



"What millions of dollars in machinery and foodstuff and other material gifts had failed to accomplish, the Peace Corps workers achieved in less than two years—an understanding with Asian peoples that promises to pass all tests."

The corps volunteers labor in nations which stretch in an arc from arid Afghanistan across the Indian subscutiment to Southeast Asia and the Philippines. Mostly they are teachers, but many assist in health, agriculture and accounting deviation. ericulture and community develop-

ment programs.

Here and there teachers in the corps are placed at important colleges and universities. Generally, however, they are found in secondary and elementary schools in rural

The Philippines leads all Asian lands, with 474 Peace Corps workers, nearly all of them teachers. It seems fitting, therefore, that the award

to Shriver in the corps' behalf was created in honor of the late Philip-pine President Magasysay, known throughout Asia and the world for his integrity, humanity and devotion to freedom. Other Asian nations with large

contingents are Thailand, with 225; Malays, 169; India and Pakistan, about 115 each; North Borneo and Sarawak with just under 100 alto-

gether.

The corps' development work in the Asian countries includes a wide range of projects, not least flood control and irrigation work and the plotting of roads which will open up vast reaches of trackless jungle on the island of Borneo.
