## \$50 Million For Bay Bridge Approved By U.S. House

WASHINGTON (UPI) — An amendment providing up to \$50 million in federal emergency funds to begin repairs to the Sunshine Skyway Bridge over the mouth of Tampa Bay has been approved by the House. A 1,200-foot section of the bridge's southbound lanes fell into the sea May 9 when a freighter rammed a bridge support. Thirty-five persons lost their lives when a bus and a half dozen other vehicles plunged through the gap.

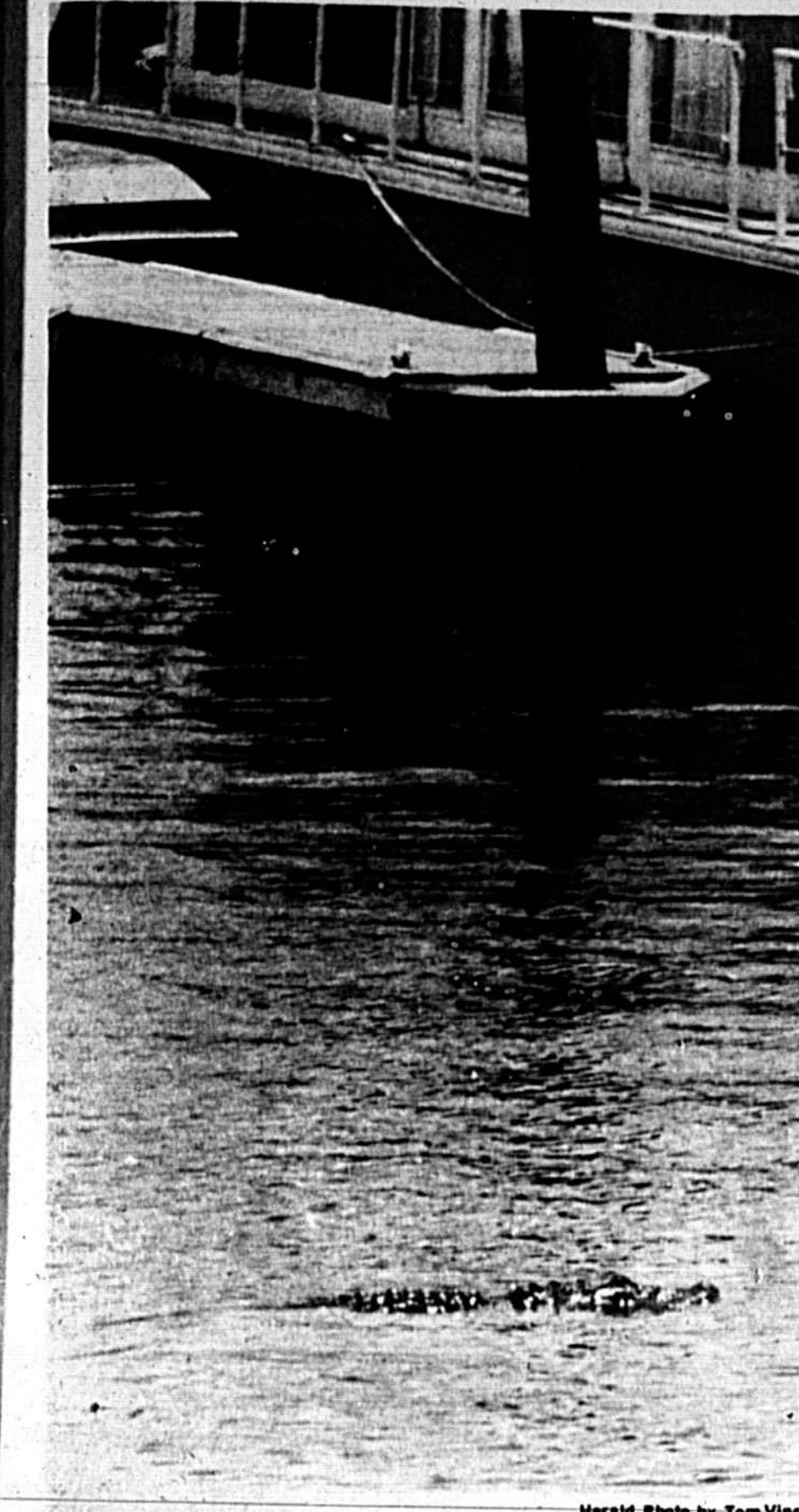
