornfield one mile north of Com-



Mount St. Helens To Get New Top?

VANCOUVER, Wash. (UPI) - A glowing lava dome at the base of Mount St. Helens' crater has doubled in size since it was spotted four days ago. Scientists say it could be the birth of a new summit - or it might be blasted out by another eruption. By day, the dome, pushed out of the volcano's throat by the rising of thick lava, glows a pale yellow. By night the glow

turns a dull red. When it was first seen last Sunday by a helicopter crew, the dome, appearing after the volcano's third major eruption last week, was about 150 feet high. But as clear weather returned to the region Tuesday and Wednesday for the first time since the mountain's May 18 eruption, the dome was observed by the U.S. Geological

Survey to have grown to nearly 300 feet.

BOSTON (UPI) - Cholesterol is an important contributor to heart problems but another fat compound found in the blood stream - triglyceride - has no effect on the development of heart disease, a study published today said. Even high levels of triglyceride, an energy storehouse made

of fatty acid and glycerol, can safely go untreated in otherwise healthy people, the study said in a recommendation that drew mmediate criticism from heart specialists. The New England Journal of Medicine study named cholesterol as a key in the development of heart problems. The research followed a controversial report by the National Academy of Sciences which ostensibly cleared cholesterol as a



"Castro Scores On Mr. Carter

No one at the White House or the State Department wants to admit it, of course, but the truth is that Fidel Castro has been running up the score on a befuddled Jimmy Carter. Incredibly, Castro has accomplished this by manipulating what should have been an unqualified political disaster for Havana — the exodus of more than 112,000 Cuban refugees since April 20.

For most of the time since then, Castro has deftly controlled the play in his confrontation with Washington. He deliberately refused to permit diversion of any significant number of refugees to other nations in the Western Hemisphere. Just as deliberately, he rebuffed every effort to establish, in Cuba, a suitable American screening process that would have imposed a measure of order and legality. And finally, he exploited the refugee exodus to rid himself of assorted criminals and other social undesirables.

In the face of all this, Mr. Carter appeared ever more helpless and inept. His initial efforts to halt the "freedom flotilla" proved embarrassingly futile. Unable to stem the flow, the president proclaimed that the refugees would be welcomed with "an open heart and open arms." This declaration was followed shortly by another attempt to choke off the parade of boats from Mariel by fining boat owners and impounding their vessels. Since enforcement of this policy began, more than 20,000 additional Cubans have arrived

According to the latest State Department count, 9,220 Cubans with criminal backgrounds have been discovered among the 112,534 refugees who have arrived to date. Of these, 677 are considered hardened criminals guilty of acts which would constitute felonies in the United States. When screening is completed on all the Cubans, the number of hardened criminals may rise to double or triple the current figure.

Thus, even if the administration excuses the cause is responsible for the destabilized hungry kids who stole chickens and the unemployed adults convicted of petty black market dealings, there are likely to be as many as 2,000 Cubans ineligible for political asylum on any

Failure to deport these criminals would do more than impose unwarranted burdens or even dangers on the American people. It would also diminish further the already shrinking support for thday. That gives the United States — which granting asylum to any political refugees, no with its 22 percent stake is the bank's largest matter how deserving.

So, Mr. Carter should demand that Fidel Castro accept the return of hardened criminals. In the likely event that Castro refuses, President Carter ought to see to it that they end up in Cuba anyway, even if they have to be pushed through the gate at the Guantanamo Bay Naval Base.

McNamara To Leave **Big Shoes**

Ex-Offenders Can Start A New Life

Employers willing to give ex-offenders who are on parole or probation a chance under a new program in Seminole County will be eligible for a 50 percent income tax write off for the amount of salary paid.

Interested businessmen may contact Martin P. Bacon Sr. job developer for the State Department of Offender Rehabilitation program. Bacon is in his office at 115 N. Oak Ave., Sanford, from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday on the first two weeks of the month and for the balance of the month he is out contacting employers. He can be contacted by calling 322-7579.

Bacon is a volunteer donating his time and effort to trying to help ex-offenders get back on the right track by finding them

"This program is good for the welfare of the community and beneficial to the taxpayer as well as the persons being helped,"

Some of his clients have been sentenced while in other cases adjudication was withheld. All are screened thoroughly before being referred to an employer and are under supervision. In order to provide a tax break for the employer the employee must have been sentenced or if adjudication has been withheld must be a Vietnam veteran, a woman on relief or disabled,

During the first month in his position, Bacon said he has placed eight persons on parole or probation in jobs and the program has been successful.

"I work hand-in-hand with the parole or probation officers in referral of clients for jobs," he said. Participating in the program are small local businesses as well as large national

Bacon has among his clients skilled as well as unskilled men and women. "Some have had experience as electricians, plumbers, carpenters, welders or office workers," he said. In the case of one 19-year-old first offender, Bacon learned he had previously been an apprentice electrician so he called the electrical worker's union and was able to get the youth a job at a good wage.

Bacon's clients receive the prevailing wage in whatever job they are in, which could be from minimum wage up. The program is funded by a grant from the state.

"It's a good opportunity for someone who wants to get squared away," Bacon said. "I can usually tell people who really want to work when I talk with them. I don't mess with those who aren't serious about it. But if they are, I'll do my best to find them a job."—JANE CASSELBERRY





\$50 Million For Bay Bridge

Approved By U.S. House

WASHINGTON (UPI) - An amendment providing up to \$50 million in federal emergency funds to begin repairs to the Sunshine Skyway Bridge over the mouth of Tampa Bay has been approved by the House.

A 1,200-foot section of the bridge's southbound lanes fell into the sea May 9 when a freighter rammed a bridge support. Thirty-five persons lost their lives when a bus and a half dozen other vehicles plunged

Rep. C. W. "Bill" Young, R-Fla., said the amendment provides that if the final cost of rebuilding the bridge exceeds \$50 million, the remaining amount will come from the state's interstate highway funds.

Budget Boosts Judges' Pay

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - The supplemental state budget now awaiting Gov. Bob Graham's approval contains pay raises of nearly \$12,000 for Florida's seven Supreme Court justices and \$9,302 for the five public service commissioners.

Sen. Ken Myers, a Miami attorney who once filed a lawsuit to protect his right to represent clients before the PSC, initiated the \$49,748 salary for the commissioners, putting them on a par with District Courts of Appeal judges.

Ethics Group Gives Rulings

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - The Ethics Commission says Charlotte County Sheriff Alan LeBeau should be fined and reprimanded for using a county generator while building his house, but that getting deputies to help him was okay.

The commission voted 4-3 Wednesday to find LeBeau guilty of violating the public officials' code of conduct by using his position for personal gain. It recommended that Gov. Bob Graham fine him \$750 and issue a public reprimand.

The commissioners found former Margate Mayor John Zerweck guilty of a conflict of working for the city's biggest developer at the same time he was in office. They said he should not be punished, however, because he made a good faith attempt to avoid the conflict.

They found probable cause to believe Clearwater City Councilman Richard Tenney abused his office to arrange a meeting with Thomas "Tip" O'Neill, speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Insurance Company Puzzled

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - An official of one of the largest auto insurance companies operating in Florida says he does not know if a retroactive reenactment of the state's excess profits law will be challenged in court.

"We don't even have a copy of the law and have heard nothing from the Insurance Department," Edward Utley, regional vice president of Government Employees Insurance Co., said Wednesday. "We'll see what the insurance commissioner's in-

structions are for reporting," Utley said. Insurance Commissioner Bill Gunter said he is going to order the companies to return the excess profits they owed under the old law, which was thrown out as invalid in a suit brought by GEICO and others.
