Cabinet To Examine

Japanese Politics

Looking at Japan through Western spectacles often produces images that are a distortion of reality.

The current political troubles of Prime Minister Kakuei Tanaka, for example, could hardly be more real. But at the same time, they do not reflect any great imminent danger to the political power of the ruling Liberal Democratic

It is true that in the December, 1972, elections, the LDP won fewer seats (271) than it has held in the Japanese Diet (parliament) since coming to power in the first elections after World War II. But when the dozen independents who always vote with the LDP are added, the party's bulge over the combined opposition's 204 seats remains quite secure.

Only the Congress Party of India, among democratic nations, has been in power longer than the LDP in Japan

Party leaders find it somewhat distressing that the LDP's power has been consistently if slowly eroded in recent elections. This is especially so since the LDP presided over Japan's remarkable economic boom and the leaders seem puzzled at the electorate's mounting disenchantment with the Establish-

There are no predictions heard here, however, that the LDP's reign is about to end. Even Socialist and Communist analysts, representing the two major opposition parties, concede that turning out the LDP will be a lot more difficult than it would appear.

One LDP method of slowing opposition gains has been for the ruling party to seize issues championed by the opposition and use them as its own. The reversion of Okinawa and the recognition of Communist China are two recent examples.

Around the Kasumigaseki section (Tokyo's Capitol Hill), a favorite story is that each successive Japanese prime minister has one task to do to keep his party in power and then he should

Monetary Reforms Lie Ahead?

PARIS - The same economic forces which have depressed stock market prices in the United States are responsible for the questions being raised about the future of the dollar. This is obvious from the frequent gyrations in

exchange rates and gold prices. Inflation rates in the United States were about 3 per cent in 1972 and it was widely assumed that a comparable performance was possible this year. Corporate earnings were up 26 per cent in the first quarter as compared to the first three A great many market analysts were bullish about equity

prices and their projections were based on the prospect of record business activity and a continued recovery in cor-Then the roof fell in. It was not only the Watergate affair

that created an element of political instability: inflation raised its head again with a vengeance and scandals were rampant in many corporate suites. The Investor's Overseas Services (IOS) debacle has cost European investors hundreds of millions of dollars; the

Equity Funding catastrophe in Los Angeles has revealed widespread fraud in a corporation that had the confidence of major banks and investment analysts; similar even if less serious problems have been revealed in the affairs of a great

These developments occurred at a time when the country had its quota of other problems. President Nixon was confronted with an enormous undertaking in his effort to bring federal expenditures under some control. Monetary authorities were struggling with the problem of how to slow inflationary forces without bringing on a recession and higher unemployment.

In addition, there is the so-called "energy crisis," the environmental problem and other situations which require the time, energy and resources of both government and industry. It was in this economic and political climate that the dollar became suspect in foreign exchange markets and speculation fed upon itself to create one crisis after another. European central bankers have blamed the United

States for "exporting inflation" by not restraining the flow of dollars into the continent. Their highly favorable balance-ofpayments position reflects a large surplus in trade accounts, a high level of U.S. investment in Europe and a steady flow of dollars to support American military operations in Germany

This excessive flow of dollars into European central and commercial banks occurred under a system of fixed ex-

When the dollar became "overvalued" in terms of the other major currencies of Europe, the central banks supported existing exchange rates by purchasing billions of dollars at fixed rates.

U.S. Treasury officials and monetary authorities in the Federal Reserve System point out that the flow of dollars abroad could have been retarded by a revaluation of



Cemeteries are for the living, too. There is so little green space left between Boston and New York City, that many people are turning to cemeteries in the region for recreational activities. A survey by the U.S. Forest Service found the cemeteries were being used for 29 purposes other than interment. They included historical tours, picnicking, open air classrooms, bird-watching, ballplaying and dog walking. It was Tacitus who observed, "It is

ing. Real gains in gross national product are becoming alarmingly sluggish. Consumer demands of the managerial class are not being met. -The Kremlin's leaders seem increasingly doubtful of

their ability to curb the incredible waste of labor which dampens industrial efficiency and critically hampers essential expansion. The U.S.S.R. got by for years using labor migrating from the farms, which partially made up for the efficient use of manpower in the factories. adjust production of high-technology industrial equipment and even low-technology consumer goods to the shifting demand, a failing which causes losses of hundreds of millions of rubles (perhaps billions) a year in unneeded and

-Except for some materials. Soviet exports are frequently high in price, inferior in quality and unsuited to foreign bet consumer needs. Thus Moscow does not earn the foreign exchange to buy the equipment and know-how Russia must

-The agricultural outlook remains touch-and-go. Moscow likely will need to import 15 million to 18 million tons of grain this year despite an improved erop outlook. Though the weather was better, the Russians planted only about 80 per cent as much winter wheat as normal because of adverse ground conditions. There may be problems with fats and oils. Incredibly also, there may be a shortage of sugar. As noted above, these Russian needs should put Mr. Nixon in a strong bargaining position. But the United States was in an equally-powerful position last year when the unfavorable grain deals were made, and also, back when the controversial strategic arms limitations agreements were signed.



EDITORIAL Handicapped child getting his rights

Special education opportunities for America's estimated seven million handicapped children are increasing over the nation at an encouraging tempo.

