LINDY'S UNCLE INSTALLED AS DETROIT HEAD

John C. Lodge Assumes Duties After Basing Campaign On Ideal That Shatters Belief Of Political Prognosticators

New Mayor Proud That The Office Sought Him

Nation Will Watch With Interest Career Of Man Who Did Not Notify To Be Elected

DETROIT, Mich., January 10.—John C. Lodge, grand uncle of Col. Charles Lindbergh today became mayor of Detroit, being inaugurated as 'successor' to John W. Smith who sought unsuccessfully to be elected on the 'wet' platform.

work that Lodge might not be nominated.

In the primary, Lodge had 70,000 votes, a clear majority over the field; Smith had 39,000, the third man, 15,000.

Smith made his famous 'dripping wet' statement designed to catch thousands of votes in wet Detroit. He called the dry law a 'joke' in Detroit, as in any other city the mayor's oath pledges him to enforce all laws, and no official can amend the constitution or the Volstead act.

Every blind pig became a Smith headquarters, and while Smith announced he was closing his headquarters, (in a bested attempt to let his candidacy rest with the people) another, more by business men, was opened to be operated by the same supporters.

Underworld Registrars From underworld districts registrars swamped the city hall, and an investigation of registrars was started. Indignation reigned among many people and lodge voters also flocked to register.

The morning before election a group of his friends begged Mr. Lodge 'at least to tell the people you have no religious prejudices. If you don't believe it, tell them.'

'All right then,' Mayor Lodge replied. 'The people know me. If they believe these lies, I'll be licked. I'll be ready and willing to retire from the public service.'

'I started out in this campaign with the ideal that a city should select its own officers without bank or ballotbox. That I believe to be a fundamental of the real principles of American government as its founders meant it to function.'

'This election means more than whether I am elected mayor. It is a test whether a man drafted into a race for office by a large and representative group of citizens can be elected in spite of the efforts of professional politicians if Detroit can do it once, it can do it again. If Detroit can do it, any city can. It's the tests of a principle.'

'I want to establish that principle alone and for all. I want to show that American municipal government can function properly. I want to prove that the tricks of the professionals' aren't supreme.'

Free From Promises 'When I take office, if I'm elected, I shall enter the mayor's chair absolutely free from promises. There will be no debts to pay or 'boys' to take care of. If I'm elected I'll be free to run the business of the city as I think it should be run. If the people don't think I run it right, I'll be responsible, and they'll be free to replace me.'

'I believe the good—and I don't mean the goodly—people of this country are vastly in the majority. I believe that in every city, big or small, the better class, and by that I mean all who are honest and have the good of their city at heart can be the ruling

SABBATH STILL THE SEVENTH DAY

I gave them my Sabbath to be a sign between Me and them, that they might know that I am the Lord who sanctified them. (Ex. 31:13) Besides being a sign that Christ created us it is also a sign that He redeemed us.

Christ was the One in the pillar of cloud by day, and the pillar of fire by night who led the Israelites from Egypt to Canaan. (1 Cor. 10:1-4) It was Christ who caused the man to fall on six days and not on the seventh day for a period of forty years. Ex. 16. Thus He taught the people that He was particular which day they kept.

Another prophet tells us that the same One who led them by a cloud and pillar of fire was the One who came down on Mt. Sinai and gave the Law. (Deut. 5:4-5) At Sinai when God gave the Sabbath commandment, He pointed back to the beginning and gave that as His reason for asking all people to keep the Sabbath. 'In six days, the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day; wherefore (for this reason) the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and hallowed it.' Ex. 20:11. Like your birthday, there is no other day that will meet the specifications. Take away this command and we have no reason for keeping any day.

The talk of 'any day in seven' or 'a seventh part of time' is but another attempt of the enemy of righteousness to annual the gospel of Christ. When I am in a chemical laboratory and ask my assistant to hand me the last bottle in a row of seven I consider it a failure in carrying out directions for him to carelessly pick up bottle number one and hand it to me, and then contend that bottle number one is one of the seven and should be just as satisfactory. I cannot think that he is sincere in arguing that he was obedient and that I should be satisfied since he handed me out of the seven. Those who are seeking

'In any city where gang politics rules, the people have been buffeted by the politician. That's all it amounts to. I have always believed that sometime the situation would be ripe for some city to place in high executive office a man not indebted to any 'gang' in any way. Shearer Inventor Of Level Ray Reflector

R. C. Shearer, 113 Elm Avenue, is responsible for a new invention which gives promise of being a boon to motorists. Mr. Shearer's invention consists of a reflector which casts rays from an automobile light on a level line. The Shearer reflector is said to differ from the ordinary reflector in that its surface is flat instead of curved. With the reflector being made of three flat surfaces, in rear and above and below the light, the arrangement causes the rays to converge in a direct line to throw a light which the inventor says does not strike the eyes of approaching motorists. By use of the invention, Shearer claims blinding lights will be eliminated and dimming is made unnecessary. Demonstrations are now being given by the inventor. Mr. and Mrs. J.