This is the report of Dr. Edwin W. Martin, head of the

of Education. He cites two significant advances. First is the "comprehensive, dynamic program" authorized for the bureau by Congress. Now in its fifth year, the bureau is administering a record-breaking program of services to provide and stimulate special education for the handicapped, including grants to states, grants for teacher recruitment and training, for teaching materials, for research and innovation and for regional resource centers. Congress' lively concern for education for the handicapped is evidenced by the fact that it has increased BEH's budge

In another landmark decision in Pennsylvania in 1971, the U.S. Eastern District Court in Philadelphia ordered that all mentally retarded children in the state be accorded access to a free public program of education appropriate to their Also in 1971, Federal District Court in Washington ruled

that the District of Columbia Board of Education could not plead lack of funds for failing to provide a public education to handicapped and emotionally disturbed children. Legislatures and courts in more and more states are asserting that tax-supported special education for handicapped children is not merely desirable but is a civil, constitutional

"These court decisions and legislative enactments constitute the biggest breakthrough in the long history of the uphill fight for the rights of America's handicapped children," Dr.

Today, 35 states have some form of mandatory law providing special education for the handic ped. Yet there remain great differences in the quantity and quality of educational A child born in one state may have four times as much chance of receiving special education as a child in another

state. Some states have fewer than 20 per cent of their handicapped children in special classes. Three years ago the Bureau of Education for Handicapped Children compiled the most comprehensive list of sources for education for the handicapped ever developed and invited parents and others to write in for a list of all schools and institutions in their area having such programs. 



POLLY'S POINTERS Zipper Too Long? Try These Methods By POLLY CRAMER

DEAR POLLY - If you cannot find a zipper to buy that is as short as needed, buy the shortest one possible, measure the desired length and then leave a bit more at the bottom. With a kitchen knife or other sharp pointed tool pry up the little prongs on the bottom of the zipper. Put the prongs back at the marked desired length, center on the zipper, oush the prongs through its material and clamp them back down and then squeeze closed with the pliers. Be careful not to bend the prongs or bend them the wrong way. Use the pliers to pull out the teeth remaining below the new stop. Sew across this tab several times so the material will not ravel. Of course you can just cut the zipper off and stitch across the bottom to form a stitched "stop" (do this before cutting off the excess) but I prefer the first way as it looks like one just bought. - FRAN

DEAR POLLY - I am answering Mrs. V. P. N. who needs a shorter zipper than she can find to buy. This tip also is good to use when you have zippers on hand (saved from discarded garments) and wish to use them in shorter openings than they were made for. Stitch your zipper in the opening no matter how much longer the zipper is but stitch across the bottom at the desired length. Go under the outside of the garment and stitch across the zipper many times, staying close to the garment, and then cut off the unneeded part. I got this from a regular pattern and know it is the proper way to do the job and have used it many times. -

Polly's Problem DEAR POLLY - I would like to cover a lampshade with stamps but do not know what kind of glue nor even what kind of shade to use. How does one preserve the finished article? I hope some reader who has made one will give me some advice. - LILLIAN

DEAR POLLY - One of my Pet Peeves concerns polo and T-shirts with seams so irregular they will not hang straight on the line and then will not fold smoothly. Both side and sleeve seams are often terribly crooked and even on supposedly good quality garments. Surely there is a way they could be cut straight so the shirts could be neatly folded. They look great when bought but it only takes one washing to show up the poor work. - MILDRED

DEAR POLLY - Never throw away outdated dress patterns but save them to use as "fillers" when packing a carton to mail. They are lightweight and when crumpled up make good "stuffing" that will help save weight in these days when we are all so conscious of the high postage rates.







Sanford Council Actions

Sanford city commissioners in a Monday work session agreed to terms of a \$15,850 contract with Campbell, Foxworth and Pugh Inc. of Orlando for a traffic and parking

City Manager Warren Knowles said commissioners will sign the contract Monday and the consulting firm will have four months to complete the study that will identify potential problems and recommend immediate and long range action

The contract calls for the consulting firm to prepare a generalized parking strategy for the downtown central business district and develop a traffic circulation plan. Included in the study will be estimates of approximate size and-cost of improvements needed at the city parking lot serving the courthouse. Knowles said this part of the study could be used as the basis for further study to determine feasibility, cost and financing of a multi-level parking structure proposed for the site by city commissioner Julian

Other traffic problem areas to be studied by the consultants include West 13th Street in the Goldsboro business district and major intersections such as U.S. 17-92 and Airport Boulevard and U.S. 17-92 and Lake Mary Boulevard. PARKING REQUIREMENTS

Mayor Lee Moore said he is concerned that present city requirements that seven off-street parking spaces be furnished for each 1,000 square feet of office space "are

Moore said this means for every 1,000 square feet of office space a developer must furnish 1,400 square feet of offstreet parking. "This precludes use of much of downtown property that is available for office space."

He revealed that "several parties" have tried to "put together something" for the almost block size properties between Palmetto and Sanford Avenues and Commercial and First Streets but the off street parking requirements

Knowles said he is gathering information from other cities for the commission concerning off-street parking requirements and will report to commissioners as soon as

JAIL CONTRACT TO BE SIGNED

City Atty. Vernon Mize received commission approval on a proposed contract with Seminole County to house city prisoners in county jail for \$4 per prisoner per day. Mize said he expected county commissioners to sign the contract today and city commissioners indicated they'll sign

the agreement at next Monday's regular session. Mize said the contract calls for two year's notice b either the city or county if the prisoner housing arrangement is to be terminated. The contract also allows either party to call for recomputation of actual prisoner housing costs each six months and adjustment of the daily rate charged up or down within 30 days.

ANNEX AREA LIMIT PROPOSED


